
## Barcode Colour Guide

## Acceptable barcode colour combinations






## Unacceptable barcode colour combinations









## Things to Remember:

- Black bars on a white background is the best combination, however some other colour combinations will also work.
- White and warm colours (yellow and red) are invisible to barcode scanners therefore these colours are appropriate for the barcode background.
- Black and cold colours (blue, purple, green, and dark brown) are visible to the barcode scanner therefore these colours are suitable for the vertical barcode bars.
- **Contrast is important** the vertical bars should be printed in a darker colour than the background.
- If you're using one of the colour combinations above we recommend that you test your printed barcode label with a few different barcode scanners to make sure that its easily readable (because different scanners can have slightly different colour calibrations).
- **Metallic inks aren't suitable for printed barcodes** because they reflect light away from the scanner.
