For 2016, the Endowment awarded ten grants and scholarships totaling \$21,300

Austin Children's Shelter – The Austin Children's Shelter campus provides services for children, young adults and families affected by abuse, exploitation and neglect. ACS is a safe space to begin to heal and learn to thrive.
