It is probably principally associated with "hard bop" and stellar musicians such as Sidney Bechet, Dizzy Gillespie, Charlie Parker, Horace Silver, Freddie Hubbard, Lee Morgan, Art Blakey and so on. Wayne Shorter. The list is endless. Tonight's "stellar line-up" will be Martin Eaton (tenor saxophone), Chris Cooper (piano), Andy Doyle (bass) and Robert Masters (drums).


