New Client, New Work Stream

Jones Building Group has been given a unique opportunity to work with an innovative organisation within the Bristol area. The organisation was founded when two Bristol based housing associations (Bristol Community Housing Foundation and United Housing Association) joined forces to form United Communities. This well established partnership jointly manages 1,800 homes across the Bristol and Swindon areas. Their main aim is to generate affordable shared ownership housing, a new idea originally thought up by Boris Johnson Mayor of London.

JBG went through an extensive tendering process, up against strong competition, in order to be part of this rare opportunity. We are pleased to say that we have successfully been awarded a project at 325 Fishponds Road. This project involves the renovation of an existing school building into six 1 bedroom duplex apartments, and six 2-3 bedroom town houses worth £1.6 million. All being well on the funding side, United Communities will have the first ever project of this type up and running before Christmas with JBG being the main contractor.



For the group, this will be a first with stage completing, and assisting the shared owners with completing their element of the work.

United Communities are already looking at two other sites and are interested in forming a working relationship with a contractor to carry out this work.

These projects will come under Nick Hewitt's major projects department. A big well done to Nick for working with United Communities and getting JBG this far.

All in all, it's been a great first year for the Contracts Division, with works having been successfully completed for clients dry stacked with no such as St Luke's Hospice, Cornwall Council (Newquay Airport), mortar except for the Devon County Council, University of Exeter, Petroc College in

Tiverton and Trowers and Hamlin, to date. We are presently working on the new Day Care Centre in Honiton for Hospiscare, a new build SLDD unit for Petroc College in Tiverton, 9 room dementia care extension to Rose Lodge Care Home in Exmouth, construction of an Ice Plant in Sutton Harbour, Plymouth and two contracts at the University of Exeter in Northcote House, all of which will be completed by January 2015.

We have also been appointed as preferred bidder for the construction of four industrial units at Webbers Yard in Dartington,

for the Dartington Hall Trust and the GAIA Spa and Fitness development at Boringdon Hall Hotel in Plympton, both of which are due to start in January 2015.

One further project that we have been appointed on is the design and build of a Artists impression of Boringdon Hall Hotel new Community Centre in



Broadhembury, which again is due to commence in January.

As you can imagine, delivering the above projects takes a lot of effort from a lot of people throughout the Group, and I would like to thank everyone for their continued efforts throughout the year, and their assistance in securing a near full workload for 2015 – Keep up the good work!

Hospicare — New Day Care Centre

Durisol blocks are an ECO block which are made of recycled timber, cement and latex slurry. They are



first course which needs it to level them. The blocks have two compartments, one is filled with recycled insulation and the other is filled with concrete. You start building with reinforcing bars which are drilled into the foundations projecting through the hollow section of the block, you then tie horizontal laser bars to these as you build up. We found them to be guite a challenge as there are three building elements involved, bricklaying, steel fixing, and shuttering carpentry. So the team we had to put together, had to have knowledge and skills in each of these trades. Because we were also building the gables out of Durisol, it was very important to make sure that scaffolding was correct, for safe access when pouring the concrete. We soon found out that after the initial first six courses that there would need to be a lot more propping and strutting involved. So the higher we went the more shuttering there was. Despite the leaning curve involved we managed to keep within the program that Nigel and Dave Indge had worked out, and we are now putting the roof on.

2014 started with some of the worst storms we had seen for decades in the UK, and this led to a dramatic increase in work throughout the region, as it highlighted many issues in ageing housing

stock. Yarlington, Keepmoat and Ian Williams are three large contracts we have been working on this year to upgrade the roofs for years to come.

We have been working hard on re-roofing 90 properties in the Yeovil district for Yarlington, and are working well to a tight programme that is due to finish in February.

Our favourite customer satisfaction survey came from a Yarlington resident, Elizabeth Willetts in Yeovil, who wrote 'the workmen were very good, kept the place clean and tidy, job well done, thank you'.

Looking forward in to 2015, we are working hard to ensure that we are up to speed with the most significant change to the way roofs are fixed in the UK for years. BS5534 the British Standard for slating and tiling is being amended in March to dictate that every tile will now have to be mechanically fixed in the face of increasing extreme weather events. Anticipation is that this change will all but end the outdated practice of mortar bedding such roofing components, as ridge and hip tiles, moving instead to dry fix systems throughout.

Davey roofing continue to work with CG Frys on quality projects including Poundbury, Bradninch, Whimple and Weymouth.

New build also continues to thrive across the region with recent contracts undertaken for Brookvale Homes, Zero C, Winsley White and E G Carter.

Davey Roofing is aiming to improve road safety, reduce insurance costs/fuel usage, and enhance duty of care, following the purchase of 3 new Citroen vans to be seen shortly across the South West.
