

Biting

Why do some toddlers bite?

It is not uncommon toddlers to bite, it is just a way of them expressing their frustration as they can't fully articulate. Toddlers lack impulse control, and biting may be a response to overstimulation. Repeated biting for many toddlers may be an attention-seeking behaviour as toddlers usually prefer negative attention over no attention at all. For children with speech problems, biting can say, "Stop bothering me. I was playing with that."

When does it happen?

Usually between 18-36 months.

How to deal?

- Refer toddlers who are behind in their speech and language development to professionals
- Model appropriate language
- Move frustrated toddlers to another play area – some may just need more personal space than others
- Maintain good routine

NHS IMMUNISATION SCHEDULE FOR UNDER 2's

8 week

6-in-1 vaccine, given as a single jab containing vaccines to protect against six separate diseases: diphtheria; tetanus; whooping cough (pertussis); polio; Haemophilus influenzae type b, known as Hib, a bacterial infection that can cause severe pneumonia or meningitis in young children; and hepatitis B

Pneumococcal (PCV) vaccine Rotavirus vaccine MenB vaccine

12 weeks

6-in-1 vaccine, second dose Rotavirus vaccine, second dose

16 weeks

6-in-1 vaccine, third dose Pneumococcal (PCV) vaccine, second dose MenB vaccine second dose

1 year

Hib/MenC vaccine, given as a single jab containing vaccines against meningitis C (first dose) and Hib (fourth dose) Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine, given as a single jab

Pneumococcal (PCV) vaccine, third dose MenB vaccine, third dose

2 to 8 years (including children in reception class and school years 1 to 4)

3 years and 4 months

Measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine, second dose 4-in-1 pre-school booster, given as a single jab containing vaccines against: diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough (pertussis) and polio

How are parents benefitted from last week's challenge?

When I had both my boys – Sudden Infant Death Syndrome was my biggest fear, and I would have the monitor so loud so I could hear every breath and was constantly checking them. So reading a policy such as this is very reassuring – that sleep and rest time is taken so seriously and that the children are constantly monitored. It also reminds me that I need to find the fans for the boys rooms – to try and keep them cool in the Summer (positive thinking!).

I did not realise the policy regarding sleeping on backs, but am reassured that such a serious issue as SIDS is treated so seriously in the nursery. Learning the staff have so much training is also very reassuring. We will now ensure our childs bedroom is kept between 18C and 20C to replicate the nursery environment.

the quiz was a useful reminder to me regarding safe sleep for babies. It's amazing how quickly you forget once your child gets through that stage.

Answers to last week questions:

- 1. What is the minimum room temperature to be maintained in the sleep room? 18-20C
- 2. What is the position the baby must be put to sleep in? 'Back to sleep' position
- 3. What is the procedure to be followed for specific sleep requests for babies under and over 6 months?

Under 6 months – if parent insist the baby sleeps on the stomach or side, must have supporting evidence form a Doctor that specifies the sleeping position.

Over 6 months – parents to put their request in writing requesting to carry out a different sleeping position to that which is advised.

EQUALITY & DIVERSITY POLICY

Statement of intent

Monkey Puzzle Day Nursery takes great care to treat each individual as a person in their own right, with equal rights and responsibilities to any other individual, whether they are an adult or a child. A commitment to implementing our Equal Opportunities Policy will form part of each employee's job description. Should anyone believe that this policy is not being upheld, it is their duty to report the matter to the attention of the Nursery Manager at the earliest opportunity.

The legal framework for this policy is based on:

- Special Educational Needs and Disability Act 2001.

Monkey Puzzle Day Nursery and all its staff are committed to the following:

It is the policy of Monkey Puzzle Day Nursery not to discriminate in the treatment of individuals. All staff are expected to co-operate with the implementation, monitoring and improvement of this and other policies. All staff are expected to challenge language, actions, behaviours and attitudes which are oppressive or discriminatory on the grounds as specified in this policy and recognise and celebrate other cultures and traditions. All staff are expected to participate in equality and inclusion training.

Training

The nursery recognises the importance of training as a key factor in the implementation of an effective inclusion policy. The nursery will strive towards the provision of inclusion, equality and diversity training for all staff on an annual basis.

Early learning framework

Early learning opportunities offered in the nursery encourage children to develop positive attitudes to people who are different from them. It encourages children to empathise with others and to begin to develop the skills of critical thinking. At Monkey Puzzle Day Nursery we provide an environment and resources whereby all children are given support and guidance throughout their time at the nursery.

We do this by:

- Making children feel valued and good about themselves
- Ensuring that all children have equal access to early learning and play opportunities
- Reflecting the widest possible range of communities in the choice of resources
- Avoiding stereotypical or derogatory images in the selection of materials
- Acknowledging and celebrating a wide range of religions, beliefs and festivals
- Creating an environment of mutual respect and empathy

- Helping children to understand that discriminatory behaviour and remarks are unacceptable
- Ensuring that all early learning opportunities offered are inclusive of children with learning difficulties and/or disabilities and children from disadvantaged backgrounds
- Ensuring that children whose first language is not English have full access to the early learning opportunities and are supported in their learning

Food

We work in partnership with parents to ensure that the medical, cultural and dietary needs of children are met. We will help children to learn about a range of food and cultural approaches to meal times and to respect the differences among them.

Meetings

Information about meetings and activities will be communicated in a variety of ways according to individual needs (written, verbal and translated), to ensure that all parents have information about access.

We understand that parental involvement is essential in supporting their child's educational needs and we therefore ensure that we develop a sound relationship with all parents in order for their child to achieve to the best of their ability.

- As positive role models all staff will promote non-stereotypical images with the use of toys, books and imaginary play. All play and learning experiences will promote images of both girls and boys
- There will be no stereotypical activities; all children will be encouraged to join in all activities (e.g. dressing up, dolls, climbing, bikes)
- Our childcare practices will be regularly reviewed by the nursery Manager and management so that any discriminative or unfair practices can be removed
- Monkey Puzzle Day Nursery acknowledges that preconceptions relating to gender and sexism are abundant within language and we will challenge such language when appropriate
- Monkey Puzzle Day Nursery aims to demonstrate through its work that it positively values and respects children of all ethnic origins and racial groups, religions, cultures and linguistic backgrounds
- All participating at Monkey Puzzle Day Nursery must provide and reflect the needs of the children and families from ethnic minority groups. All participating must have the knowledge and commitment to treat all children at Monkey Puzzle Day Nursery as individuals with equal concern

Extra-Curricular Activities

On occasions Monkey Puzzle Day Nursery may offer extra-curricular activities at an additional cost to parents, however those children whose parents choose not to contribute financially for their child to participate in such activities should not be discriminated against and either encouraged to participate in these activities or be offered the opportunity to participate in an additional activity offered by the nursery.
