As I reflected on his statement I thought of the volunteers who come to help at Greenhouse Ministries. We have so many who have chosen to volunteer and then gravitate to a place where they use their gifting to become a champion of an area. There is no way to list all of them, but I want to mention a few that some of the staff members felt really are champions.

In the office, we have several who are peer counselors. Michael not only counsels but helps guide new volunteers who need help. Darryl has taken charge of inputting client data; Annette, Annetta, and Peggy answer the phone, take intake forms and look up client information.

It takes hundreds of volunteer hours to keep things sorted and put in the right place at the warehouse. Beth, we call our shoe pastor since she sorts, organizes, and keeps the Garden Patch stocked with just the right ones. Donna, prices everything from cookware to "what nots." Kelly and her four children come every week to sort and stock books. Brenda keeps the birthday, anniversary, and all types of cards sorted and stocked in the Garden Patch. Barbara can be found folding and sorting linens of all kinds. Annie goes about the business of putting clothes on hangers and getting them ready to go to either the community rack or up front to sell.

David comes daily to keep donated bicycles ready for people who need them for transportation. Jessie says that Roy and Kevin are her "dream team" on Thursday that allows her to catch up in keeping the warehouse and furniture store in order for the whole week. Miss Bettie, at age 83, keeps the food pantry organized and running well along with running the coffee ministry.

Someone recently asked where Greenhouse Ministries was located and when given directions said, "oh, that is next to the little boutique on Spring Street." The Garden Patch is kept so well most people do not think of it as a "thrift store." The staff and volunteers are constantly upgrading to make it a wonderful place to shop. Janet and Susie not only help arrange the items but help with personal shopping. Ginger and Ava use their decorating skills to keep everything pleasing to the eye.

I know when you start mentioning names you will always leave someone out so this is just a partial list of volunteers who are true Champions not only for their areas of expertise, but serving Greenhouse and in turn the community. This is the Jesus way of serving. Working because something needs to be done and not thinking about the praise you will receive or for personal pride.
