House and Senate Bills

- prohibition on the issuance of regulations calling for Title V permits for GHG emissions from biological processes associated with livestock production; and
- prohibition on issuance of a rule that includes mandatory reporting of GHG emissions from manure management.

House Bill

- prohibition of funding to enforce the “GHG Emissions and Fuel Efficiency Standards for Medium- and Heavy-duty Engines and Vehicles – Phase 2” with respect to trailers;
- prohibition on funds to implement the Social Cost of Carbon rule;
- prohibition on funding for action related to any rule or recommendation pursuant to Section 115 of the Clean Air Act; and
- prohibition on the use of funds for enforcing EPA’s methane rule

Provisions in final FY 2018 bill (H.R. 1625):

- prohibition on the issuance of regulations calling for Title V permits for GHG emissions from biological processes associated with livestock production; and
- prohibition on issuance of a rule that includes mandatory reporting of GHG emissions from manure management.
- Air emissions from animal waste at farms are not required to be reported under Section 103 of CERCLA
