Honeybourne Parish Council News

Pavilion Cleaner Wanted

A professional cleaner who can be contracted to attend to all pavilion cleaning matters will be needed to start in the early spring, anyone interested, please contact the Parish Clerk.

Neighbourhood Development Plan: NDP

It was reported to the Council that the plan is progressing very slowly, and the lack of parishioner support is causing the data collecting to be very tedious and protracted. It's your Neighbourhood Parish Plan. Honeybourne is your Village. Please get involved in its future development and join the plan steering group.

Street Naming

Following the council's decision to name the new development of five bungalows off Stratford Road as St Ecgwins Close the developer objected the proposal on the basis of the prestige of the development and requested an alternative name be offered. It was subsequently agreed that the street name for the development can be St Ecgwins Gardens.

High Street Kiosk

A generous donation of £100 has been received from a parishioner for cleaning up the kiosk. Funded by this donation the village handyman will carry out extensive cleaning both inside and outside and to remove any telecom equipment. A new display board will be fitted in the back of the Kiosk for displaying parish information.

New Car Park for the Station

Cllr Alastair Adams confirmed that Wychavon District Council has purchased land for the new Network Rail car park at Honeybourne station. He also confirmed parking charges will possibly apply.

Community Centre on track for starting

The Village Hall and Community Centre committee have secured a lottery grant of £400k for the construction of the new Community Centre on Weston Road. The build cost is estimated to be £800k which will hopefully be funded by the lottery, the sale of the old Village Hall site, a public works loan via the Parish Council and the New Homes Bonus fund from WDC. The site for the Community Centre has now been transferred to the Parish Council from Taylor Wimpey and a planning application will be lodged very shortly. It's the aspiration of the Village Hall committee to start the construction by the summer hopefully completed by the early spring of 2019

New Homes Bonus Questionnaire:

The New Homes Bonus questionnaire delivered with the village newsletter is to gain the opinion of the community on the expenditure of the New Homes Bonus funding. The parish council's preferred option is for the entire fund of £63K to be allocated to the Community Centre building funding as this amount has been factored into the

existing funding programme. To enable the funds to be released, the District Council requires the community is fully consulted and a majority of parishioner are supportive of the allocation of the fund to a particular project. Please return your questionnaire via special post boxes placed at various locations in the parish or email it to the Parish Clerk

The Parish Council meets on the 2nd Tuesday of each month. Members of the public are welcome to attend meetings, which are held in the Village Hall and commence at 7.15 pm. Residents are welcome to speak on any issue of local concern during the Open Forum before the start of the meeting.



A 5.5-Mile Walk with wonderful views

Sturdy shoes or boots are recommended. This route is clearly signed (signposts and waymarkers) Pets should be kept on leads at all times.

The walk starts at the Gate Inn. Adjacent to the pub car park is the footpath to the Church. Follow this path through two fields and into the churchyard. Keep to the left-hand edge and exit at the kissing gate. Follow the road round to the right until you arrive at the T-junction at the cemetery. Opposite you will see a stile in the right-hand corner near to the cemetery fence. Over this stile and another stile into the main field where you will follow the hedge on your left-hand side until you arrive at the stile onto the Mickleton Road. TAKE GREAT CARE when crossing this road.

Over the next stile into the field. Do not follow the direction of the signpost as this is incorrect, but head towards the railway bridge in the far left corner of this field. Over another stile and out onto Stratford Road. Turn right and, TAKING GREAT CARE, walk (facing the oncoming traffic) under the two railway bridges.

Immediately after the second bridge turn right onto the bridleway. Pass by the cattle grid and follow the tarmac surface to a large field gate. Pass through and follow the track up the hill. When you get to the footpath signpost at the top of the hill, turn around to admire the view – a lovely spot for a picnic (but remember to take your litter home with you!). You will see Honeybourne church below, and sweeping views including (from the left) Cutsdean Hill (305 m high), Oxenton Hill (223m), Dumbleton Hill (168m), Forest of Dean (up to 290m) with the Black Mountains (up to 886 m) behind, Bredon Hill (299 m) and the Malvern Hills (up to 425 m high).

Turn left and follow the footpath sign along the top of the hill with the fence on your right-hand side (hedge on left), you will pass through two large fields before passing a large barn and arriving at the Pebworth Road near the top of Baylis's Hill. Look over your right shoulder to see Meon Hill. TAKE GREAT CARE to cross the road and pass through the field gate. This is not a right of way, but you have permission to pass through on this walk *. Walk along the stone track to the left-hand corner of this field, then turn right with the hedge on your left and head towards the metal gate; and then on to a stile in the far left-hand corner of this field.

Step over the stile and ditch bridge; cross the driveway, and look for a wooden ditch bridge near the left-hand hedge, then straight-ahead until you reach a ditch bridge leading onto a stile into the next field. Over the stile and straight-ahead to the next stile on the opposite side of the field. Over the stile, then straight ahead to the next stile (to the left of the track). Over this stile then walk straight-ahead with the hedge on your right until you meet a small metal frame that you should take care to climb over. Continue in the same direction until you meet another stile leading onto the road. Turn right and follow the highway for 200 meters to the church. Enjoy a stroll around the grounds before retracing your steps back to Honeybourne.

We hope you have enjoyed your walk today, and that we have whetted your appetite for a variety of future walks in and around the Parish of Honeybourne.

Letter from the Vicar

"Everything I do, I do it for you."

In 1991, just before I was married, the film, 'Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves' was released. I went to see it in Cambridge with my Best Man. Whilst the film wasn't especially memorable, the theme music, composed and sung by Bryan Adams, was – 'Everything I do, I do it for you.'

We're now in the Season of Lent. This is a time when Christians prepare themselves, by prayer and fasting, for the great celebration of Easter and of Christ's victory over sin and death. More than that, it is a time to look honestly and openly at our lives, finding those places where we have shut out God and inviting Him in, to transform those dark places (which we all have) with his marvelous and glorious light. Some people choose to give something up for the 40 days of Lent but, more and more, through initiatives such as '40 Acts' (www.40acts.org.uk), we're being encouraged to do an act of kindness or generosity on each day during Lent. I think this is a great idea. What we do doesn't have to be complicated. It could be as simple as saying "thank you" to someone who helps us, visiting a housebound neighbour or, as I said recently in an assembly at Honeybourne School, talking to the person on their own in the playground. Age is no barrier to acts of kindness!

For many, Lent generates, consciously or subconsciously, a lot of questions, the most significant one being, "Why did Jesus have to die?" The answer to that question is, on the one hand, profound and, on the other, straightforward: Jesus Christ went to the cross for you, for me and for the whole of God's creation, to restore our relationship with God, which had broken down because of sin. On the cross, all our sins – past, present and future – were dealt with once and for all. The words of Bryan Adams' song, might have been spoken by Christ himself

:"Everything I do, I do it for you."

Christ's death is a wonderful, life-changing, world-changing moment in history like no other. And yet still questions remain about God, about life and its meaning and about Jesus Christ and his relevance in 2018.

We want to give you a space to explore some of those questions and so, on **9 April**, we're going to start something called 'The Y Course' (www.ycourse.com). This eight-week course is aimed at those with questions. You need no knowledge of the Bible, Christianity or the Church – and there are no prayers and no hymn singing! In its own words, the Y Course is, "Cringe free. Totally relevant. Cynic friendly." Ken Spensley, who attends St Peter's Church in Willersey, and I, will be leading the course. We'll meet at **7pm in The Thatched Tavern** in Honeybourne. We'd love you to join us. No need to let us know if you're coming – just turn up. Over a pint, and in a relaxed atmosphere, we can look together at those Big Questions that you've always had but never been able to ask.

In the meantime, I hope that, during this Season of Lent, you will know for the first time, or know again, how loved you are by God's Son, Jesus Christ. On the cross, everything he did, he did for you.

Litter Picks

Does Honeybourne want to organise a community litter pick? Or are there volunteers / residents that want equipment to help litter pick? If so, WDC have agreed to supply litter pickers (standard size, & extra long for ditches), gloves, bags and high vis jackets free of charge. They will also collect the rubbish that is collected. If so, contact me.

Council Tax 2018/19

Your local tax demand is made up of five different bodies; the County Council, the District Council, the Parish Council, the Police, and the Fire & Rescue Services. Each of these can decide their own increase so when you get you council tax demand in March 2018, you will see the breakdown between these organisations.

Planning

- 1. Planning Application 17/02263/FUL Land At Perrie Drive, Honeybourne for 9 new dwellings Although the public consultation on this application has closed, the decision has not yet been made, so you may still have time to object to it. You can write your comments on the planning portal https://plan.wychavon.gov.uk/ and type in the reference 17/02263. I strongly oppose this application as it will remove the green open space that has been used by residents for many years. I am pleased to see so many residents have already written into oppose this application, but the more the better. Please help protect our open spaces by opposing this application.
- 2. Planning Application 17/02147/OU Land of High Street Honeybourne to remove compliance with conditions 19 and 21 I spoke at last month's Planning Committee meeting to oppose these changes but the committee over-ruled me, and approved this change. Hopefully the contractors will not jeopardise the safety of local residents when they start work on site.

Highways

- 1. Stratford Rd Highways have confirmed they are patching/re-tarmacking footways and the entrance into shop car park in February
- 2. Under the railway bridges towards Pebworth temporary road closure for C2049 Stratford Road, Honeybourne for Network Rail in order to facilitate bridgeworks to bridge parapet for approx. five nights (23:00hrs 06:00hrs) 23rd April 27th April 2018.
- 3. Pedestrian crossing in Honeybourne on Station Rd. I have asked Highways to look at installing a pedestrian crossing in Station Rd near the footpath exit from Westbourne and near the junction with Shepherds Walk where the kerb stones are already dropped. This is a long term project as funds need to be found to build it, but I do think it will be a welcome addition to the village.
- 4. Road over Honeybourne Station Bridge. A proposal to extend the length of carriageway narrowed to one lane by approx. 20m is being considered by Highways to protect the road edge on the embankment which has been recently repaired.

Also remember a photo of the Highways problem is as good as "a thousand words" so always take a photo where possible.


