Austin College, a private national liberal arts college located north of Dallas in Sherman, Texas, has earned a reputation for excellence in academics, international study, pre-professional programs, leadership development, and hands-on adventurous learning opportunities. Its student body of 1,300-plus is diverse and united, representing 51% students of color.

Founded in 1849, the college is the oldest institution of higher education in Texas operating under its original name and charter. Today, its reputation has gained listing in every edition of *Colleges that Change Lives* since the book's introduction in 1996 by author Loren Pope. The latest edition says, "Anyone feeling disheartened by the state of the world, anyone wondering how we're going to yank our collective bootstraps and solve this century's most pervasive problems, should visit Austin College in northern Texas for a hefty dose of hope. There's plenty of optimism here, and rightly so. The curriculum pairs in-depth study of liberal arts and sciences ... with a focus on international study that's hard to find anywhere else. The result is a group of 1,350 students who are thinking carefully about what they can do right now and for the rest of their lives to make the world a better place. And they're thrilled."

BEYOND THE LAB: Austin College is #1 in Texas for highest percentage of majors in both physics and chemistry by percentage of total enrollment. Physics students and faculty serve as guides for public Star Parties held several times throughout the year at Adams Observatory, the largest research telescope in North Texas. Stargazing and much more are offered throughout the year in the College's state-of-the-art, LEED-Gold-Certified science building, the IDEA Center. Student researchers are discovering paths to treating cancer, new technology to clean up oil spills, and solutions to protect the environment. Visiting Speakers


GREAT THOUGHT LEADERS ON CAMPUS: Each year, prominent speakers visit campus for the Posey Leadership Award, Kenneth Street Law Symposium, Public Administration Symposium, Williams Executive-in-Residence lecture, and other programs, all free and open to the public. Notable leaders have included First Lady Barbara Bush, Colin Powell, Salman Khan, Pulitzer prize journalist Nicholas Kristof,



Marian Wright Edelman, and the entire Supreme Court of the State of Texas. In March 2018, Austin College will present the 13th annual Posey Leadership prize for global leadership to Barbara Pierce Bush, co-founder and CEO of Global Health Corps; she will speak on campus at a public convocation on April 3.

Community Connections

THE CENTER FOR COMMUNITY & REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT: Our students, faculty and staff help power the region's well-being. The campus Service Station connects students

with area agencies for over 16,500 volunteer hours each year in schools and nonprofits. In the past five years, student interns in Social Entrepreneurship for Poverty Alleviation (SEPA) have served 58 partner organizations and raised over \$700,000 in new grant money for area nonprofits Throughout the year, students are engaged in community projects in mental health, refugee resettlement, civic policy, arts advocacy, and wellness education.
