



Developing the team

The work has continued to develop and we now have a team of 6 counselling volunteers with a good blend of experience and qualifications very ably supervised by Angela Watt. We have continued to invest in our people with assistance provided to gain Level 3 counselling qualifications and pregnancy loss training.

Training

We have broadened the knowledge base by part funding a course in infant loss for 4 counselling volunteers. Our aim is to ensure our counselling volunteers provide a professional caring service and are equipped and able to respond to the needs of our clients.

Thanks to all the counselling team for the difference they are making to the lives of vulnerable people.

Schools' Work

Who we saw

In the current academic year we are taking around fifty 1 hour sessions in 5 local schools. That is approximately 1250 pupils who will have been helped to make informed decisions and choices in the future.



Income

Whilst regular donations have reduced over the year, our grant income from charitable trusts and community funds increased by nearly £10,000. This enabled us to complete the refurbishment of the Centre, provide support towards the training costs of some of our counselling volunteers and temporarily increase the hours of the Centre Manager.

We were delighted recently to host the annual Regional Day for similar pregnancy counselling charities



in West Sussex. It was great to meet up with fellow trustees, schools workers, Centre Managers and counselling volunteers and exchange ideas – it is important to encourage and learn from each other recognising we are not alone in this chosen field of service.



Flections

There have been 4 trustees over the last year – my co-trustees being Mary Parish, Patrick Woodward and Wendy Marshall and we also have the support of Acorn's Advisory GP Dr Becky Richards. We are delighted to put forward Steph Spanner as a new trustee at the AGM with myself and Patrick standing for re-election as well.

What we do

The trustees meet formally at least 4 times a year although given that the role involves both governance and operational matters there is a regular weekly stream of e-mails. We have tackled many different matters over the year including the development and approval of several policies.

Training and development

We have attended a number of external events and courses in particular run by Community Works and Voluntary Action Worthing. We recognise the importance of training and peer engagement at trustee level to ensure good governance. We are now registered with the Fundraising Regulator and a member of the National Council of Voluntary Organisations.

The Future

What of next year?

The core work will remain the same – provision of pregnancy counselling services and relationships education in schools. We hope that with the increased strength of the team that we can see more clients and visit more schools. We will seek to maintain the high quality standards and reputation established over many years.

On the move?

In 2019 the lease of our premises comes to an end and the trustees will need to consider whether to seek to renew this or move to alternative premises. We need to ensure the facilities used by our clients are entirely appropriate for their needs. We are happy to receive any comments or suggestions.

Staying accessible

Effective communication of the existence of our service is essential so that more people are able to access it. That will mean continuing to maintain good relationships with health professionals but also seeking better use of social media and digital communication.

Encouraging individual supporters

Just less than 60% of our core expenditure is covered by regular donations with the remainder through one off gifts and fundraising. We need to increase the number of people committed to the work of Acorn through prayer and regular giving.

Recruiting and expanding

With just one part time employee, Acorn survives and will continue to develop and grow due to the commitment of its volunteers. As there has been over the last year there is bound to be change over the next and we must continue to seek the involvement of more counselling volunteers, receptionists, prayer warriors, schools workers, fundraisers, office workers, cleaners, trustees and anyone else who wants to get involved in a small charity that has a big impact on people's lives.
