Easter Opening is Huge Success

The Pool opened for the 2011 Season at midday on Thursday 21 April with sunny skies and an enticingly warm water temperature of 28°C. By 11.30am quite a queue had built up at the new entrance, at the head of which was an excited Troy Stevens, 11, from Stroud, with his mother, brother and sister. His mum told me that the family had enjoyed themselves so much at the Pool last season, they couldn't wait to come again. Although Stroud has its own Lido, it is not open until May and the water is unheated. Several other families had come from Bristol and Gloucester, with one lady originally from southern California telling me that the Pool reminded her of home!

The weather remained glorious over the whole Bank Holiday weekend, with swimmers and sunbathers flocking in every day. Attendance figures were: Thursday 609, Friday 563, Saturday 660, Sunday 325, Monday 637, in total a whopping 2794. Keep your fingers crossed that summer is as good as this wonderful spring.

Liam Fox Officially Declares Pool Open

Laster Monday saw the official opening of the Pool and the inauguration of the new Biomass Boiler by our local MP and Defence Secretary Liam Fox, who arrived shortly after midday. He was welcomed by a guard of honour from the Air Cadets, as well as Sally Chorlton, Vice Chair of the Trust and Julie Davenport, CEO of Good Energy who sponsored the boiler. They were escorted into the yard by Duncan Faulkes to see the boiler work-

ing, and then to the poolside where Dr Fox officially christened the boiler Tiger, the winning name in the children's competition, chosen by a young man called Willsy. Afterwards, Dr Fox mingled with the sixty guests, including Trustees, local councillors and volunteers. He told me how impressed he was by the Trust's achievements and said "If you want to see an example of the Big Society at work, come to Portishead where community spirit is strong and local determination can overcome problems, as epitomised in a project such as this swimming pool"



The Chairman of the Town Council, **Reyna Knight**, cut the ribbon to open the newly refurbished toddler pool and said "The Town Council was so pleased to be able to help with the donation to the toddler pool and we think it was money well spent. The other Councillors present—**David Pasley**, **Don Cameron**, **Ros** and **Martyn** Cruse were clearly delighted to see everything going so well and peo-

ple enjoying themselves. Many other pool users said how much they liked the toddler pool and volunteer **Jean Jelley**, who has worked at the Pool for many years, commented that she had never seen it so well used and that the walk-in slope was much more attractive for little ones.

I am a Black belt so if anyone tinkers with 'Tiger', I know what to do!


Brenda Birkinshaw—Trustee

Recycling our Wood Ash

I id you know there are lots of uses for wood ash around the house and garden? Check some of them out on This Old House website. You can add it to your garden compost in small amounts and spread it around your fruit bushes in the spring. The Royal Horticultural Society also have some good advice on their website.

If you would like some wood ash from Tiger, our biomass boiler, bring a suitable container (eg an old compost bag or plastic bucket with lid) down to the Pool during opening hours and our Duty Managers will be happy to fill it for you. The ash is purely from wood and there are no harmful additives.

Season tickets

Including those for whom we are still waiting on photos (Nudge! Nudge!) we passed the 200 mark before the end of April, which is more than the season total for either 2009 or 2010. They are still great value for regular swimmers even up to the end of May. Just a reminder – you do not need expensive photos – home printed are fine, so long as they are roughly passport size.

Break-in at Restaurant

In the early hours on Sunday 17 April, police attended a breakin at the Pool cafe/restaurant. The intruder had entered the premises through a broken window and an empty petrol can was found at the scene.


Volunteers Meeting

Pool Temperatures

he chart shows temperatures for the start of the season. The Portishead solar index is an indication of relative solar radiation in Portishead and therefore is a measure of sunshine. So far the water temperature has been very consistent and the weather generally sunny, with a couple of less sunny days on the weekend of 30 April/1 May.

The lifeguards are also regularly measuring water quality and, on 26th April, the pool could not be opened until 2pm due to a power failure stopping water treatment. We apologise, but `safety first".
