



All of our workshop packages can be tailored to Workshops can be designed to improve meet any additional needs of your students and can be linked to particular subject areas.



Taking part in dance contributes to student's physical, social and cultural development. As a physical activity it promotes fitness and well-being. As performers, students develop confidence and self-esteem; and their trust, respect and tolerance of others increases through learning about cultural diversity through dance, working with partners, sharing ideas and physically being in contact with other people.


All of our workshop packages can be tailored to meet any additional needs of your students and can be linked to particular subject areas.

- P.E. (KS3 & 4) Pupils will be taught to develop their technique, perform dances within a range of dance styles and forms, analyse their performances compared to previous ones and demonstrate improvement to achieve their personal best.
- GCSE Dance Dance City can work with your students to create your group choreography or to develop into different dance styles.
- BTEC Weekly sessions can support your students to build on their technique and explore different dance styles.
- Teacher support Teachers are invited to observe and participate in workshops to gain more confidence to use dance in their teaching practice and to create their own workshop ideas.





Arts Award

Arts Award inspires young people to grow their arts and leadership talents as well as develop employability skills: it's creative, valuable and accessible. As an Arts Award Supporter Dance City can help towards accomplishing the criteria for Arts Award.

Arts Award can be achieved at five levels, four of which (Explore, Bronze, Silver and Gold) are on the Qualification and Credit Framework whilst *Discover* is an introductory level. Anyone up to age 25 can take part in Arts Awards. *Discover* starts from age 5, *Explore* from age 7 and *Bronze*, *Silver* and *Gold* open to ages 11 and above.

- 1. Five Free tickets per show for young people working towards Arts Awards.
- 2. Practical dance workshops with a Dance City professional dance teacher.
- 3. Question and answer sessions with Dance City professional dancer/dance teacher/producer.
- 4. Platforms to share work with peers during class, at school assemblies and at Dance City events.

Artsmark

The Arts Council's Artsmark Award has been designed by schools for schools and helps schools to deliver high quality arts and cultural provision. Artsmark can help unlock the potential of children, develop their character and talent, and increase their knowledge and understanding. Artsmark is aligned to the whole school development plan making it an effective tool for delivering school targets.

We can work with your leadership team to support your school's Artsmark journey. Through dance we can build activity programmes, from occasional sessions to whole school involvement across the year. We can respond to and help you to provide evidence of the impact



on the spiritual, moral, social and cultural developments of your pupils, identified in School Improvement Plans (SIPs), School Development Plans (SDPs), or similar documents.

As part of the recruitment process for the Department for Education's CAT programme we offer free contemporary dance workshops to schools. These workshops are available October - May each year. We hold open auditions in May for entry to the Dance City CAT in September. No previous dance experience is necessary.

The Dance City CAT is part of the Government's National Music and Dance Scheme. Entry to the CAT is by audition only, and we are looking for young people who demonstrate exceptional talent or potential in contemporary dance. We offer students 7 – 11 hours training in contemporary and classical dance each week, including weekend workshops and choreographic sessions.
