
Summer Activities

Guests were treated to a mouth-watering five course menu prepared and served by GC catering and hospitality students, which included a starter of salmon cured in beetroot and Pernod, a main course of braised shoulder of lamb in a red wine jus, and a spiced berry panna cotta with a honeycomb dust for dessert

As well as introducing Restaurant Number One, the event was a chance to announce the exciting new initiatives the GC School of Catering and Hospitality is launching in the near future, in collaboration with local businesses and the Chefs' Forum.

NEIGHBOURHOOD DEVELOPMENT PLAN

If you have been reading the recent issues of Viewpoint you will be aware that a **Neighbourhood Development Forum** was set up by residents in February to create a **Neighbourhood Plan** for the West of Cheltenham. This plan will help local people shape new developments for the benefit of the community and will, if adopted by residents at a referendum, be part of planning law!



The **Forum** has come up with a constitution document for guiding the plan's future development **and** defined the **boundaries of the area**; Gloucester Road to the south and east, the river Chelt to the north and the western boundary of Cheltenham.

Over the last few meetings the group has also produced a community profile summarising the assets and strengths of West Cheltenham and has identified a vison and aspirations for what the area should look like in the next 20 years. Ideas generated hope to ensure;

- connectivity between green spaces.
- vibrant spaces that people are proud of and which are visually inspiring.
- businesses are retained /attracted offering employment to local residents.
- protection of the buildings valued by the community.
- leisure and community facilities for the good of the community that suit all needs.
- reinvigoration of Coronation Square as a focused retail and economic hub.
- a place where everyone is safe, with good access to sustainable transport.
- future development takes into consideration the current provision including housing type, design and layout in relation to green space and industrial / retail allocation.

We will need to **involve as many residents**, **local workers** and **local businesses** in the process as possible and **attract wide support** for the plan so we will be visiting various community hubs, activities and events.

JOINT CORE STRATEGY (JCS)

SPRINGBANK GREENBELT DEVELOPMENTS

As many of the readers of Viewpoint will be aware new proposals have come to light to develop the land to the west of Fiddlers Green and Springbank as part of the JCS, a plan to meet local housing and employment needs. The proposal for a cyber hub (high tech business park) and 1100 residential properties has come about at short notice thanks to the reduction in allocations in other parts of Cheltenham.

There is considerable local outcry about the proposals not least as opportunity and time to comment has been far less than in other parts of the town. Locally there is also issue with the loss of amenity; beautiful countryside and views, walking routes and access to The House in the Tree pub. This is all the more concerning as the land in question is designated as "safeguarded greenbelt".

The plan shown here is the latest version, which shows the cyber hub in purple, housing in light brown and green spaces in green.

Railway parking permit plans announced

Last summer Gloucestershire County Council (GCC) consulted local residents and businesses about some options to change on-street parking restrictions around the train station. GCC have now published a proposed scheme with alterations based on the feedback they received.



www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/residentparking

Residents living near to the station will be entitled to park in the designated areas shown below between 8am and 8pm Monday to Friday if they buy a permit. Guests and visitors will be able to park for up to 4 hours during these times and overnight. Residents will also be able to buy daily passes for guests online. Anyone who would like to park for more than 4 hours will have to find alternative parking, park at the railway station or walk / cycle or use the bus or taxi.

SPRINGBANK COMMUNITY GARDEN, A HIDDEN GEM

ou might not have noticed the garden at the back of the Springbank Community Resource Centre but it has been establishing itself nicely since 2009 as quite a local gem!

The initial funding for the garden was raised by Hesters Way Partnership and Friends of Springbank (FoS) and included funds for the design of the space which was developed in consultation with FoS and



local residents. The plans included raised beds, a gravel walkway, a vegetable garden and pergola plus benches donated by local residents and a piece of public art.



Once constructed members of FoS took on responsibility for its upkeep and have done a magnificent job. Particular thanks should go to Vi Hall and more recently Liz and Mike Cook who have committed hundreds of voluntary hours to making the garden look terrific. This year Liz has sold lots of fruit and vegetables to the centre users, the money is recycled for the purchase of more plants and equipment.

From the word go the intention of the garden was to give local people the opportunity to learn about

growing all kinds of plants from protective shrubs to flowers and vegetables. So if you would like to lend a hand sometime Liz would welcome the help and has lots of knowledge to

share! She works in the garden every Monday between 12 and 2pm and on Fridays from 2-4pm. So if you fancy it why not pop in some time, you'd be most welcome.

NEW HONEYBOURNE LINE GYM



The latest addition to local park equipment has appeared at the Honeybourne Line in recent weeks with next to no fanfare. It's a FREE outdoor gym, located between the railway station and the St Georges Road (graffit) bridge. There are six pieces of kit located at various distances apart for the keen....and not so keen fitness folk to use for free whenever they like. The equipment includes:



Parallel Bars, Horizontal Ladder, Push Up, Hyperextension Bench, Vertical Climb, Push

Hands and Pull Up. The **Action Stations** feature interactive QR Code labels allowing users to find fitness information and instructional videos online. All units have been designed to ensure maximum comfort and safety and are abuse load tested to 540kg that's the weight of around four and a half grown men, or half a Rhino!

TRAVIS PERKINS SITE New development at Gloucester Road?

Travis Perkins move from its Gloucester Road site has been in the balance for over 4 years but recent announcements indicate that the final relocation date to their new site on Tewkesbury Road will take place on 14tth November.

The question now is, will it pave the way for plans previously consulted on for the development of 107 high-quality homes on land off Gloucester Road in Cheltenham? This was the intention of Taylor Wimpey when they received a resolution from CBC to grant full planning permission back in 2012.

This permission was subject to the signing of a Section 106 agreement, which would set out financial contributions which they would make towards **improving local** services, facilities and infrastructure in conjunction with the development.

We are not aware yet whether the current landowners. Travis Perkins. have entered into new negotiations with a developer but now that their move is confirmed perhaps we can expect some movement on the site in the near future?



The original masterplan shown above shaped through some public consultation included a residential development reflecting the characteristics of the neighbouring properties. It would include;

- 107 new homes / 16 affordable homes / mix of 2, 3 and 4-bedroom houses and apartments
- Access via an improved Travis Perkins entrance off Gloucester Road
- Enhanced landscaping on Gloucester Road
- Three new footpaths linking the development to Honeybourne Line

Perhaps a new consultation may be in the offing? Lets wait and see!


