

How we have grown

 Philip Hines as representative of the Board of Directors, selected 24
 projects out of 44 applications
- Each project has between 1 and 3
 VINCI sponsors associated.
- The Local Co-ordinators, the Sponsors and the charities have been informed of whether they had been selected or not.
- The 24 successful projects are to **receive between £3,000 and £20,000** each.
- The **Partnership Agreements** of the successful projects have then beenbeen sent out and have all been signed.

Taking action against all forms of social exclusion

The Foundation supports projects that provide lasting solutions to social or employment integration difficulties experienced by some of the underprivileged in the community.

Encouraging initiatives

The Foundation encourages initiatives located as close as possible to the regions where VINCI is present. In order to adapt to local circumstances and encourage the social commitment of Group employees, the Foundation has created a European network. Today, there are 10 Foundations making a lasting commitment to fighting exclusion.

Support dual aid for project sponsors

The Foundation systematically provides support in two forms to the projects in which it participates: financial aid for investments and the skills of one or more Group employees.

Evaluating our impact

All the projects that receive the Foundation's support are monitored and assessed. The project managers and their VINCI sponsors conduct an annual review of their actions together. The Foundation sets objectives for each project to enable the measurement of its impact, especially in deprived neighbourhoods.



Prevention from peers

Understanding of grounds for suicide

PIPS is an organisation dedicated to saving lives and raising awareness of suicide and offering help to both those in crisis and to families who have suffered the loss of a loved one through suicide. The charity offers a unique service which entails a walk in support service to those who are at high risk of taking their own lives and in turn supporting their families through this traumatic time. They also provide training to various organisations staff on how to support someone who is suffering and in need. In case where

They have recently launched a new training programme, called HOPE. The guidance of their training team the young people will deliver this training to their peers in schools, youth clubs, sports clubs, etc. The main objective is to educate people and to everything to give them all the tools that will help them save a life and be able to signpost them to the best place for help to be given.

Powerchair Football Awareness

Giving everybody the chance to play sport at any level

St Georges Knights Powerchair FC provides people with physical disabilities access to sport in both competitive and leisure environment. The sport is open age, mixed gender, and helps to increase self-esteem and self-confidence in the

participants who can otherwise feel socially isolated. The sessions run every week at Meadoside Leisure Center and covers players from development and recreation level all the way to the national league level. The club is firmly established within the local community and has built up strong links with many local organisations, helping it to target people from a minority group and give everybody with a physical disability the chance to participate in sport. As affiliated with Staffordshire FA and The WFA (wheelchair football association), the club has teams competing in the national and regional leagues.

New state-of-the-art sports chairs

With the help of the VINCI UK Foundation, the group will be able to purchase two additional sports chairs. This upgrade will allow to enlarge the number of members of the club, providing members with the best opportunities. People with physical disabilities are the lowest represented in sport which is largely down to lack of information as many members felt there wasn't a sport they could do. This investment will contribute offering the club members a chance to escape social isolation, meet new people, and provide members with self-worth and an increase in self-confidence



Chestnut Tree House

Support for families dealing with their children's heath difficulties

Better facing illness-related difficulties

Chestnut Tree House is a children's hospice, providing specialist care and support to over 300 children and young people with life-shortening conditions and their families across Sussex and South East Hampshire. The hospice services are provided free of charge to all the families they support, and include services such as assessment, advice and information for babies, children and young adults with life-shortening conditions; specialist short breaks, emergency and end of life care; support for the entire family following diagnosis through the whole disease process.



A bright new minibus

With the help of the VINCI UK Foundation, Chestnut Tree House plans to purchase a new small minibus to replace an old one coming to the end of its usable life. The van will be used to take children out on trips while they are staying at the hospice. They need to have space for at least 5 people, including 2 wheelchair users and a level access tail lift and space for bulky equipment. The ideal model would enable staff to sit next to the child and young person using the wheelchair, so they can be monitored during the journey.



Help Reach One's Potential

Brainwave's mission is "for every child with a disability to reach their potential". The charity supports children with a wide ranging disabilities including genetic and acquired brain injury. It provides individual therapy sessions and provides a bespoke home based programme for parents. Each child returns to the centre for reassessments and is awarded certificates of achievement for every developmental milestone.



Stimulating The Senses

With the help of the VINCI UK Foundation, Brainwave has been able to set up a sensory integration room. New equipment will allow them to use activities designed to develop how the brain reacts to touch, sight, sound and movement. They will then introduce the majority of the children they see to these sensory experiences. Indeed, by changing how sensations are processed by the brain, children with autism and cognitive disorders may make better sense of the information they receive and use it better to participate in everyday tasks.

Ty Hafan is helping life-limited children and their families enjoy the best quality of life possible and make the most of the precious time they have together. The charity offers a short break care, emergency and end-of-life care to any child with a life-limiting condition, as well as offering the family bereavement support. This support and care is extended outside the hospice, into the community and the homes of these families. To date, the charity has supported 761 children both in the hospice and the community.

Lights for creating an Atmosphere

With the help of the VINVI UK Foundation, Ty Hafan will be able to help with developing the Memorial Garden and to adapt it to the needs of the families in care, transforming the area into a fully accessible space for the children and families who use the hospice. The charity

It provides five key services to achieve this mission: Fun Days out for disadvantaged groups to support them with happy memories throughout the year; Toy Boxes for child victims of domestic violence when relocated from refuge; the National Rotary KidsOut Day, provided annually to groups from special schools; World Stories, to help children communicate in the classroom and learn about different cultures; and Phyzzpod sensory rooms. The main aim of the charity is to rebuild relationships wihin the family home, often with the mother, who is often blamed by the child for the abuse even when she may also have been abused herself.

This will be an area (in addition and separate to the main training kitchen/café) which will include a staff kitchen, a wet room (i.e. a shower) and utility room where hospitality staff uniforms can be cleaned and dried.



Vulnerable people commited in changing things

Mustard Tree exists because of chronic poverty, extreme inequality and severe disadvantage in Greater Manchester and enables vulnerable people to become active members of their communities rather than be excluded by it through programmes to nurture creativity, art and employment skills. Mustard Tree also provides crisis support and caters for immediate physical needs including bedding, furniture, food and signposting to other services including medical care; but the focus has always been on sustainable solutions which remove barriers to a safer, more secure future.



Freedom

With the help of the VINCI UK Foundation, Mustard Tree will be able to set up "Freedom", a flagship programme providing a holistic package (typically over three months) designed to improve health and employability through advice on benefits, housing & bills, mental health support. 
The way to self-confidence

Pimlico opera is running a yearly theatrical production project based in a prison and is giving a chance to prisoners to see what they're capable of. They are offering an answer to the key reasons for re-offending and are working to change the perceptions of the public who see the performance, and to change the prison itself. The main aims of the charity are to alter the way prisoners view themselves but also how their families think about them, their attitudes towards each other, to offer employment chances after release...

A wider goal

With the help of the VINCI UK Foundation, Pimlico Opera will build a project based at HMP Bronzefield, Europe's largest women's prison which houses around 520 prisoners. Prisoners will be at the heart of a piece of musical theatre, as majority of the cast, with support of professionals, but will also achieve

sustainable goals, including addressing 6 to 9 causes of reoffending: education, employment, drug and alcohol misuse, attitudes and self-control, institutional action and life skills and family networks.

Offering human support

Maggie's offers free practical, emotional and social support to people with cancer and their families and friends in order to make them feel better, develop their confidence, resourcefulness, health and wellbeing. Help is offered freely to anyone with any type of cancer or in remission, who may feel anxious about coping with Cancer. Thus, empowering them to manage their disease and their future health. Learning how to cope with skin changes and hair loss, enabling people to feel good about themselves so that they can venture out into the community. They also visit schools and workplaces, teaching HR and teachers how to cope with children/employees suffering with cancer.

Thanks to well trained people

With the help of the VINCI UK Foundation, the charity has been able to train volunteers to go out into the community to seek out these people, which often don't look for this type of support. This pilot project is an opportunity for people living with and affected by Cancer to engage in 'drop in' emotional and psychological support, both facilitated and peer support groups, fitness and relaxations classes to increase their health and well being.

That is why they are open to all children between 0 to 12 with learning, physical or sensory disabilities or additional needs but also older children to encourage non-inclusive play.

Many of the people have a lack of qualifications, not maintained a consistent work folder, and face the disadvantage of having a criminal record.

With the help of the VINCI UK Foundation, HACRO will be able to provide a work-readiness course for offenders while serving all or part of their sentence in the community, enabling them to understand and express their potential and improve their job search skills, develop their CVs and understand employer expectations. HACRO recruits local employers who offer work placements, enabling ex-offenders to gain experience and develop their CV.

Serenity Farm offers day opportunities people with additional for needs and challenges to explore their skills working with animals and nature in an environment for people with learning disabilities or teenage children who are vulnerable, have difficult home lives, and are also at risk of sexual exploitation, being taken into care, or who are already in care. They also organise recreational activities away from the animals such as making wild animal feeders and houses, craft activities, educational sessions about the countryside and nature, themed activities around the seasons and celebration events.



At a pleasant place

With the help of the VINCI UK Foundation, the charity will be able to make the farm available to more people and to provide more activities. It wants to create a large sensory garden and toilet facilities. This will include a disability-friendly walkway, an orchard, raised beds for growing herbs and veg, polytunnels, shrubs and plants that attract wildlife, benches, bird-houses and feeders, a pergola and garden features.

The Walton Lea Partnership's mission is "releasing potential through growth" and operates 8 small-scale social enterprises to achieve learning and development via supported work to 67 learningdisabled adults who would otherwise suffer social-exclusion. Beneficiaries participate in horticulture, woodwork, floristry, recycling furniture, retail, craft work, bicycle repair and serving in their tea-room. Everything the beneficiaries make, repair, grow or sell, is sold to raise funds for the Charity.

The Café as a cornerstone

SYDNI is a community-based charity, created by local resident to offer their own community opportunities and support. The residents are from many different countries each with a much loved cultural background and language; includes Asian, Portuguese and Polish Communities. They provide facilities for information, recreation sport, education and leisure. The centre benefits to socially and financially disadvantaged people. The cafe which holds a 5 star health and hygiene rating, has been operating since the centre opened and is currently self-funding, any surpluses are re-invested in the centre and the services it provides.

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Needing refurbishment works

With the help of the VINCI UK Foundation, the charity will be able to allow sufficient work space for those working in the kitchen or visual contact with those working in the cafe itself. So the plan is to re-design the kitchen and the cafe bringing both up to the standards required by current demands and those that are likely to arise in the future. The charity wants to create more work and storage space in the kitchen, allowing better learning opportunities for more volunteers. They also want to introduce new food-related schemes such as teaching people how to make nutritional meals


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About the 2017 Edition
