TRANSITION POLICY FOR ISO 14001: 2004 to ISO 14001: 2015

1. OBJECT AND FIELD OF APPLICATION

- **1.1** This document details the Vexil policy regarding the transition from ISO 14001:2004 to ISO 14001:2015. The policy is based on the accreditation board guidelines.
- **1.2** The policy shall apply to all clients holding accredited certificate to ISO 14001:2004 and applicants seeking certification of their Environmental Management System in accordance with ISO 14001:2015 by Vexil Business Process Services Pvt Ltd.
- 1.3 This policy shall remain current until 15 September 2018.

3. BACKGROUD

- **3.1** ISO 14001:2015 was published on the 15 September 2015.
- **3.2** ISO (International Organization for Standardization) and the IAF (International Accreditation Forum) have agreed on an implementation plan to ensure a smooth migration of accredited certification to ISO 14001:2015, after consultation with international groupings representing quality system or auditor certification bodies, and industry users of ISO 14001 certification services.
- **3.3** The new version will follow a new, higher level structure to make it easier to use in conjunction with other management system standards,

4. TRANSITION POLICY & IMPLEMENTATION

- **4.1** The International Accreditation Forum (IAF) and the ISO Committee on Conformity Assessment (CASCO) have agreed to a three year transition period from the publication date of ISO 14001:2015. During this period both ISO 14001:2004 and the revised version ISO 14001:2015 will co-exist.
- **4.2** Vexil BPS would be ready to carry out the assessments as per ISO 14001:2015 by 01 January 2016.
- **4.3** ISO 14001:2004 certifications will not be valid after three years from publication of ISO 14001:2015. This means that all the existing certificates to ISO 14001:2004 must be upgraded to ISO 14001:2015 by 15 September 2018.
- **4.4** The demonstration of conformity to ISO 14001:2015 may be through a special assessment, if needed.
- **4.5** All assessments, w.e.f. 16 September 2016 of certified clients shall be against ISO 14001:2015. This date would give more than a full year during which time all clients would undergo surveillance audits. However, any deviation from ISO 14001:2015 shall be given as Observations and not as nonconformities until 15 September 2017.
- **4.6** After 15 September 2017, all concerns against implementation of ISO 14001:2015 raised during the assessments, which have not been addressed by the client would be reviewed and classified as major / minor nonconformities and would be communicated to the clients for necessary action.
- **4.7** Any verification of corrective actions to nonconformities after 15 September 2017 may involve an on-site visit.
- **4.8** The expiry date of certifications to ISO 14001:2004 issued during the transition period shall be corresponding to the end of the three year transition period, that is, 15 September 2018.
- **4.9** All applications on or after 01 April 2017, would be accepted only as per ISO 14001:2015. Existing applications to ISO 14001:2004 shall stand closed or would have to be converted to ISO 14001:2015.
- **4.10** No fresh applications for Transfer of Certification from another certification body to ISO 14001:2004 shall be accepted by Vexil after 01 April 2017.
- **4.11** Two years after publication of ISO 14001:2015 (That is, effective 15 September 2017), all accredited certifications issued (new certifications or re-certifications) shall be to ISO 14001:2015.
