## S U P P ORTS

3 Stretched canvases $18^{\prime \prime} \times 24^{\prime \prime}$ or $20^{\prime \prime} \times 26^{\prime \prime}$.
Small, canvas board panels for sketching
No canvas pads. We will also use smaller supports for quick sketches - canvas boards \& canvas pads are OK for these, as is gessoed paper.

## B R U S HES

Two each \#2, \#4, \#6, \#8 Hog Bristle Filberts
One each \#10, \#12 Hog Bristle Filberts Filberts
One 3" House painter's brush (for toning support)
One or two Hog Bristle blending brushes are useful
Two or three small round Sables or Sable substitutes (for details)
Recommended: Sable substitute, Winsor/Newton Gallena Round \#182
Please check your existing brushes \& replace those which are at the end of their useful life, or are not filberts. Brushes are important, \& represent a good investment as they will last a very long time if cared for properly.

We will use one medium: Neo Megilp, by Gamblin.
An Equivalent gel medium is made by Daniel Smith.
