Agriculture

Sewborwens – The farm covers 216 hectares of which approximately 190 are currently used for crops and grassland, the remaining being woods, game cover or environmental schemes. The farm also includes a £2 million high welfare dairy unit for 250 Holstein dairy cows featuring the latest technology, a roundhouse beef fattening unit, suckler herd of 30 Aberdeen Angus cows, and a lowland flock of 300 ewes producing high quality lamb from spring grass. Crops include wheat, spring barley and coppice willow. Low Beckside – This Cumbrian hill farm is based at nearby Mungrisdale. The farm covers 168 hectares and is run exclusively as a sheep farm (Swaledale Fell flock and Draft flock). The farm is 220m to 320m above sea level and has grazing rights to Mungrisdale Common (500 ewes plus followers) and Bowscale Common (40 ewes plus followers).

New Sheep Husbandry Training Unit -

Advanced plans are underway to construct a new facility to demonstrate best practice with high standards of animal welfare and hygiene; providing the future workforce with key skills in hill farming.

Animal Management

The College has an excellent range of over 40 different species of animals housed in several specialised habitat areas; these include an exotics room, small mammal room, dog grooming room, small mammal yard, kennels, catteries, indoor and outdoor aviaries. A range of exotic species are housed including meerkats, sugar gliders as well as various reptiles, amphibians, birds and small mammals. There is also a preparation kitchen and isolation room.

Engineering

Our workshops include a land-based machinery workshop and a welding workshop, both of which provide students with a range of facilities incorporating specialist tooling and diagnostic equipment. Learning resources include a range of tractors and farm machines, forklift trucks, harvesting machinery and application equipment as well as a wide selection of small and medium plant machinery.

Equine

The Equestrian Centre, based at Newton Rigg's Penrith campus, has a newly enhanced indoor arena measuring 21m x 60m, an indoor gallery seating up to 40 spectators, a 20m x 60m outdoor arena, new stable blocks housing 30 horses in total and a cross country schooling field with various jumps.

Gamekeeping

The Northern School of Game and Wildlife at Newton Rigg has access to over 2000 hectares of land providing a variety of habitats in which to develop the students' knowledge and skills.

Specialist facilities include: 1200 hectares (3000 acres) keepered grouse moor, deer management study site of 670 hectares (1655 acres), incubation and rearing field facilities, student gundog kennels (including provision for ferrets), clay pigeon shooting ground with automatic traps, lowland and upland farms and industry sponsorship from Mardens Game Feeds and Brights Seeds.

Hair and Beauty

Students are able to practice what they learn in our dedicated industry standard commercial hair and beauty salon – Eden Boutique. This salon facilitates a real working environment, giving students the chance to learn valuable customer service and reception skills, practical hairdressing skills in our fully fitted salon and beauty therapy techniques in our dedicated therapy room and nail bar.

Health, Social and Childcare


The College has high quality laboratories to support science studies with external access to local care homes and a range of equipment for developing activities in residential settings. Childcare students will be able to benefit from on-site facilities including; Muddy Boots Nursery, providing care for children aged three months to pre-school. Emergency Care Cadet students have access to a simulated ambulance and a wide range of facilities to support fitness training.

Horticulture

The College gardens include a large range of themed shrub and herbaceous borders, an organic fruit and vegetable garden, annual meadows, an arboretum, a pleached hornbeam walkway, a woodland border, ornamental lawns and a variety of informal and formal ponds. Within the College grounds there are also a range of heated and unheated growing and display glasshouses as well as polythene tunnels.

Sport

The College's facilities include a 3G Astro Turf pitch, a climbing wall with roped climbing areas, extensive land, including a large training area based in the heart of the Lake District, a gym with a range of state-of-the-art cardio and resistance machines and a wide selection of free-weights, a sports hall and outdoor sports pitches.

Main Qualification

Your timetable will include a mixture of practical work and classroom (theory) sessions. Vocational programmes are normally assessed through course assignments and practical assessment.

English and Maths Requirement

These are regarded as core, underpinning knowledge for any course and essential for any career pathway you may choose. It will be a requirement for some students to continue studying these subjects alongside their main programme.


Work Experience

Most courses include a significant amount of work-related experience, offering the opportunity to enjoy a placement normally within an industry relating to your studies.

Extra-Curricular Activity

Learners will be given the opportunity to explore other activities that are different from their main qualification which helps develop wider personal skills to help build confidence in support of further progression.

Apprenticeship Programmes



Earn While You Learn

Apprenticeships are work-based programmes. This pathway is a combination of training on-the-job as well as some formal study at College. Students will attend College either on day release or in study blocks.

To be eligible you need to be in a suitable job, or paid placement, and most of your learning will take place at your workplace. We cannot provide placements, but we may be able to help guide you in a search for a suitable placement. As a starting point try searching on www.apprenticeships.gov.uk

Entry Requirements

Level 2 Apprenticeships - No formal qualifications, but you need a suitable and relevant work placement

Apprenticeship Programme Fees

The situation with regard to how Apprenticeships are funded from 2017 onwards is currently under review. At present an apprenticeship is FREE if you're under 19, living in England and not already in full time education. However, if you are over 19 years old you are advised to contact the College to seek further details. Your age is determined by the start date of the course.

Agriculture

Agriculture Level 2

Learn about working in the agriculture industry and develop the skills you will need in employment and for further study. Learners will undertake some theory sessions that will allow better understanding on what is practised in practical sessions, farm duties and work experience. Visits will be made to our partner college farms in Yorkshire to study different farming systems.





Start your journey

Where do I start?

You can start on whatever level is right for you. Normally, we would expect you to move to the level above the qualification you have just achieved.

Do I need to pass certain subjects?

This is a general guide to help you decide which level of course you should be considering. Some courses require particular skills, whilst others may need certain grades and qualifications. We can assess your functional skills in English and maths to ensure you have a place on the right level course for you. If you are a mature student you may not always need these entry requirements and we can discuss alternatives and any relevant previous experience with you.

What happens if I don't get the grades?

Don't worry. If, after you've made your application, you do better or worse than expected in your GCSEs or other qualifications, we can often transfer your application to a more suitable course, provided we have availability.

Apply

Complete the application form in this prospectus, online at www.newtonrigg.ac.uk or the paper version which can be printed off from our website. You can apply for a course at any time during the year, but it is best to complete your application as early as possible to avoid any problems starting your course.

Interview

Once we get your application you will receive an interview date and time with the relevant course manager via text message — please call us if you need to change anything. Don't be nervous, it's an opportunity for you to tell us more about yourself and ask further questions!

Offer

Following a successful interview you will then receive a course offer detailing what qualifications and grades you need to secure a place on the course. Please confirm with us whether you accept the offer or not.

Get Organised

This is the time you need to be sorting transport, finance and booking accommodation, don't leave this too late or you could miss out!

Results

As soon as you receive your exam results you need to email (details available on the website) a scanned copy or image of your results to us (mobile phone images acceptable) so that we can hopefully confirm your place with us. If you haven't met all our entry requirements, you should still contact us as we will try and offer you a place on a suitable alternative course.

Please note: Like all colleges and universities our courses need a minimum number of students before they can run. If any course does not run due to insufficient numbers, we will do our best to help you find an alternative. Optional modules also run subject to availability and viable student numbers.

Further Education Programmes*

There are no tuition fees if you are a full time student from the UK or EU aged between 16 and 18 on 31st August of the year you start your course.

If you are aged 19+ and in receipt of benefits, please contact our Student Records Team on 01768 893651 for further advice on potential fees.

Age 19+

Advanced Learning Loans are available to learners aged 19 and above to fund Level 3/4 courses such as Diplomas and management qualifications.

Bursaries are also available for students aged 19+, visit www.newtonrigg.ac.uk for further details. The loans will cover tuition fees and start being paid back once the course is completed and you are earning more than £21,000 a year, so there is no upfront cost.

Even if you already hold a similar qualification, such as A-levels, you can still apply for your first loan, see www.sfengland.co.uk or www.gov.uk/advanced-learning-loans for further guidance.

Apprenticeship Programme Fees*

The situation with regard to how Apprenticeships are funded from 2017 onwards is currently under review. At present an apprenticeship is FREE if you're under 19, living in England and not already in full time education. However, if you are over 19 years old you are advised to contact the College to seek further details. Your age is determined by the start date of the course.

Budget for Additional Costs

Whatever course you are thinking of doing, you will need to budget for some extra costs that you may need to pay yourself. We will provide you with details of what is required for each course before you enrol, for example protective clothing, core texts, materials or stationery and any trips or visits.

Apprenticeship course opportunities in agriculture also run at our Hexham and Kendal Study Centres.


