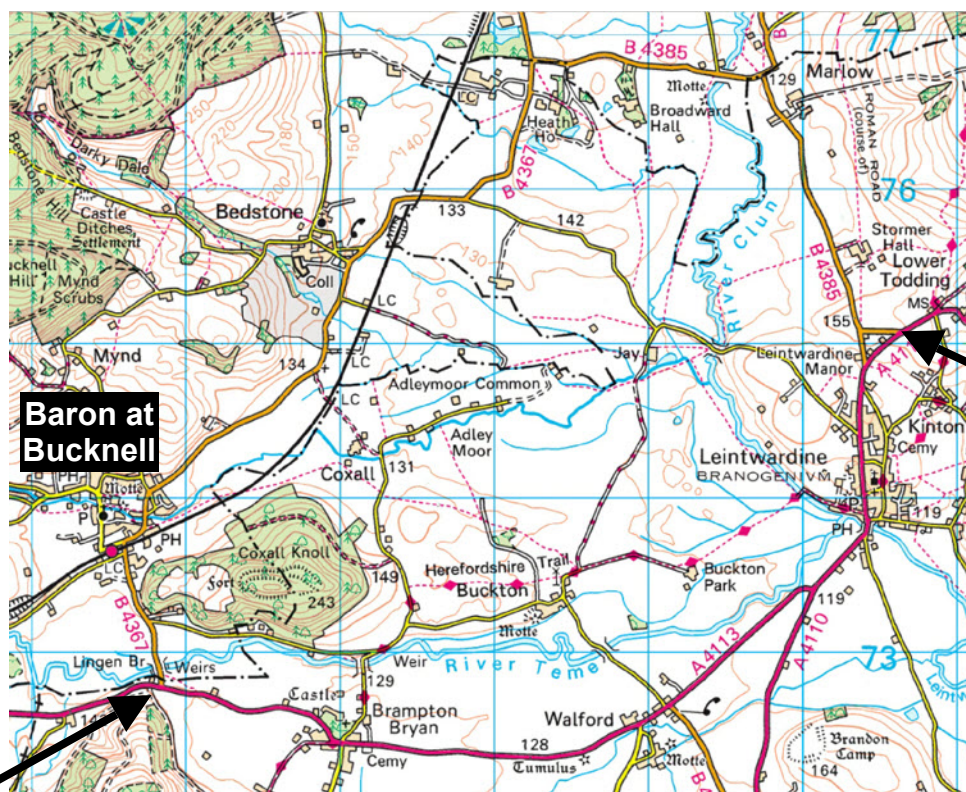


Baron at Bucknell

Road closure at the railway crossing in Bucknell from Monday 25th July for 7 days
Baron at Bucknell Open as usual - Please follow the diversion

On Monday 25th July Severn Trent are closing the B4367 at the Bucknell railway crossing for 7 days (this is the normal access road to the Baron at Bucknell from the A4113 Ludlow-Knighton road). The road is completely closed and not open to any vehicles even for access. The diversion takes you to Leintwardine on the A4113, then left on the B4385 signposted to Craven Arms. After 1 mile take the left turn signposted to Hopton Heath & Bucknell. After a further mile you come to a T junction - turn left signposted to Bedstone & Bucknell. Follow this road through Bedstone and into Bucknell and turn right just before the railway crossing signposted to Chapel Lawn. The Baron is ½ mile along this road, on the way out of the village, on the right hand side. Please note there is also no access from Weston Road - so if coming from Knighton you will still have to continue to Leintwardine. Alternatively you could come to Bucknell via Chapel Lawn. If coming from the Ludlow direction you will turn off right after the Jolly Frog restaurant (a large red building on the main road) signposted to Craven Arms & Clungunford and follow the diversion. If you come into Leintwardine village you have come too far and will need to turn around). If coming from Craven Arms there is no change. Please see map showing the diversion below:

From Ludlow

Turn right after the Jolly Frog and follow diversion towards Clungunford, & Hopton Heath. Follow signs to Bedstone & Bucknell.

From Knighton

Follow diversion to Leintwardine, then towards Clungunford, & Hopton Heath. Follow signs to Bedstone & Bucknell or come via Chapel Lawn

We hope the road works will be completed by Friday 29th July, but Severn Trent have said 7 days and so it may be closed until Monday 1st August.

We will be open as usual during the road closure and look forward to seeing you.
