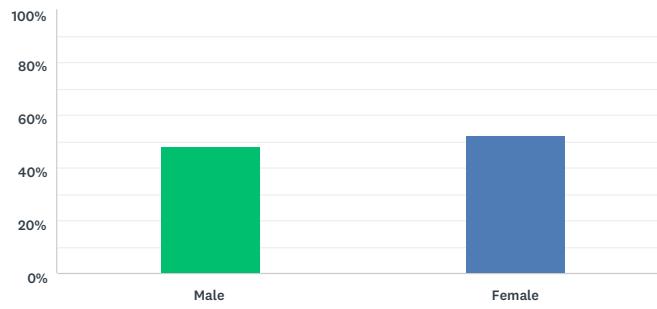

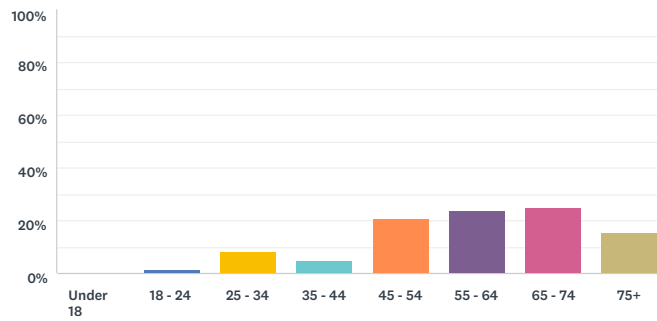

Q2 1 Please indicate your age range

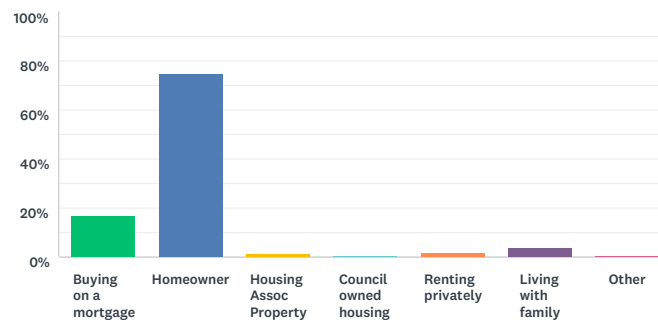

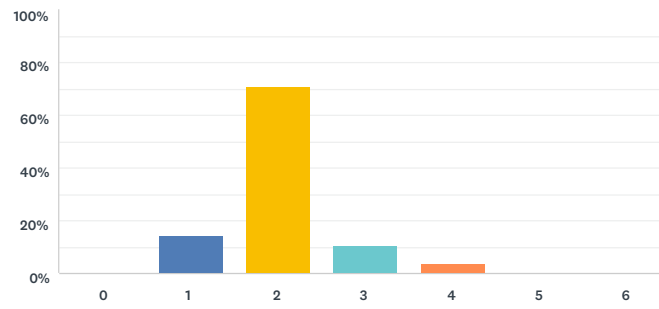

Q4 3A How many adults are in your household?

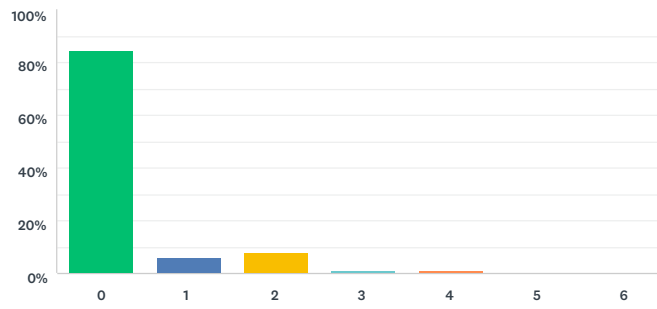

Q5 3B How many children under school age are in the household?

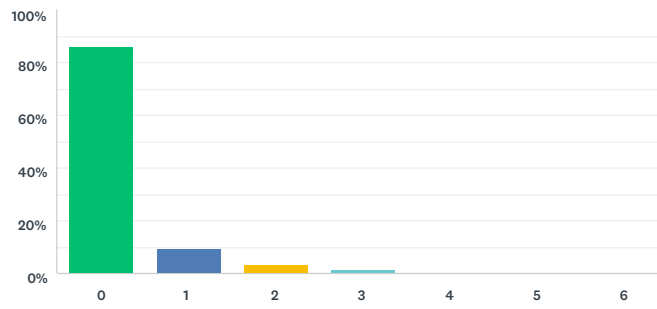

Q6 3C How many primary school age children are in the household?

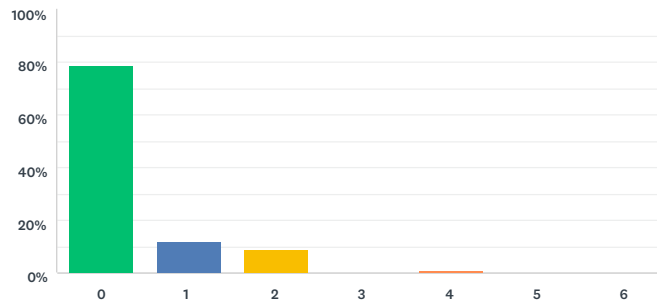

Q7 3D How many children between 11 and 18 years are in the household?

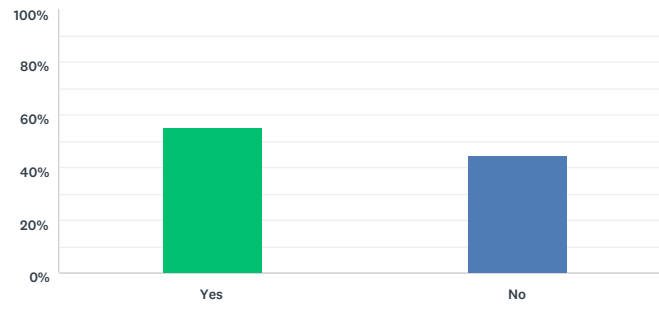

Q8 4A Do you have any older children currently living away from home?

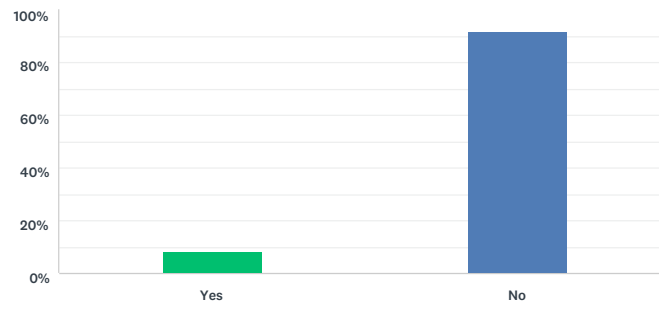

Q15 10 How many new homes do you think would be appropriate?

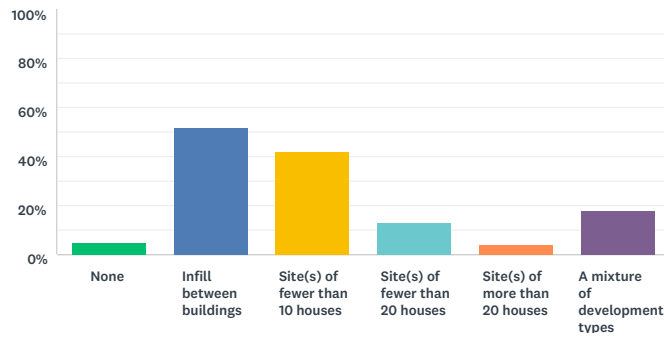

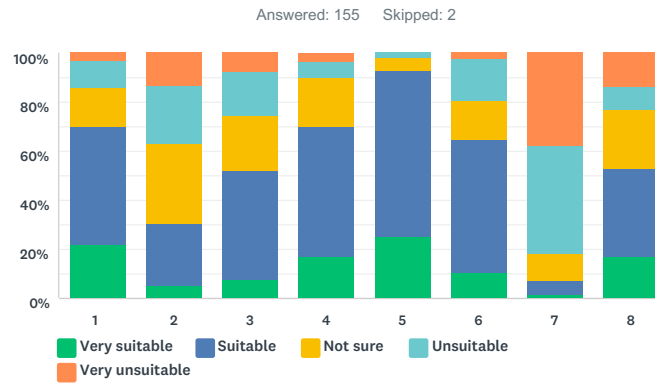
Q16 11 What type of future housing development(s) do you think would be appropriate?

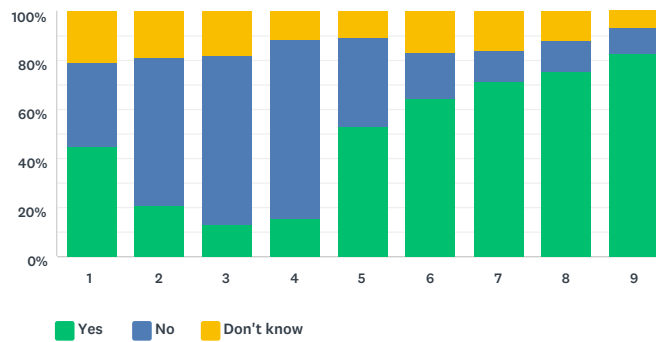

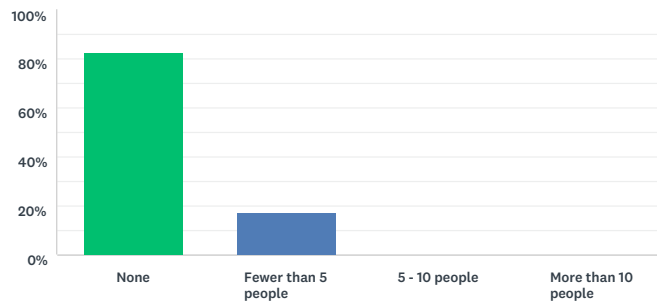

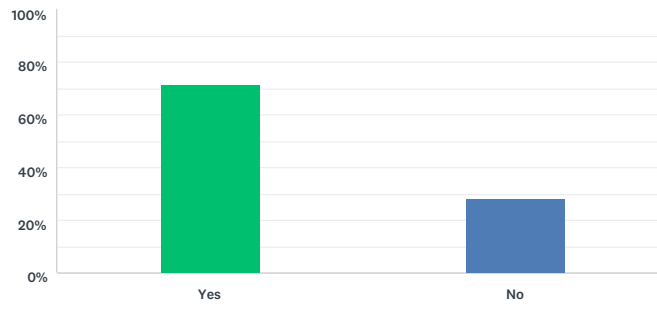

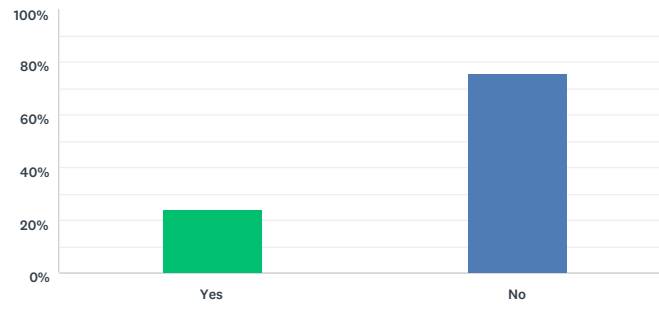

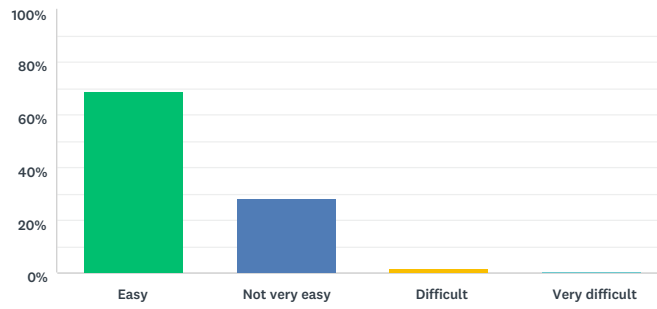

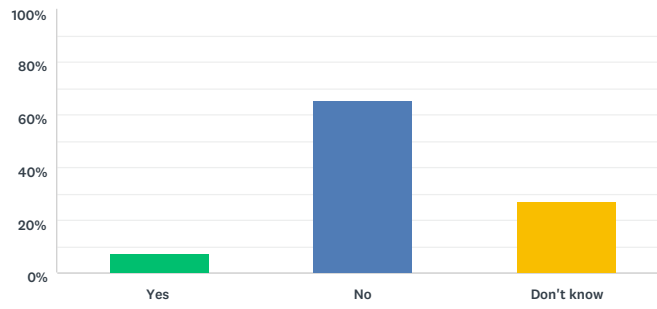

Q52 46 Do you think that the current bus service is adequate for North Marston's needs?

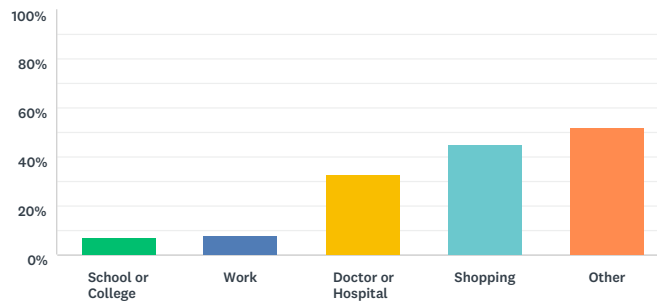

Q56 50 Which of the following facilities and amenities in the parish do you use?

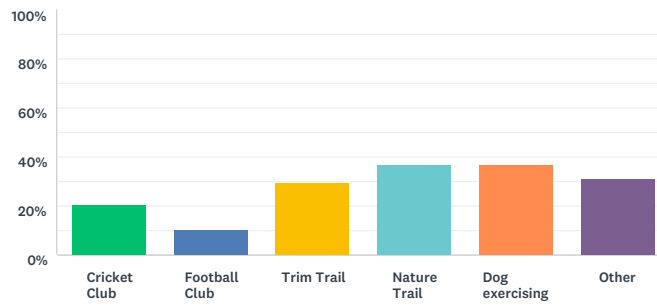

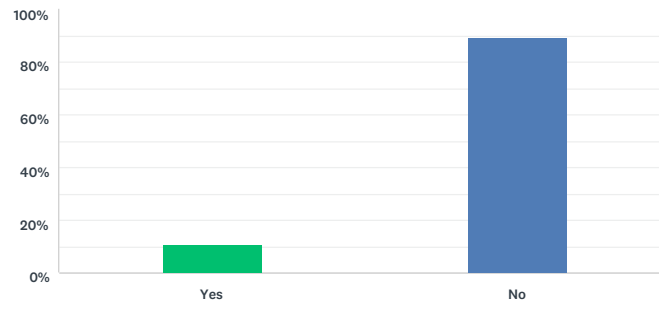

Q63 56B Are any members of your family currently pupils at the village school?

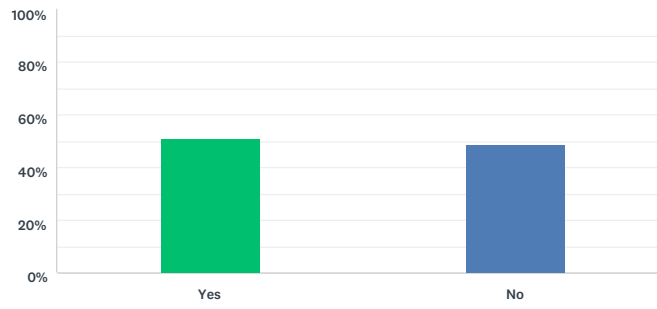

Q64 56C Have members of your family attended the village school in the past?

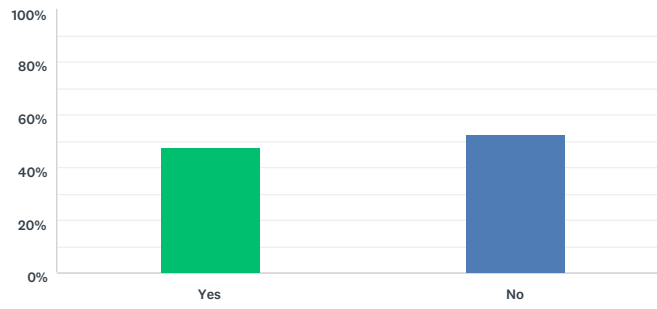

Q65 57 If there are children below school age in your family, do you want them to attend the village school in the future?

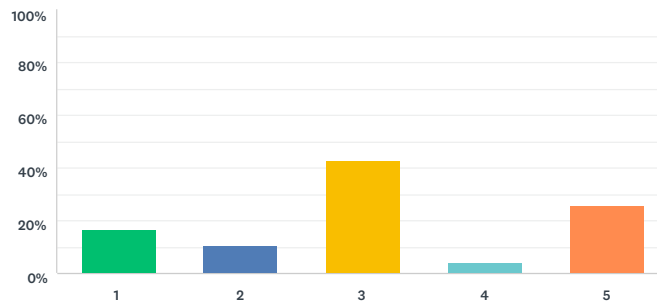

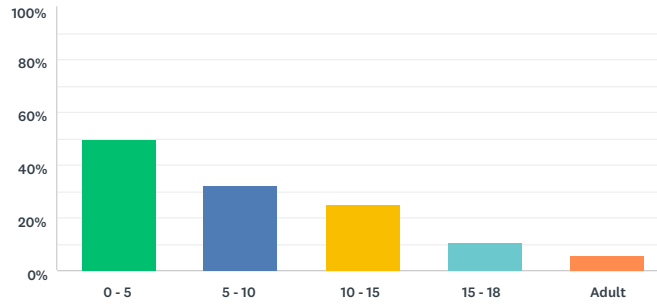
