There was a change in the policing model here in Dundee in October 2016. Our focus is on providing a more direct community style of policing which will allow us to engage with communities and partners. To achieve this we have 4 dedicated community Sergeants across the City who have responsibility for their relative Multi Member Ward areas. We have fewer community officers but these officers will be dedicated to working with partners to resolve community issues.

Sgt Lesley Mann is the new Community Sergeant based at Downfield Police Office who has responsibility for the Strathmartine area. Lesley and her team of dedicated officers have been working closely with communities and partners to address local issues and to work in partnership to improve the local communities and to ensure we are doing all we can to keep people safe and reduce offending.

Ardler Community Resilience Fund

The Ardler Community Resilience Fund is a small grants fund for projects to alleviate the effects of austerity and welfare reform in the Ardler area. The fund is supported by the Scottish Government via Development Trust Association Scotland and Scottish Community Alliance. Ardler Village Trust is administering the fund in Ardler.

Projects should be able to show that they

- promote social inclusion within Ardler
- support community development within Ardler
- relieve poverty among the residents of Ardler
- promote health education and assist in the relief of ill health among the residents of Ardler

The maximum grant available is £500. The fund is intended to support small scale projects and will not provide on-going funds for general running costs.

To be eligible to apply you must be a local community group or organisation based in Ardler and/or work with and provide benefit to the residents of Ardler. Applications will only be accepted from non-profit distributing organisations. Public sector organisations, private businesses and individuals are not eligible.

There are no application deadlines. Applications will be dealt with on a first come first served basis. All applications will be assessed by the Ardler Village Trust Manager and the Ardler Village Trust Core Group. You will hear back within 4 weeks of your application being received by us if your application has been successful. Please note all projects must be completed by 31 January 2018.
