

## Starting a General Partnership

A general partnership is a relationship between two or more persons who team up to operate a business. A general partnership is similar to a sole proprietorship in that it is registered at the local level and is directly tied to the individuals in it. *Quick Tip: When forming a partnership, remember that every member can make business transactions for the entire business.* 

A written partnership agreement is highly recommended, since each partner will contribute varying amounts of money, property, labor and skills. The agreement should describe each partner's responsibilities; explain how profits and losses will be divided. It may be beneficial to use an attorney to develop your partnership agreement. *Quick Tip:* Your partnership agreement should also include an exit strategy - what will happen if one partner leaves by choice, death or discord.

Although not mandatory, to help formalize them, partnership statements may be filed with the <u>State</u> <u>Corporation Commission</u>. Complete a Statement of Partnership Authority (Form UPA-93) and file it with the Commission.

You must register a Business Trade Name with the Isle of Wight County Clerk of the Circuit Court.

Visit the <u>Isle of Wight County Commissioner of Revenue's office</u> for assistance in completing the form. The form must also be notarized. A Corporation or "LLC" must bring a copy of registered name from the State Corporation Commission.

If your business will be located in the <u>Town of Smithfield</u> or <u>Town of Windsor</u>, please contact the respective town directly regarding business name registration.

A \$12.50 fee applies and the payment should be made payable to: <u>Sharon N. Jones, Clerk of Circuit Court.</u> Contact number for Clerk of Circuit Court is 757-365-6233.

**Employer Identification Number (EIN):** If you have at least one employee or a <u>Keogh Plan</u>, you must get an EIN. You can also choose to get an EIN if you prefer not to use your SSN.

Partnerships must file a federal income tax return but do not pay tax. Each partner's share of the profits or losses is included in his or her personal income tax return.
