



RIGOROUS. REAL-WORLD ASSESSMENTS

Mount St. Mary Academy's academic programs have been designed to effectively achieve the expectations of higher education and our students' future employers.

- New York State Regents exams have been eliminated as our final assessment tool, replaced by robust, creative assessments. Mount St. Mary Academy follows New York State Common Core Curriculum in all coursework, but with a new emphasis on enhancing the depth and breadth of study through interdisciplinary efforts and comprehensive assessments.
- Our students demonstrate mastery by producing capstone projects, written reports, group presentations, research papers, and other assessments that synthesize learning.
- Student learning is also measured through traditional paper and pen exams, created by our faculty who seek to create meaningful and accurate assessment. National standardized tests, i.e. PSAT, SAT, ACT, and AP exams, will continue to serve as academic benchmarks.

Our Academic Vision

Through our academic and co-curricular programs, students explore their unique identities and values, enhance their moral decision making skills and begin to establish themselves as responsible members of the global community. Our new academic vision encourages curiosity, innovation and collaboration. We pride ourselves on the fact that our students graduate having developed critical and abstract thinking skills and have grown in confidence and as leaders. Typically each year, 100% of our graduates go immediately on to college. Our students are ready for this next step. Our accelerated and Honors programs challenge our students to their personal best and give them the tools they need to be successful. Advanced coursework in English, Mathematics, Science, Foreign Language and the Fine Arts is available to incoming freshmen who meet academic requirements.

The Class of 2019 collectively earned nearly \$23 million in scholarships to colleges and universities across the U.S.— an average of over \$269,000 per student.

ACADEMIC CENTERS

Learning at Mount St. Mary is active and interdisciplinary. Students enjoy three academic centers — STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Math), Humanities (Social Studies, Wellness and Religion) and Languages (English and World Languages). In these centers, students interact with faculty and each other in a way to foster robust, cross-curricular collaboration.

Our Makerspace provides opportunities for interactive learning that blends technology and creativity.

Students who need academic support thrive in our Academic Learning Center, which offers peer and adult tutoring in all subject areas, support for students with testing and instructional accommodations, and a quiet, structured place to do schoolwork.

FOR HONORS STUDENTS

Academically gifted students have many opportunities at Mount St. Mary through the award-winning Academy Scholars program. Advanced Placement, dual-enrollment and/or honors-level coursework is available in all subject areas.

In addition, Academy Scholars participate in a hands-on entrepreneurship curriculum through which they create and run their own small businesses, allowing them to learn and engage in creativity in an exciting way. Mount St. Mary is affiliated with two international entrepreneurship programs: Virtual Enterprises

International and Students for the Advancement of Global Entrepreneurship. Our entrepreneurs have competed successfully both nationally and on the world stage, winning awards at both levels.

LEARNING OUTSIDE THE CLASSROOM


Students at Mount St. Mary have the world at their fingertips—quite literally. Our students are well-traveled and have learned much from their global experiences.

DRESS CODE

Mount St. Mary students wear a uniform which ensures an appropriate study atmosphere while permitting individual choice and self-expression.

Options include:

APPLYING FOR ADMISSION

Students who wish to join the Mount St. Mary Academy freshman class should complete an application for admission, available at MSMacademy.org/admissions/ and take the Catholic High School Entrance Examination, typically held in November. Acceptance packets, including scholarship and financial aid awards, are issued in mid-January. Rolling admission is offered if class size permits.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Mount St. Mary offers more than two dozen scholarships and grants to incoming freshmen. Scholarship awards are based on one or a combination of the following factors: overall scholastic achievement, results of the placement examination, community service, leadership, and financial need. Scholarship applications are given to students when they take the entrance examination.

FINANCIAL AID AND DISCOUNTS

Financial aid grants are awarded based on financial need and are available for incoming and returning students each year.

MSM offers discounts to families with a parent who is a full-time Catholic school or parish employee, as well as those who have more than one daughter attending our school. We also offer a one-time grant to students whose mother or grandmother is a Mount St. Mary alumna.

WORK-STUDY PROGRAM

Students who demonstrate financial need may be eligible for our work/study program, which matches them with an in-school job during the summer or school year. Payment is based on the number of hours worked and is credited directly to the tuition account.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Students who wish to transfer to Mount St. Mary will be considered for admission upon receipt of their transcripts, most current grades, letter of recommendation, and in interview with MSM administrative personnel.

What does wellness look like at Mount St. Mary?

We believe that in order to be successful a young women needs to have opportunities to reflect on her experiences and to develop life skills to ensure her well-being. Our daily Wellness block provides time for advisory with faculty, small club meetings, homework time, goal-setting, mindfulness practices, and simply a chance to build community.
