Here are the five ways cloud computing could damage your business:

- 1. The possible points of failure are out of your control: The beauty of cloud computing is that you hand over all the hassle of supplying and updating applications to someone else. But loss of direct control has a price. If something goes wrong you are relying on someone else's sense of urgency to get it fixed. The upside to this is that when cloud-based apps go down, they tend to affect all users, giving the providers an enormous incentive to get things fixed quickly.
- 2. **You might not have a service level agreement (SLA):** Some businesses like the peace of mind provided by an agreement. They are not always provided by cloud app providers –











but as I said above, when your entire business is delivered through a website, you move mountains to get it back up and running again when something is wrong.

- 3. Your access to information is controlled by your internet connection: Many businesses say they could not run without an internet connection. When all your data is in the cloud and is accessed through your internet browser, this is especially true. Lose the net and you lose access to your information. The upside of this is that if you lose the ability to access your premises, for example, your staff can work from home using the applications they use at work but on their home computers. Cloud computing is very flexible.
- 4. Your confidential and secure data is hosted by someone else (possibly outside the UK): Losing data can have a catastrophic impact on your business. It's estimated that a very large percentage of companies that irretrievably lose their data go out of business within 12 months. This is an important consideration when you are going to trust another company with your vital data. On the positive side, cloud application providers are highly aware of this weakness and deal with it effectively. They back up more regularly and rigorously than you could do in your business, including making multiple copies of data and storing it in several physical locations.
