

- proving a safe "nest" from the "wilderness"




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The potential of reflecting the values of international travellers in built environment

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
The potential of enhancing the city landscape for the residents

- reuse of nutrients








The versatile presence of wood

- yet the potential in urban space is not used







The site between the lake landscape and the city cenre.




The existing urban situation in Hietaniemi, Kemijärvi.




The sequence of public parks and buildings as a functional urban matrix.

The new urban composition for music, culture, art and tourism.




A new landmark for sustainable urban development surrounded by all year round touristic nature activities.
