Would **you** like to advocate for a better education for kids across our state? The best time to do this in 2022 is coming up this month!


The Washington State legislative session is opening in Olympia and to advocate for the <u>Top Legislative Priorities</u> Washington State PTAs (like ours!) voted in, we will be having <u>Washington State PTA Advocacy Focus Day</u> on January 17 and <u>Advocacy Focus Week</u> from January 17 to 21. During these sessions, advocates will have an opportunity to explain why these priorities matter to them and their PTAs. We want legislators who represent all parts of Washington to hear our voices, data, and stories about why these priorities are so critical. This will ensure that we can have the greatest impact on state legislation that affects Washington schools.

To take advantage of the upcoming awesome opportunities to advocate, this is what you can do.

1. Fill out the <u>Focus Day Interest Google Form</u> In this form you will sign up to receive alerts about who to send messages to during Focus Week and also notifications about virtual meetings you can join. You do *not* need to be a PTA Board member to sign up. We are District 34 and our Legislators are Sen. Joe Nguyen, Rep. Eileen Cody, and Rep. Joe Fitzgibbon. All Democrats.

2. To stay informed about this upcoming session, subscribe to the Focus on Advocacy newsletter and sign up for <u>WSPTA Action Alerts</u>. Community Question

Why do we have a \$15 membership fee and what is it used for?

The simple answer is we are trying to keep the membership fee as low as possible while adhering to the PTA guidelines.

Below is the breakout of our \$15 annual membership fee.

\$8.00 WA State PTA

\$3.50 Seattle Council PTSA

\$0.75 Transaction fee

\$2.75 Genesee Hill PTA (helps fund waiving membership fees for those who ask) **\$15.00 Total**

We have a membership fee waiver policy which is on our website.

The majority of the fee goes to the **WA State PTA.** This funds trainings, larger assemblies, and paid staff who run the office/programs. Every year in October WS PTA has a Legislative Assembly and every two years, at this assembly, <u>5 Top</u> <u>Legislative Priorities</u> are voted on by delegates from member PTAs across the state. Along with these top 5, we also pass and amend other resolutions.

The Seattle Public School system, including Genesee Hill, benefit from the important

work the WA State PTA performs each year.

The **Seattle Council PTSA** performs regional advocacy. Principals can help identify regional issues to advocate for, as can the Seattle Council PTSA and our Regional representatives from WS PTA. Advocacy can be done to our superintendent, to OSPI, or to the Seattle School Board directors. This could mean writing to them, calling them, or asking them to come to a school meeting. Advocating for school levies, a critical funding source for our system, is one area they work on.

The \$2.75 that goes to **Genesee Hill PTA** primarily supports waiving membership fees for anyone who requests them. Any balance supports our annual budget and programs we fund. And the \$0.75 transaction fee goes to Member Planet, which is the online system we use to maintain membership.
