"How do we rob God?"

'Rob' – the original word means to exploit, plunder and oppress.

"How do we rob God?"

'Everything in heaven and earth is yours. (1 Chron 28:11) Wealth and honour come from you. (1 Chron 28:12) Everything comes from you, and we have given you only what comes from your hand. (1 Chron 29:14)'

1. Anything you have is a gift from God.

- God does not give up ownership when he's given it to you

The tithe

In the Old Testament God required all his people to give away 10% of their income to charity and ministry.

Is the tithe (giving away 10%) necessary for Christians today?

Therefore its right to tithe – but not as a legalistic limit to our giving but as a baseline and guideline.

- 2. Give according to your ability (2 Cor 8:3)
- 3. When rethink your giving, don't primarily use your calculator, think about the cross.

"See that you also excel in this grace of giving. I am not commanding you, but I want to test the sincerity of your love by comparing it with the earnestness of others. For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you through his poverty might become rich." (2 Cor 8: 7-9)
