Bayley open gap

Sir John Bayley are now favourites to win their first ever Flowfit Shropshire Premier Bowling League title as they are 6 points clear with just 3 games remaining. They have enjoyed a super month with 8 winners at Wem USC and winning 8-6 at Newport, Newport's first loss in 91 home matches. This sandwiched a 12-2 home win over rivals Bowring as well as a 10-4 home win over Castlefields and 9-5 over St Georges. Chester Road now sit second, 6 points behind, after an alright month. They beat Hanwood 10-4 and Ifton 9-5 at home while getting 4 at Bowring and a great 7 at Burway, just missing out on the aggregate by 3 chalks. Castlefields are in third on 181 points after Castlefields enjoyed a promising month. whitewashed Hadley USC 14-0 as well as getting 6 at St Georges and beating Ifton 11-3 at home. St Georges are two points behind as they beat Bylet 13-1 and got 6 at Wrockwardine Wood, 5 at the Bayley and 4 at Meole Brace but only beating Castlefields 8-6 dented their title hopes. Meole look like their title hopes are over after falling to 5th place and 12 points behind the leaders. They didn't get the big win they needed after only winning 10-4 at home to St Georges and 9-5 at home to Hanwood, despite a good 6 at Wrockwardine Wood in between. Their 4 at Wem USC in the last game of the month dropped them out of contention.

Hanwood have enjoyed an excellent run to rise to their highest place of the season in 6th, level with Bowring. Hanwood enjoyed a whitewash over Bylet and a 13-1 home win over Hadley USC to extend their good home form, and 5 winners at rivals Meole and 4 at Chester Road meant this has been backed up. Bowring, fresh off their KGJ Insurance County Cup triumph, used their home games well to catch up with the pack after beating Burway and Ifton 11-3 and Chester Road 10-4. Ifton are down to 8th even though they had a good month, gaining 5 at Chester Road and beating Bylet 11-3 and Wem 10-4, but will still be looking for a top half finish. Burway's hope of a top half finish has diminished a little bit after a tough month. They started well with a 10-4 win at home to Wem and got a good 5 at Newport but only just beat Chester Road by 3 chalks and 5 winners, and then got 3 at Bowring. Newport are a point behind with a game in hand as their record 90 match unbeaten run at home ended by the Bayley. They beat Wem USC and Burway, but only 10-4 and 9-5, and got 3 winners at Bowring. Wem are in

11th place despite only getting 4 winners at home to the Bayley as they beat Meole Brace 10-4 and got 4 at Ifton and Newport. Wrockwardine Wood are 4 behind them with a game in hand after they had a good August. They won 10-4 at Hadley USC and enjoyed two 8-6 wins by 7 chalks at home to St Georges and Meole Brace. Bylet are still 9 clear of Hadley USC despite not having a home game and only getting 4 at Hadley and then 1 at St Georges and no winners at Hanwood. Hadley failed to take advantage as they got 1 at Hanwood and nothing at Castlefields, and losing at home to Wrockwardine Wood 10-4.

Bayley favourites despite tough run-in

Sir John Bayley are the favourites to win the league but do have a tough run-in. They take on Burway at home before travelling to 2nd placed Chester Road and then Ifton, so it may not be all over yet. But Chester Road themselves, 6 points off the pace, travel to Meole Brace next but then face bottom placed Hadley USC away last game of the season. Castlefields have a good run-in, visiting Wrockwardine Wood and Bylet, places they are capable of winning at, and playing Meole Brace at home in between. St Georges also have a good run with 2 out of 3 at home and Wem USC away who have had an indifferent season at home so they still have a chance. It is an interesting battle for a top half finish. The top five look set to be the top 5 but the remaining space for Pool A looks to be between Hanwood, Bowring and Ifton. Bowring play Ifton in week 25 but Ifton and Hanwood both have two home games, however Bowring visit Hadley USC next. Hadley know that they're in last chance saloon. But with 3 out of their 4 games at home some big wins could do it. But Bylet also have 3 at home, including Wrockwardine Wood and Wem USC.
