

The Kings School, Ely required a solution that could support the MFL department. A key criterion was that any purchase had to easily integrate with their existing ICT infrastructure and provide a flexible learning environment. As is the case across many schools, teachers were actively seeking to engage students and improve student performance in oral work; SANAKO Study 1200 offered a range of tools to assist teachers in reaching this objective.

The Kings School, Ely is not averse to technology and after several funding bids, a new Head of Languages in place and the recognition and support from the school Head that investing in a language lab would be a facility worth having, the school book room was identified as a location, split in two, and then one half surrendered to make way for a language lab - at last the school was on its way!

Steve Dunlin's, Network Manager at The Kings School, Ely main focus was 'That of the technology in which the solution is built on, it had to be network based and offer flexibility.'

Naturally, the Network Manager and language staff reviewed a range of alternatives and ultimately made the decision to choose SANAKO Study 1200. Mr Dunlin chose to use laptops, because space (as always) was a major consideration to the school. They also had the added benefit of being cheaper than a desktop.

As for the installation, Steve believed that 'it was all very thorough, with pre-checks done on the laptops to make sure they met the hardware specifications required. This was followed by the software installation which went smoothly and we had a working system up and running within a day.'


The Linguists Perspective

Esmeralda Salgado is Head of Spanish and an experienced teacher and user of the software language lab, SANAKO Study 1200. Ms Salgado states 'that the language lab has revolutionised the way we teach and students learn a language within just a term of using it. This piece of software can be as simple or as elaborate as the teacher chooses and, that is, in my opinion, one of the great benefits of this solution.'

As you would expect from such innovative software a range of tools are available to the teacher which can assist in motivating and engaging the students.

Differentiated Learning

SANAKO Study 1200 encompasses all the basic functions that you would expect from a Language Laboratory, such as the pair-work facility or the ability to individually listen to mp3 files, immediately boosting self-confidence and independent learning of students. In addition, teachers can also listen to individual students and co-operate with them for advice if necessary. More importantly, students can be placed in different groups, who, consequently, can be working on different files, levels, or even different languages!

High Technology from Finland

Ms Salgado describes that 'one of the most innovative features, of SANAKO Study 1200, is the fact that we can launch any type of file to the students: mp3, mpeg, PowerPoint or Word! This simple feature means that students can now work on two documents simultaneously: a video with a word document to write answers on, or a Powerpoint game template which will require some oral input from the students, which can then be recorded and saved using the SANAKO player.'

Improving Student Confidence

Within SANKO Study 1200, "Voice Insert" enables users to create a pause within any mp3 or mpeg file for a student to record a response. The Kings School uses this feature, very successfully to practice questions and answer style exercises or role-plays.

Ms Salgado states 'video files are particularly effective when used together with this "Voice Insert" feature.' Teachers can use a video file and set up bookmarks with questions or simple instructions in strategic timed parts of the file, for example: What do you think about this idea? Traditionally, students would have stopped the file at this point and write down their answer.

However as Ms Salgado highlights, 'using Voice Insert, our pupils can now give the answer to this question in the Target Language, orally, and this software will then play the video with the students input. Using simple video files, pupils can be requested to guess what the speaker will say next and play back their answers. This, in my opinion, places language lessons and individual learning into a different league. Voice Insert can also be used by us, the teachers, to provide feedback to students about individual presentations, dialogues etc...'

An Integrated Solution

The School also use Task Magic activities linked the language lab: the students can play flashcard games by giving an oral input to an image, sentence etc... And record their contribution. Ms Salgado points out that 'this simple exercise can be adapted to different levels by asking some students just to say the name of a picture, or say the name of the picture within a sentence in the present tense, or within a sentence in the present and past tense while extending their answers!'

The Kings School, has found that the possibilities are massive depending on the teachers' imagination and boldness. Similarly, the benefits of exploiting real, authentic materials in a meaningful and yet independent way are extraordinary and will put, for the first time, not only the teaching, but also the learning of MFL well into the 21st Century.
