Families in Crisis

We have often written about the life chances that can be expected for young people who have grown up in a Russian orphanage. Many will not have experienced much care beyond the simple provision of basic necessities. They are unlikely to have made much progress in education, and then they were thrust out with little support, few prospects and less hope.

A young woman in particular is likely to suffer abuse and violence. If a married woman is hit by her partner, the police will only intervene if she ends up in hospital, or dead. She may well become homeless, destitute, and vulnerable to addictions and criminal behaviour. And if she has a child to care for, how does she manage, and to whom can she turn?

A Women's Crisis Centre in a town near St Petersburg exists for women like this. It offers food, shelter, rehabilitative counselling and nurturing of faith. It seeks to restore broken lives through structure and teaching in life skills. It is run by local Christians, and the fundamental difference between this centre and others is that, while elsewhere children are forcibly removed and placed in the orphanage system, the mothers here may keep their children, building and strengthening that irreplaceable parental bond and helping them grow together as a family. Not only that; it's about the only way of saving the children from a repeat of their mothers' experiences.

One activity which both contributes to their budget and teaches useful skills is the production of some of their own food supplies. Last year we paid for and erected three 8-metre (26 feet) long polytunnel-type greenhouses, to sustain the growing of vegetables and fruit. We also rebuilt the enclosure for their chickens, to give them more space and better security (and room for more hens!). More about that overleaf.

The Centre also keeps goats, and we have undertaken to improve or rebuild their accommodation, chiefly to combat winter conditions. There is also a need to provide adequate storage for the gifts of clothing the Centre receives, and a variety of items the Centre needs. They haven't enough chairs; would you help us buy some? Several rooms need extra light fittings; a trampoline would be a great asset, as would a projector and screen.

We will be carrying out the practical work in August 2019. If you would like to help finance it, or help us provide the other items, that would be wonderful. Details of how to contribute are overleaf. If you would like to join the volunteer team and help with the work on site, we can probably take two or three additional people. Contact us for details soon.

Project report 2018

A small team of volunteers went to Russia in August 2018 to work at the Women's Crisis Centre described overleaf. It was a good time, both from the point of view of completing a practical project, and of building and strengthening relationships with Russian partners, especially as we were able to live and worship with them.

As we had requested, the three greenhouses had been obtained, and concrete bases laid for them, before our arrival. Erecting the frames, attaching and trimming the coverings, adding door handles and finishing off was a fairly straight-forward job, especially as we had some local assistance. At the same time, an extended run was built for the chickens, around three sides of the existing one, about a foot out, so that the birds did not have to be moved. They did, however, take a close interest in the proceedings, especially as our digging produced a good supply of worms.

We were also able, through a team member's personal fundraising, to provide a new laptop and a new printer, both bought locally, and a refurbished English laptop, to add to the laptop we provided funds for earlier in the year. This equipment was needed, not only to help with the administration of the Centre, but also with the children's education. Thanks to the generosity of churchpeople here, we were also able to deliver our usual supply of seeds. Growth in several directions!
