The hospice is the first in the UK to follow the Sengetun model of care, which has "placemaking" at the centre of its approach. This innovative state-of-the-art Scandinavian design puts patients and families first and provides space for privacy, dignity and compassionate care for all ages.

The selection of energy efficient LED luminaires in conjunction with a smart Casambi control system made a huge impact in the compliance with section 6 of the Scottish Technical standards with regards to energy consumption and carbon emissions. Casambi was chosen as the lighting control system to provide sufficient flexibility and enable the system to be altered with the minimum of disruption, during the lifetime of the building.

Holders also brought an education process and support mechanism to allow a seamless integration between handover and in use client occupation. This included commissioning and training staff.
