

A Show Jumper or Advanced Event Horse as at 1st January in the current year is not eligible to compete in Working Hunter classes. The maximum total points available is 100. This is made up of: Jumping points = Max 40 points. Style & Presence whilst Jumping = Max 20 points. Ride/Manners = Max 20 points, Conformation = max 20 points. Fences to be a minimum of 8 and a maximum of 12 in number and a maximum height of 1.14m (3ft 9ins) at the discretion of the Judges. Fences should have a natural appearance and not be easily dislodged.

No un-numbered obstacle can be included in the course. The manner of going to be taken into account. No change of rider or tack will be allowed (unless a horse is ridden under side-saddle, in which case, in order to allow the judge to ride, the saddle may be changed for the riding phase only).

A rider can ride up to two horses in the jumping phase but then must select only one horse to take forward into the ride and conformation section if so required (no change of rider is allowed). A skull cap or hat and safety harness according to the current approved BSI or European Standard must be worn by ALL competitors in the jumping phase of Working Hunter Classes.

Skull caps must have a navy blue or black cover. No hind boots or bandages of any description are allowed in the collecting ring, warm up or in the actual class. On completion of the jumping phase ALL CLEAR ROUNDS and any other horses the judges may require should be asked to return to the ring. If a horse positively stops, ceases to go forwards at any time during its jumping round, or turns its quarters to a fence, or has a complete turnaround these constitute refusals.

If a horse jumps the incorrect fence out of a pen or lane it will be eliminated. Horses displaying continued disobedience, or horses leaving the ring whether mounted or dismounted will be eliminated.

The Thame Show organisers, its Officers, Servants and Officials will not accept responsibility for (a) Loss, damage, accident or injury sustained or occasioned by any person, or the property of such persons whilst entering on, or leaving the Association's premises, however caused, and any such person shall indemnify and hold harmless the Association from all claims, suits, legal proceedings, expenses, on account of any such loss, damage, accident, of injury. (b) Special Prizes offered by individuals, firms, or societies, in conjunction with the Prize List (c) Exhibits arriving too late for judging.

### 2. THE DECISION OF THE ORGANISERS

must be considered final in respect of all disputes, claims and protest; they reserve the right to refuse admission, refuse and cancel entries, cancel classes, withhold prizes, enforce penalties, appoint and substitute judges and report exhibitors to their particular Breed Society should occasion warrant so doing.

### 3. ENTRIES/EXHIBITS and EXHIBITORS

(a) Exhibitors are responsible for the good behaviour of their servants and animals whilst on the Association's premises, and must park their vehicles as instructed by the Show Officials; (b) Exhibits must be bona fide property of the exhibitor, and in case of 'RADIUS' classes must have been in the exhibitor's possession prior to 1st July 2017; (c) Entries must be made on the prescribed forms, duly signed and sent, together with remittance to cover fees in full to reach the Secretary prior to the closing date of entries as advertised in this Schedule. The Secretary shall have the sole right to refuse entries received without fees, or after closing date of entries; (d) FULL PARTICULARS OF PEDIGREE STOCK including name, colour, age, sex, dam and sire, must be given in CAPITAL LETTERS on the entry forms; (e) In the event of the death of an exhibitor during the period from the closing date of entries and the Show day, the executors of the deceased shall be considered to be the exhibitor; (f) Duplicate entries may only be made in certain classes so marked; (g) Unless otherwise stipulated all stock must be led and must exhibit the entry number; (h) No exhibit number shall be discarded on the Showground, and no rosette shall be worn during the judging except for Champion Prizes; (i) Each exhibitor shall be liable to pay the Association the sum of £500 for liquidated damages if his or her exhibit shall be found to be affected by a contagious or infectious disease likely to prove dangerous to other exhibits and for each exhibit a like amount; (1) Exhibitors who have been barred by any breed society shall not compete at this show; (j) Exhibitors shall prove correctness of entry form if called to do so by the Committee and should it be proved that an exhibitor shall have knowingly made a false entry or used unfair means of obtaining an award, the Committee may disqualify the exhibit and declare the award void, in which case the entry fee shall be forfeited. The Committee may bar such exhibitor from exhibiting at future shows of the Association at its sole discretion. (a) Made by exhibitors must submitted in writing to the Secretary's office on the Showground before 2.00 pm on show day or within 30 minutes after a Class has been judged if later than 2.00 pm, and a fee of £150.00 deposited, which will be refunded should the protest be sustained; (b) Protest as to weight or height shall be decided by the Vet, Chief Steward & Judge of the section concerned on the Showground;(c) Protest as to age or condition shall be registered as Reg. 6a and the exhibits in question examined by one of the Association's appointed Veterinary Surgeons on the Showground, who will make a written report on the OFFICIAL FORM regarding same; (d) Stewards dissatisfied with the bona fides of an exhibitor shall register a complaint on the OFFICIAL FORM, no fee being necessary; (e) protests will be heard by the General Committee at a meeting within one month of the Show

### 7. JUDGES

(a) The judge's decision in case of awards is final (b) Judges may withhold prizes if none of the exhibits are worthy of same (c) No judge may offer prizes other than which are shown in the official prize list (d) No person may address the judge whilst adjudicating unless requested to do so by him (e) any person disputing the judge's decision, or causing a disturbance or annoyance to the judge whilst adjudicating shall be removed from the ring or tent.

### 8. OTHER SOCIETY RULES

Where the Association shall hold a section or class under the rules of another body (such as the SHGB, CBS, SPSBS, VHS, BSS, FBS, DBS, SSA, TGCA, BSPS, CHAPS, , RL, TGCA, TSR, the rules of such body shall prevail.

### 9. PARKING.

All competitors' vehicles and conveyances must be parked in their allotted car parks.

### 0 REFLINDS

ONLY by producing a VETS certificate or Doctors certificate. Under NO circumstances will entry fees be refunded in the case of cancellation of entries by an exhibitor.

### 11 NO CLASSES WILL BE HELD UP

So please enter your classes accordingly.

### 12. JUDGES INTEREST IN ENTRIES.

Exhibitors are particularly requested to pay special attention to the name of the judge appointed in the classes they are entering, and not to knowingly enter an animal that has been OWNED or BRED by said judge. Where a judge has a continuing business or financial connection with an exhibitor he/she should NOT judge an animal entered by that exhibitor.

### 13. The show organisers reserves the right to refuse any entry.

### 14 HATS

Anyone riding a horse/pony anywhere on the showground MUST wear a hard hat to the standard required by the governing body under whose rules he/she is exhibiting.

### 15. PHONES.

Mobile phones are strictly forbidden whilst in the ring.

### JUDGES.

The show reserves the right to substitute/replace the publicised judge at short notice without notifying the exhibitors.

### 17. EQUINE PASSPORTS.

ALL equines MUST have a passport (England) regulation 2004, passports must be with said animal, and be available for inspection if required/requested. Exhibitors MUST comply with the current rules & regulations on Animal Gatherings & Movements in force at the time of the show according to DEFRA & BCMS requirements.

### 18. MOTOR VEHICLES.

ANY vehicle (including Quad Bikes & ATV's) must be driven with great care and a 5MPH speed limit MUST be observed on the showground.

### 19. STALLIONS.

ANY Stallion if required by their Breed Society/Governing Body to wear a Stallion disc on their bridle MUST do so, failure to do this WILL result in elimination.

### 20. SPURS.

Spurs may ONLY be worn by riders 16 years & over.

### NOTES

- Those submitting entries in the Horse Section are required to note that the undertaking on the entry form concerning freedom from infectious and contagious disease shall specifically include freedom from E.V.A.
- In all jumping competitions mounted competitors are required to wear correctly fastened protective headgear of an approved type.
