Honeybourne Parish Council News

Parish Precept

At the December Parish Council meeting the council agreed the budget expenditure for the 2018-19 financial year. The budget is the general expenses of the council's regular business and any project expenses are finally agreed when setting the parish precept with knowledge of the council tax base number, which calculates the actual tax per house. Projects under consideration are the new Community Centre support funding and the refurbishment of the village telephone kiosk and updating streetlights. Anyone wishing to make comments or question the council is welcome to attend the January 9th meeting and address the council in open forum.

Telephone Kiosk

The Parish Council are seeking volunteers to tidy up the High Street telephone kiosk. Having received a quotation of £3,000 for a full refurbishment the council considered this expense is counterintuitive, as the Community Centre must take preference on project funding. The kiosk needs a good clean both inside and out and perhaps fitting some simple shelves for a book exchange and information centre. Anyone interested in helping with the work or help fund paid cleaners would be most appreciated, please contact the Clerk for further information.

Green Waste Bin

A parishioner's request to have a green waste wheelie bin (brown bin) placed at the cemetery was fully investigated by the Parish Council and unfortunately the logistical problems outweighed the advantages and the suggestion was not approved by the council.

Traffic Speed, Pelican Crossing and Roundabout

Following on from the responses on traffic calming and speeding from our MP Nigel Huddleston and Ward Member ClIr Alastair Adams, Councillors wish to request the County Council to install a pelican crossing on Station Road between Dudley Road and the Gate Inn cross roads to improve road safety for parishioners crossing the busy section of Station Road. A further request will be made to install a mini roundabout at the Gate Inn cross roads to slow down traffic entering the village from the south. The request will be made through ClIr Alastair Adams whose support is needed to enable the schemes to be considered by the County Council officers. 

Letter from the Vicar

New Year, new beginnings

I approach the New Year with a mixture of excitement, anticipation and with a bit of nervousness! I look forward it. I love looking at my new diary, not yet full with commitments, and wondering what events will fill its pages. Some will be happy, things to really look forward to, and some, of course, will be sad.

When I feel that twinge of nervousness, which many of you may relate to, I turn to these words, written many thousands of years ago by the Old Testament Prophet Jeremiah,

"For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope. Then when you call upon me and come and pray to me, I will hear you. When you search for me, you will find me; if you seek me with all your heart..." Jeremiah 29: 11-13 (NRSV)

and those words fill me with hope. God is Sovereign and whatever the year ahead has in store for us, we can be absolutely confident that God will be with us. This is good news for us as individuals and for our villages and communities. Over the last six months that I've been with you as your Vicar, I have a growing sense that God has good and positive plans for our churches and communities. There is something for us to do, though, and Jeremiah sets it out clearly. We are to be a people who pray and who seek God and His will. And what happens when we do those things? In Jeremiah's words, God will hear us and we will find Him if we seek Him with all our hearts.

In his Christmas Broadcast to the Empire in 1939, a year overshadowed with troubles of the worst kind, King George VI quoted these words from a poem by Minnie Louise Haskins,

'And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown." And he replied: "Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God. That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way." So I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night.'

What wonderful words. Even when we walk into the darkness of uncertainty, we do not walk alone. God is with us – that Good News is at the heart of the message of Christmas, the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ, so recently celebrated and so fresh in our minds.

So, I encourage you in the year that lies ahead to 'put your hand in the Hand of God' and, if I can help and support you in anyway, regardless of whether or not you come to church, please let me know.

A One-mile Circular Walk within the village

This route is clearly signed. Sturdy shoes or boots are recommended.

Start at The Gate Inn car park and walk to your left passing the gates and footpath sign on your left. Look across the road to locate the footpath sign on the opposite side of the road. TAKE GREAT CARE to cross the road, and then follow the footpath down a narrow alleyway. This leads you onto High Street. Turn left and walk to the telephone box. Cross the road and follow the signed track to the right of the old garage. After 60 metres turn right and follow this hedgerow to the far left-hand corner of the field. Over the footbridge and follow the footpath with the new houses and playground on your left until you reach the steel pedestrian gate on the right-hand side next to the first house.

Through the gate and turn left to the crossing point (tactile dimpled paving). TAKE GREAT CARE to cross this road. Straight on up the "Footpath" alleyway until you pass between houses and reach the next road. Turn right and walk up the cul-de-sac, bearing left to the pathway between the bungalows in the far left-hand corner. Follow this alleyway until you emerge onto Stratford Road.

Turn left and then TAKING GREAT CARE cross the road at the Church noticeboard, following the sign to the Church (do not pass between the white pots). As you pass through the Church kissing-gate, immediately turn right and follow the path to the gap into the field. Continue to the gated bridge; then straight on to the next gate. Turn right and you are back at the start of this walk.

We hope you have enjoyed your walk today, and that we have whetted your appetite for a variety of future walks during 2018* using the Public Rights of Way (PROWs) in the Parish of Honeybourne.

News from your District Councillor & County Councillor Alastair Adams January 2018

WISHING YOU A VERY HAPPY NEW YEAR

I hope you all had a great Christmas, and are looking forward to 2018. Let's all wish that the New Year will bring peace, happiness and good fortune to all mankind. Here is the news from the District Council, and the County Council

Congratulations to the Village Hall Committee - The Honeybourne village hall committee has been successful in obtaining over £400,000 towards the new Community Centre. This is fantastic news, and although more monies are needed, it has jet propelled this project to becoming a reality sooner rather than later. Full planning application will be submitted to Wychavon District Council at the beginning of 2018, and hopefully everything will be approved shortly afterwards. The new building will be built on the Taylor Wimpy site - just off Weston Road. As part of the original planning for the Grange Farm/Fair Acres site, I managed to negotiate with Taylor Wimpy to supply the land free of charge for the new community centre, which was then written into the development agreement. So obtaining the Big Lottery funding is great news for the village, and I personally thank the team that put in the bid for all their hard work – I know it was a lot of effort but has proved well worthwhile, and this is a great start to 2018 for the Honeybourne.

Superfast Broadband to Ullington & Buckle Street - There was a collapsed BT duct that had to be repaired in Front Street, Pebworth, and emergency work occurred to replace this duct the week before Christmas. Ullington residents will be able to sign up for Superfast Broadband and get their houses connected to fibre at the beginning of 2018.

More Parking at Honeybourne Station - I have been informed that good progress is being made by Wychavon District Council to build more parking spaces. So watch this space.

Planning

1. Planning Application 17/02263/FUL Land At Perrie Drive, Honeybourne for nine new dwellings – consultation on this application closes on 3rd January 2018, so if you want to object to it, please make sure you write your comments on the planning portal https://plan.wychavon.gov.uk/ and type in the reference 17/02263. Even if you miss the deadline date, you can still write in as they usually accept late comments. I strongly oppose this application as it will remove the green open space that has been used by residents for many years. I am pleased to see so many residents have already written into oppose this application, but the more the better, so please help stop this unwanted and unneeded development, and help protect our open spaces by opposing this application.

2. Planning Application 17/02147/OU Land off High Street Honeybourne – to remove compliance with conditions 19 and 21 – this site already has planning approval but the developers are trying to remove conditions 19 & 21 which I opposed at the planning committee on 14th December. What looks relatively innocuous request is in fact a typical example how developers chip away at conditions to make sites more profitable or to improve their cash flow often at the detriment of the residents. There was very good reason why condition 21 was imposed initially. As everyone knows this part of the High Street floods, and the raised pavement is the only route to connect the two sides of the village. So if the developers get approval to remove condition 19& 21, then in theory they can demolish part of the raised pavement, and not construct the new entrance and flood alleviation scheme until the first house is sold. In the meantime, if there was flooding, this would cut off the two sides of the village to pedestrians. Luckily the planning committee members recognised this, and have delayed making any decision until more information is made available on how the developer is going to gain access to the site during construction. A site visit has been arranged next month so the committee members can see the problem themselves, and then make a decision.

Highways

1. Mickleton Rd, Honeybourne– New weight limit to stop HGV's using this rural road as a rat run. The legal process has been started by Gloucestershire County Council so hopefully the weight limit will be imposed by the middle of 2018.

2. Road over Honeybourne Station Bridge - Repairs have been carried out by Highways to the subsidence of the road. A proposal is going forward looking to extend the existing traffic lights to increase the length of carriageway narrowed to one lane by approx. 20m. This will bring the heavy lorries away from the edge of the embankment which is causing the slippage.

3. Winter Gritting – Last month we saw the gritting lorries out clearing the roads during the snow. Just a reminder to drive carefully and beware of ice.

As always, if you have any issues on any Highways matters, please report it on the WCC website http://www.worcestershire.gov.uk/homepage/98/report_it Also remember a photo of the Highways problem is as good as "a thousand words" so always take a photo where possible.




