# WHAT YOU CAN RECYCLE

(IN YOUR BLUE HOME RECYCLING BAGS)

# **PAPER**

Newspapers, magazines, catalogues, phone books, junk mail, cards, office paper, file folders, paper bags, paper egg cartons, hard and soft cover books.

## & CARDBOARD

Corrugated cardboard and boxboard (e.g. cereal, detergent, shoe boxes, etc.). Pizza boxes are acceptable ONLY if they do not have a large amount of food waste (i.e. cheese) attached to them.

## PLASTIC CONTAINERS AND BAGS

All bottles, food tubs and lids with the recycle number 1-7 (e.g. soft plastic, milk jugs, yogurt, shampoo, laundry detergent, bubble wrap, etc.). PLEASE RINSE AWAY LARGE FOOD PARTICLES BEFORE RECYCLING.

### **TAKE-OUT COFFEE CUPS**

Coffee cups and their plastic lids (e.g. Tim Horton's, Starbucks) are acceptable.

### **METAL**

Food and beverage containers, lids, caps, aluminum trays and foil. PLEASE RINSE AWAY LARGE FOOD PARTICLES BEFORE RECYCLING.

# WHAT YOU CANNOT RECYCLE

(IN YOUR BLUE HOME RECYCLING BAGS)

# NO FOOD SCRAPS OR ORGANIC (COMPOSTABLE) WASTE

Food scraps may contaminate and prevent recycling of an entire load. No grass clippings, garden, animal or human waste.

## NO STYROFOAM

Even if it has the recycling symbol it still isn't permitted.

### **S** NO SCRAP METAL

No fuel or propane tanks or automotive parts. Tanks could explode during handling. Take them to a scrap metal dealer. Only metal food cans, aluminum foil and food trays are permitted in the recycling program.

### MO INDUSTRIAL PLASTICS, AGRICULTURAL PLASTICS OR RUBBER

All other soft plastic bags and plastic film is now accepted.

### & GLASS

Bottles and jars (e.g. jam, pickle, beverages, etc.) must be dropped off at a recycling depot.
