WHAT TO BRING: Your side dish or dessert to share, swim suit, towel, sunblock, folding chair, your own non-disposable taster cup, your smackdown entries, low-ABV kegged/bottle homebrew or commercial beer to share, a thirst for beer (Ha, like we had to remind you of that one!) and your smile!
