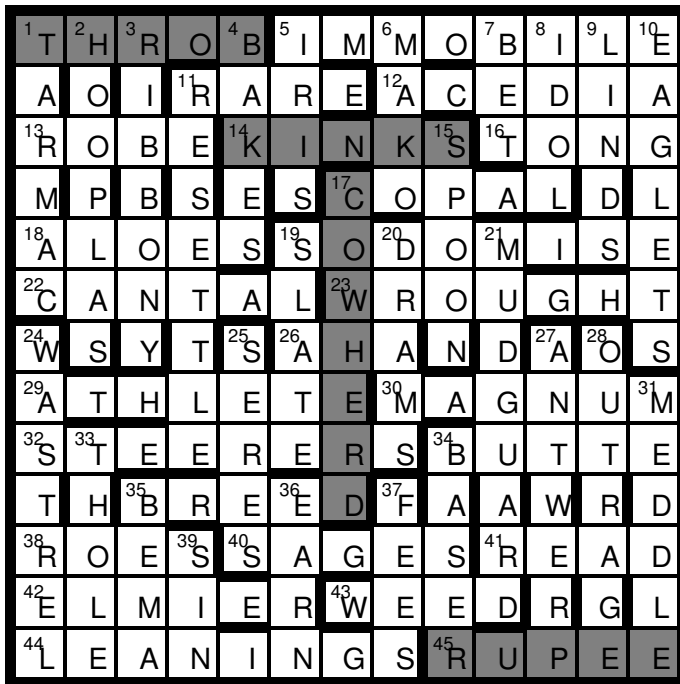


## Enough is enough by Nudd - solution



First & last letters in extra across words give AUGUSTUS & (*Heinrich*) HOFFMANN. Extra down words give O TAKE THE NASTY SOUP AWAY. Hence mixtures of SOUP were removed from nine answers before entry. The final grid still contained THROB, KINKS, COWHERD and RUPEE – potential anagrams of four other soups, BROTH, SKINK, CHOWDER and PUREE.
