FOOD POISONING

No one wants to even think about contaminated food at a backyard picnic. Unfortunately, food poisoning often hits children hardest because they tend to be susceptible to dehydration a little quicker than adults. A variety of bacteria can cause food poisoning, from Staph species to E.coli, to Salmonella and Shigella. Symptoms are similar to a typical "stomach virus" — fever, vomiting, diarrhea and abdominal pain.

NHS IMMUNISATION SCHEDULE FOR UNDER 2's

Q waaks

6-in-1 vaccine, given as a single jab containing vaccines to protect against six separate diseases: diphtheria; tetanus; whooping cough (pertussis); polio; Haemophilus influenzae type b, known as Hib, a bacterial infection that can cause severe pneumonia or meningitis in young children; and hepatitis B

Pneumococcal (PCV) vaccine

Rotavirus vaccine

MenB vaccine

12 weeks

6-in-1 vaccine, second dose Rotavirus vaccine, second dose

16 weeks

6-in-1 vaccine, third dose Pneumococcal (PCV) vaccine, second dose MenB vaccine second dose

1 year

Hib/MenC vaccine, given as a single jab containing vaccines against meningitis C (first dose) and Hib (fourth dose)
Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine, given as a single jab

2 to 8 years (including children in reception class and school years 1 to 4)

3 years and 4 months

Please note sometimes to meet our ratio requirements, you might find that some of our support staff are deployed in rooms other than they are generally been appointed for. This happens under circumstances such as covering sickness or holidays.

The nursery always is legally required to be in ratio and we would prefer staff known to children covering the ratio, rather than having to always depend on external agencies. Our support staff and our lunch covers play a vital role in achieving this degree of continuity of care for our children.

Room Ratio's:

Under 2's – For every 3 babies, there is one member of staff team (1:3)

2's to Under 3's - For every 4 toddlers, there is one member of staff team (1:4)

Over 3's – For every 8 Pre-schoolers, there is one member of staff team (1:8)

How are parents benefitted from last week's challenge?

It is reassuring that importance is placed on staffing ratios and that there shouldn't be periods of time when staff are on their own with a child/children. It is also good that the nursery has CCTV that is monitored, and senior members of staff help in the rooms to ensure that the ratios are maintained, and staff aren't put in difficult situations by being left on their own

This policy underlines how seriously staff at Monkey Puzzle take Lone Working and the protection of their staff and children. It ensures that there is ALWAYS the correct number of staff looking after the children, that they are always aware of when another staff member is leaving a room or on their own, and takes measures to ensure accountability for staff if they have to be left alone with a child for whatever reason.

Answers to last week questions:

- 1. Who does the lone working policy protect? Staff and the children.

 They must stay in full view of the CCTV camera at all times.

Attachment 1

FIRE SAFETY POLICY

Heather Endsor is Fire Marshal and has overall responsibility for the fire drill and evacuation procedures. These are carried out and recorded for each group of children at least every 4 weeks and a maximum of 8 weeks or as and when a large change occurs, e.g. a large intake of children, a new member of staff joins the nursery, or any changes made to the premises. These drills will occur at different times of the day and on different days to ensure evacuations are possible under different circumstances and that all children and staff participated.

Registration

An accurate record of all staff and children present in the building must be kept at all times and children/staff must be marked in and out on arrival and departure. An accurate record of visitors must be kept in the visitor's book. These records must be taken out along with the register and emergency contacts list in the event of a fire.

No smoking policy

The nursery operates a strict no smoking policy – please see this separate policy for details.

Fire drill procedure

On discovering a fire:

- Calmly raise the alarm by blowing the whistle
- Immediately evacuate the building under guidance from the Fire Marshal
- Using the nearest accessible exit lead the children out, and assemble at *rear end of the playground*.

- Close all doors behind you wherever possible
- Babies upstairs will be evacuated in a chain form. Management and office members to step in to assist babies are evacuated to safety.
- For those facing mobility needs will be evacuated with assistance of an additional member of staff
- **Do not** stop to collect personal belongings on evacuating the building
- Do not attempt to go back in and fight the fire
- **Do not** attempt to go back in if any children or adults are not accounted for

If you are unable to evacuate safely:

- Stay where you are safe
- Keep the children calm and together
- Wherever possible alert the manager of your location and the identity of the children and other adults with you

The Fire Marshal is to:

- Pick up the children's register, staff register, mobile phone, keys, visitors' book and emergency bag (containing emergency contacts list, nappies, wipes and blankets)
- Telephone emergency services: dial 999 and ask for the fire service
- In the fire assembly point area *Rear of the playground* check the children against the register
- Account for all adults staff and visitors
- Advise the fire service of anyone missing and possible locations and respond to any other questions they may have

Remember

- Do not stop to collect personal belongings on evacuating the building
- **Do not** attempt to go back in and fight the fire
- Do not attempt to go back in if any children or adults are not accounted for
