

Summer Wildcat Cabin non-catered Packing List & Info

First and Second layer hiking clothes - tops (short and long sleeve) and bottoms	Small day pack
Rain gear: waterproof jacket with hood, waterproof pants & a small umbrella	Full first aid kit including good blister care package and emergency medications
Warm jacket	Sunglasses, sunscreen cream and insect repellant
Wind shell: jacket and pants	Water bottle and/or thermos
Hiking socks	Pocket knife
Hiking boots: leather with good support are preferable	Flashlight: small with extra batteries (for night use)
Gloves, lightweight	Personal toiletries kit & medications
Gaiters (optional but useful)	Camera and battery charger

About the WildCat Cabin

Expect to encounter a wide variety of weather conditions (often within the same day) and select clothing that can be layered accordingly. The cabin is solid, bright and comfortable so dress inside can be light and informal.

There is a washroom with cold running water and a night potty in the cabin. The outhouse is not far away! We also have a wood heated sauna/shower/bath house, which we fire up every afternoon before dinner. All kitchen linen and bed linens are provided as well as toilet paper and cleaning supplies. You may prefer to bring your own bath soap and shampoo, as well as a swimsuit for the sauna. Yes bring your camera battery chargers, we have a small hydro system and solar panels that will charge batteries and run the lights. We regret that our electrical system doesn't have the sufficient capacity to operate hair dryers.

In the kitchen; small propane stove & oven, small propane refrigerator, cold running water, wood stove for heating the building (please do not cook on the wood stove). All eating, cooking, drink ware, bowls, plates and cutlery are available as well as salt and pepper, coffee sugar, and dish soap.



Space and Weight Limits

Space in the helicopter is limited. Please limit the weight of your extra gear and clothing to <u>30 lbs.</u> and avoid the use of rigid luggage such as suitcases or frame packs. They are difficult to pack into the rounded baggage compartments. A small, soft duffel bag and a daypack are recommended. Food can be packed in up to one box per person no bigger than 14X12X20 and 40lbs each, of course the smaller and lighter the better. These guideline may change depending on length of stay and guest numbers.

We have a simple pre-flight weigh-in procedure at the hangar. This involves weighing each piece of luggage followed by weighing each group of passengers. Once we know these weights we gain the considerable advantage of being able to optimize the load on each flight into the lodge. We can also determine baggage weights in excess of our allotted 30 pounds per person (plus food) and will ask all those with overweight luggage to leave it behind.

Scheduled Times

Alpine Helicopters Ltd provides air transportation to the lodge. The machine we usually use is a Bell 407, which carries six passengers and their luggage. All groups meet at 8:45 Mountain (Alberta) time at the Alpine Helicopter hangar at the Golden Airport. At the end of your stay, all guests will normally be back at Alpine Helicopters hangar in Golden between noon and 1 p.m.; but delays due to inclement weather are possible and we strongly advise you not to book connecting airline flights for the same day. Allow at least four hours for the winter drive from Golden to the Calgary Airport.

Safety Considerations

Backcountry hiking, rock climbing and mountaineering are wilderness experiences influenced to a great degree on terrain and weather conditions. We have no control over these conditions and reliable prediction of them is impossible. Inherent in any wilderness activity are risks and dangers that are beyond our control, which you must be prepared to share with us.

YOU WILL BE REQUIRED TO SIGN THE WAIVER IN THE PRESENCE OF A MISTAYA LODGE EMPLOYEE PRIOR TO YOUR DEPARTURE TO THE LODGE. **BY SIGNING THIS CONTRACT YOU GIVE UP YOUR RIGHT TO SUE MISTAYA ALPINE TOURS, THE PROVINCE OF BRITISH COLUMBIA AND ALPINE HELICOPTERS LTD.** PLEASE CONTACT US IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS.

In the event that evacuation is necessary, payment of helicopter costs will be the responsibility of the individual involved. We recommend that you consider purchasing hospitalization and ambulance transportation insurance prior to your trip and be certain that your coverage is adequate. This is particularly important for those traveling from outside of Canada. Additional coverage can be purchased through your travel agent.



Other Helpful Information

Gratuities are not included in the package price. We are often asked for guidelines regarding customary amounts. Over the past few years, tips have typically averaged 10% of your package price. We are unable to process credit card transactions at the lodge so you may want to bring cash with you to the lodge for personal purchases.

We have three-color topographic maps of the Wildcat Creek Basin. These maps clearly depict trails, routes, creeks, lakes, glaciers and landforms. The cost of these maps is \$3.00 printed on waterproof paper.
