Canterbury Cathedral is the Mother Church of the worldwide Anglican Communion and seat of the Archbishop of Canterbury. The Cathedral is both a holy place and part of a World Heritage Site which includes St Augustine's Abbey and St Martin's Church.

It remains one of the most visited places in the country, and, just as importantly, a working, living church and community.

As well as worship Canterbury Cathedral offers an exciting programme of arts and culture activities, events and concerts. It is widely regarded as a centre of excellence for music, traditional crafts, education and learning.



The Canterbury Journey

The Canterbury Journey is supported by the National Lottery Heritage Fund, The Friends of Canterbury Cathedral, other generous funders and community stakeholders. The project is addressing the urgent restoration needs of several key areas of the Cathedral to safeguard this important heritage for generations to come.

Fragments of the Cathedral's Past Brought Together to Tell its Story

This summer sees the opening of four new major exhibitions at Canterbury Cathedral made possible by the Cathedral's multimillion pound restoration and engagement project, The Canterbury Journey.

The exhibitions will include treasures from the Cathedral's collections, some seen for the first time. They include rare medieval textiles, beautifully illuminated manuscripts, stunning Elizabethan silver and Anglo Saxon objects. These are all fragments of the Cathedral's past, brought together to tell its story.

Through the carefully curated displays, visitors will explore the story of the Cathedral, from its origins to its continued importance today. They will consider the place of the Cathedral in the shaping of the history of England, through a selection of historic and internationally important objects.

Over the last two years, The Canterbury Journey team, along with the Cathedral's conservation and collections experts, have been working with interpretation consultants to design the exhibitions. Over 130 objects will displayed in the Cathedral's new Visitor Centre, the Crypt, the Water Tower and corridor, and in the Library Undercroft.

The Cathedral's conservators have been working with historians and scientists to better understand the Cathedral's collections. Extensive research has been undertaken, using non-invasive, cutting edge technology to unravel the secrets of the collections.



Graffiti in the Cathedral

Throughout the year our Volunteer Graffiti Researchers can be found in the Cathedral investigating and recording its historic graffiti. Volunteers are very happy to share what they have discovered so please do stop and talk to them to find out more about the fascinating marks made on this ancient monument. The volunteers are easy to spot in their blue and white tabards with Graffiti Research Project written on the back.

Daily Mini Talks

Covering a wide variety of topics, from Thomas Becket to Graffiti, Modern Art Installations to Cathedral Cats, there really is something for everyone.

Meeting point for the talks is in the south aisle of the Nave at quarter past the hour Monday-Saturday or 13.00 and 13.30 on Sundays. Talks are free but normal Precincts charges apply.

Audio Guides

Visitors can use the excellent audio guided tours, available in seven languages: English, Dutch, French, German, Spanish, Italian and Japanese. The main tour lasts 40 minutes with an optional section lasting another 20 minutes which covers the Great Cloister and Chapter House.

Audio guides are available from the kiosk in the Nave; adults £4pp, concessions £3pp, normal Precincts charges apply.

Guided Tour

Our expert guides make the Cathedral and its rich history come to life and a guided tour is highly recommended. Tickets are available from the Welcome Centre.
