New Homes On The Way

The final phase of development in Perry Common is now underway. 146 new homes will be built over the next 2 years on land alongside Dovedale Road, by housebuilders Lovell. You may have already seen the security fencing. The first homes for sale are

due to be available in June 2017.

A new planning application has also been submitted for building 20 new homes for sale on the former 'balcony' site, adjacent to the top of Enderby Park. The plans also seek to formally close the road link between Jonquil Close and Witton Lodge

"I loved doing this Community Research as I love talking to people and listening to their views. I'm interested in how people feel and in their wellbeing. A good community spirit is good for everyone!"




A Warm-Hearted Christmas Gift For Those In Need


