A Rich and Diverse Curriculum

We are proud of our curriculum, which is broad, balanced and ensures **every** student has the opportunity to reach his or her full potential.

Moving from primary to secondary school can be a daunting prospect for children – and for their parents! Excellent links with our partner primary schools and our enhanced pastoral care programme in Year 7 ensure this transition is smooth and stress-free.

Many of your children will already know many of us. Our specialist staff and our students visit local primary schools to run workshops and master classes, and there are opportunities for Year 5 and 6 pupils to visit us for taster sessions, lessons and extra-curricular activities.

and Diverse Curriculum Achievement for All

In Year 7, all our students are assigned a specialist Form Tutor who will teach them one of the core subjects, often along with PSHEE and Citizenship, for their first four weeks at school. This enables every student to spend between 3 and 6 periods a week with their Form Tutor, in addition to daily registration, and this ensures that the Form Tutor will, very quickly, get to know your child as an individual.

The School Day

The school day begins at 8.40am. All students are expected to be in their form rooms by 8.35am to register with their Form Tutor. Once a week, during this time, they gather for assembly with their year group or their house. On other days they participate in literacy, numeracy and critical thinking activities. Lessons are 50 minutes in length, with a break between periods 2 and 3. Lunch is staggered during period 5. All students sit down to eat – they can choose to purchase a healthy lunch, taking advantage of our cashless catering system, or they can bring a packed lunch from home. The school day finishes at 2.50pm (2.10pm on Wednesdays). Students can choose from a wide range of extra-curricular clubs and activities, including a homework club.

Years 7 and 8


In Years 7 and 8 students study English, maths, science, computing, history, geography, design technology, art, dance, drama, music, a modern foreign language, PE, PSHEE and RE. Our curriculum is greatly enhanced across all subject areas by our 'iPads for Learning' scheme.

Years 9,10 and 11

Students embark on their GCSE studies at the start of Year 9. All students continue to study the core subjects of English, maths, science, RS, PE and PSHEE. We offer an extensive range of GCSE and vocational qualifications and ensure that learning pathways are tailored to suit all abilities and aspirations. Students have three years to study their GCSE courses, ensuring the best possible learning opportunities result in the best possible grades. Our options programme offers breadth and allows all students to achieve against the new benchmarks recently introduced by the Government.

Sixth Form

Students choose from a wide range of academic and vocational courses which offer clear progression routes to university, training or employment.





A Personalised Approach to Support and Guidance

At Haslingden High School, all students are valued as individuals and as members of a tutor group, a house, a year group and of the school. In Year 7, much of the care and support our young learners need is provided by the Form Tutor. Heads of Year and Heads of School oversee all aspects of monitoring and development and any issues are quickly and sensitively resolved.

One of our greatest strengths is our partnership with parents and carers, who are encouraged to take an active role in their child's education. Regular communication – both formal and informal – means students feel secure and supported. We work together to ensure school life is a happy, fulfilling and successful experience for our young people.

A Personalised Approach to Support and Guidance

Our students are cared for, supported, guided and nurtured. **High standards and high expectations lead to success**. Student progress is underpinned by a rigorous programme of monitoring and mentoring. Realistic yet challenging targets are set for all students in all subjects at all stages of their school life. These are supported by a calendar of formal assessment opportunities when subject staff assess academic achievement, effort and attitudes to learning. All assessment information is shared with parents and students. Parents and carers also have the opportunity to discuss their child's progress at parents evenings.

Commendation assemblies, house points, achievement postcards and rewards activities ensure that no opportunity for celebrating any aspect of our students' achievements is missed. Regular monitoring and mentoring ensure early identification of concerns, and intervention strategies are put in place. All required interventions will be discussed with parents and carers.

Outstanding Opportunities

We believe that learning should not stop at the end of the school day. We offer a diverse range of extra-curricular opportunities.

We have a strong tradition in the performing arts and our curriculum helps students to **develop creativity, confidence and self-esteem**. Our music department is exceptional and our various bands and ensembles have won a number of accolades, both local and national. Dance clubs, art clubs, drama workshops, peripatetic music lessons, full-scale productions and a range of shows and performances ensure that all students are given the opportunity to pursue their artistic interests – or just have some fun!

Sport is also an important part of school life. It encourages a healthy lifestyle and develops teamwork. The variety of clubs available reflects the breadth of interests and talents of our students. Popular sporting activities include: football, rugby, netball, cricket, rounders, basketball, swimming and trampolining. Our teams compete successfully in major competitions at all levels and a number of our young people have represented Lancashire and even England in sports as diverse as golf, swimming, trampolining and handball.

Each year, students participate in numerous visits and excursions, which include visits to galleries, museums and theatres; geography and biology field trips and holidays abroad. We also offer students the opportunity to become involved in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award scheme, at Bronze, Silver and Gold levels.

A sense of community is an essential element in the life of the school and we encourage our students to **make a positive contribution to the school community**,

the local community and the global community. Our students are involved in a number of community projects and charity work has been recognised as a real strength of the school. We work closely with our partner primary schools, with local secondary schools and with the local college, sharing our facilities and expertise.

Uniform

Homework

Homework has a key role to play in ensuring every student reaches his or her full potential. It supports and extends the work covered in lessons and encourages independent learning skills and time management. In years 7 and 8, all students receive one homework booklet a week, focussed on one subject area. Students are expected to spend up to six hours on each booklet, spread over the course of the week. In years 9-11 students are set weekly homework tasks in all their core and options subjects. All students have access, via an app on their iPad, to the web-based 'Show my Homework' system, which details their homework. Parents and carers can also access this information.
