

High Street Telephone Kiosk:

You asked the council to buy the Kiosk.

Now please tell us what you would like the council to use it for?

The kiosk was secured by the Parish Council as many parishioners supported its retention as part of the street scene and for public use. The Parish Council would welcome suggestions for its future use as many options are available, the popular option is a Defibrillator station but the village has two publicly available Defibrillators already. The structure of the kiosk is sound but if anyone wished to give it a spring clean they are most welcome to do so.

Criticism of the Council

Considerable criticism was received over the state of the Recreation Field and the lack of facilities when the school sports day event took place. Several condemnations of the council were posted on social media and received by email regarding the Recreation Field not being prepared for the school sports day. The criticisms were totally unjustified as the council were not informed of the date of the sports day event, the number of attendees or the expected field maintenance or the supply of toilet facilities to be put in place. It was felt that any future event arrangements will be extensively scrutinised to ensure the organisers have a full risk assessment issued to the Parish Council, adequate welfare facilities in place and public liability insurance is fully covered. Without all of these the use of the field may be denied. It was also noted that all the criticisms came from locals on social media but no complaints or comments were received directly from the school, therefore the council presume the school were happy with the Recreation Field.

Vandalism

The tennis court net at the Recreation Field has been vandalised putting it out of use until new parts can be obtained

The safety signs of the MUGA fencing have been removed from the fencing and will be replaced shortly. The local PCSO will be requested to carry out extra patrols in the evening and at dusk. The council will consider installing CCTV on the Recreation Field when the new pavilion is completed.

New Pavilion Contract Signed

The council has agreed and signed the contract for the construction of the new pavilion on the Recreation Field. The contractor intends to start work in Mid-August and complete the construction by December this year. Most of the project funding will be from the section 106 fund created from the village developments and supported from the council's revenue reserves.

Black Smoke

Reports of black smoke fires at Peace Farm, Shinehill Lane were reported to Worcestershire Regulatory Services who are taking action over the matter. Council also received reports of a large black smoke fire on the development site at 12 Stratford Road.

Mowing delays

In June complaints were received regarding the cemetery mowing. The mowing contract manager confirmed the mowing times were some 10 days overdue because of unforeseen circumstances. As a gratuity for the delay, all the cut grass in the cemetery was collected from the grave area and

removed from the cemetery.

The Parish Council meets on the 2nd Tuesday of each month. Members of the public are welcome to attend meetings, which are held in the Village Hall and commence at 7.15 pm. Residents are welcome to speak on any issue of local concern during the Open Forum before the start of the meeting.

Albert Adams and the others named on the Honeybourne War Memorial

"'We will remember them.'" says Ally Edwards of High Street, Honeybourne. "That's what I was privileged to read in December 2012 as the Exhortation during the Last Post ceremony at the Menin Gate Memorial."

"After the ceremony my son and I paid our respects at the inscriptions on the Gate of a couple of special names among the thousands. They were men from Honeybourne."

The Gate was constructed on the road to Menin as a memorial to over 50,000 British and Empire soldiers who were killed but have no known grave. It stands in leper (Ypres), also known as 'Wipers' to the soldiers who defended the small Belgian town from the Germans throughout the First World War). They were defending the small Belgian town from the Germans throughout the First World War. There were many battles around the town, the last (The Third Battle of Ypres) has another name, Passchendaele. Ally: "At Passchendaele Sergeant Albert Adams lost his life. Killed in action aged 33 on 22nd November 1917. According to the records I found in 2008, he was the Company Sergeant Major of the 1st Battalion Worcestershire Regiment, a hugely prestigious and important position. His Service No 6473." He was born in Binton, Warwickshire, and enlisted in Evesham. Albert is additionally remembered on the war memorials in the village hall and St Andrew's Church, Cleeve Prior.

Gertrude Annie Adams was his wife and she lived at 3 Council Cottages, Honeybourne, Worcestershire. "Where were the Council Cottages in 1917?" asks Ally. "And now online there is so much more information than in 2008, it would be great to find out more." Do you know anything about Albert?

Ally asks, could we find out more about ALL the men named on the Honeybourne War Memorial? Maybe you have family stories, photos, and letters? Perhaps you have already done this research before?





The August meeting is on Wednesday 2nd August, and the Vale Wildlife Hospital and Rehabilitation Centre will give a slide show and talk about the work they do at Beckford.

A 3-Mile Walk for a View of Honeybourne from the Airfield Pets should be kept on leads at all times. Sturdy shoes or boots are recommended.

Start at The Gate Inn, cross the Weston Road (TAKE GREAT CARE) and walk up High Street to the Thatched Tavern. Turn left alongside the Thatched Tavern into China Corner and walk straight on until you pass through the narrow gap opposite, between the houses. This leads up to the Fair Acres estate.

Turn right and follow the edge of the field (headland) until you come to a bridge. Cross over the bridge into the next field and walk straight-ahead along the headland until you come to a stile. Cross over this stile and you are now in The Leys.

Walk straight-ahead to reach the hedgerow on the other side of the playing field. Turn left and follow the path down the hill to the bridge. You are now entering the old Honeybourne airfield (RAF Honeybourne).

Walk straight-ahead across the field towards the large buildings (old aircraft hangers) looking for the waymarker post at the gap in the mound on the opposite side of the field. Continue straight-ahead across the old runway, and straight-ahead again to the waymarker post located on a track leading to the skid-pan on your left. Follow the directions on the waymarker post towards the next post that can be seen to the right of the perimeter hedge surrounding the old hangers. You are now passing the site of Honeybourne Grounds Farmhouse that was demolished in 1940 to make way for the airfield.

Continue across the fields in the direction of the two large conifer trees and electricity poles on the horizon, passing over the old runway (with the agricultural silos to your right) until you reach a stile that leads onto the Bretforton/Weston-sub-Edge road. DO NOT cross the stile. This point marks the boundary of Honeybourne Parish.

Turn around to face the direction you have just come from to view Honeybourne in the distance. Now enjoy the open aspect as you retrace your steps back to the village.



Lichens by Mike Edwards

One of the consequences of the heavy winds a few weeks ago was the large numbers of bits of broken tree twig strewn across roads and pavements. I was particularly struck by the amount of lichen growth on a lot of these broken twigs. Looking around us, there is a huge amount of lichen growth on many of the trees around Honeybourne.

And it's not just trees – different lichens are capable of growing on a wide variety of surfaces. The yellow-orange coloured patches on many tiled roofs are lichen, and other types will even grow on pavements or uPVC window frames. There are even the beginnings of the growth of a green lichen on the black plastic legs of the church noticeboard in Stratford Road, near to the village shop, although this is only a few years old – look at the side facing down Stratford Road towards Buckle Street.

There are many different types of lichen, but all of them are combinations of a fungus (mould) and an alga (a single-celled plant). They are extremely slow-growing. The algae cells live and grow amongst the fungal threads or hyphae, and by photosynthesis in the light, provide the fungus with a source of carbohydrate in the form of simple sugars. Fungi are incapable of photosynthesis, so like animals, have to get their food from somewhere else. In exchange, the fungus provides the alga with physical protection. The relationship is a complex one and not yet fully understood. It is very finely balanced and easily upset, so lichens are extremely sensitive to atmospheric pollution, particularly sulphur dioxide.

Very few are seen in centres of industry or in large towns or cities, but they can sometimes be seen hanging in great tresses from tree branches in ancient woodlands. Therefore we should be very pleased to see them here, as they are an indication that the air in Honeybourne is very clean and unpolluted. I once knew someone who was researching the atmospheric pollution caused by an aluminium smelting works near Inverness: he was able to trace the chemicals released into the atmosphere by the smelting works across a large swathe of north-east Scotland – where the air is generally very clean – by the presence or absence of particular types of lichen.

Apart from the "Achilles", the passenger engines were all four-coupled designs, but goods 0-6-0s were also still quite common on passenger duties.

The outbreak of the Great War in August 1914 had little initial impact on regular services, though military specials – passenger and goods – were now rather more in evidence than in peacetime. As the conflict gathered pace. The shortage of men and materials began to have an effect, and by late 1917 the London express had been reduced to two each way, with another two services conveying through coaches (by Northern trains from/to Oxford); two called at Honeybourne. Local trains between Worcester and Oxford had been reduced to three daily. Cheltenham line trains were seven each way, and Stratford eight or nine, some of which continued to work through to Moreton, Evesham or Worcester.

Traffic had largely returned to normal by around 1921, although was not by any means at its interwar peak.

London express passenger traffic had fully recovered from the wartime restrictions, and very largely comprised through trains rather than attached through coaches. Only one each way was formed on other services; the 8.45 a.m. Paddington to Fishguard Harbour slipped a pair of coaches at Didcot for Malvern, which were added to a couple more non-corridor coaches for the fast run onwards, whilst the 4.5 p.m. Wolverhampton portion was attached to the 6.42 p.m. Leamington express at Oxford. By this time, "Saints" took the fast London trains between Worcester and Paddington. Almost entirely composed of corridor stock, with three each way conveying dining and buffet facilities. Two expresses in each direction called at Honeybourne, though connections from the Stratford and Cheltenham lines were not always convenient – the routes via Leamington or Gloucester (and Kingham) were primarily utilised for their through coaches, although the 4.45 p.m. Paddington still slipped at Moreton for Cheltenham, and Honeybourne was served by the coaches on the way.


