Employers must provide training for operators of grinding machines and abrasive wheels, in compliance with their responsibilities under the Health & Safety At Work etc Act 1974 and the Provision and Use of Work Equipment 1998. They must ensure that employees who operate grinding wheels:

- have been trained in accordance with the Schedule of Training
- are competent to carry out the duty
