Celebration and Reflection on Family, Service and Sacrifice

The many special dates on the calendar in May brought great celebration and reflection this month. Allow me to highlight just a few.

On May 5, we marked Military Spouse Appreciation Day. The spouses of our military heroes face many unique challenges as they support their service member serving our nation, not the least of which is the hardship of managing and maintaining a career of their own as they transition from one duty station to another.



As the nation enjoys historically low unemployment of less than five percent, our military spouses do not. They face nationwide unemployment of 16 to 24 percent, depending on which survey you read, and underemployment averaging 56 percent. These stats are unacceptable and negatively impact quality of life for military and veteran families. The Mt. Carmel team is doing its part to combat this inequality.

In partnership with regional ABC affiliate KRDO and the MilHousing Network, we hosted the National MilSpouse Career Summit with live-webcast from Mt. Carmel. The effort was carried via webcast to ABC affiliate pages in 13 cities with large military and veteran communities.

The effort featured employers and resources responding to audience questions submitted over social media. Bringing awareness and viable employment options to a wide audience is one positive step we have taken. Video of the informative and inspiring event is posted to our website at veteranscenter.org

As we near Memorial Day, we will pause and take a knee to honor our brothers and sisters who made the ultimate sacrifice so we could live free and bountiful lives. Coast Guard Veteran Chris Conley



Congratulations to Coast Guard Veteran Chris Conley! Chris was recently hired by global firm Booze Allen Hamilton to assist with the new U.S. Space Command initiative. The former MH-6oJ Jayhawk and MH-65D Dolphin pilot is a graduate of the Coast Guard Academy and served as a Fellow at the Hoover Institution at Stanford University. In summer 2019, Chris transitioned from U.S. Africa Command in Germany to Colorado Springs, retiring from the service in November. "It was hard to jump-start my networking having arrived from overseas," said Chris. "I was reaching back to neighbors I knew here eight years ago." Chris and his spouse quickly connected to the best resources for transitioning veterans and military spouses - Mt. Carmel's Peer Navigators and

our partnered advanced jobseeker and career transition course, Prep Connect 360. "These services were great; the interview preparation and self-discovery was helpful, but at that point, my urgent focus was to find a job. PC360 clearly had a positive impact on my interview skills, but just knowing Mt. Carmel was here gave me confidence that a team had my back. Knowing you were there for my wife as well alleviated a lot of pressure. It allowed me to keep a positive outlook on my entire transition. I knew if plan B didn't work out, I would return to my Peer Navigator at Mt. Carmel and there would be a Plan C, D and E. I was never worried. That's what Mt. Carmel did for me," said Chris.

Military Spouse Lisa Keenan

Congratulations to Lisa Keenan! The military spouse recently began her dream job as a research assistant at the UCCS College of Business Economic Forum. Lisa credits Mt. Carmel and our partners with much of her job search success. Grateful to return to Colorado Springs following her family's military assignment in Europe, Lisa arrived with a long-term mindset. "We love this community and are so excited to be a part of it; this is home, and my goal was to find a career that allows me to give back in a way that draws on my skills." Lisa assessed available resources including Mt. Carmel's MilSpouse Career Program, life coaching services, and our partnered Prep Connect 360 Advanced Job Seeker and Transition Course. "These are high-level programs that provide



critical skills," said Lisa. "They emphasize personal strengths and interests, and how and when to re-brand yourself in a career search vs. adapting to the first job you're offered." Through a rapidly-expanding professional network, Lisa was encouraged to apply for her current role with UCCS. "Economics touches everything in our community, and as a public policy professional, this opportunity is so exciting to me," said Lisa. "I would definitely advise any military spouse to visit Mt. Carmel, to attend PC360, and really, to take advantage of all resources available. This is a tight job market, and your professional network and jobseeker skills need to be effective."

Have You Met Our Partners?

Mt. Carmel extends a warm welcome to our new Community Partners who have joined our in-house team or will be joining the team in the weeks to come:

Volunteers of America, Colorado Springs Branch: They will occupy the office space in our sister building (565) starting May 1st. Though they are not exclusive to Veterans, nor do they give them "priority", they do provide much needed housing assistance to clients who have a history of judicial involvement and are facing homelessness (i.e our Veterans Climb clients). Referrals to them must be through the Department of Corrections or through the coordinated entry system. They are VERY open to working hand in hand with Mt. Carmel and are excited to help our clients and in return, send clients to us for additional services that they are unable to provide.



Peak Vista Community Health: Peak Vista Outreach Coordinator, Ana Mendoza, and her colleagues are in our lobby every Wednesday morning from 8am-noon (at the shared partner table). They are here to screen and counsel clients who have medical insurance but are facing barriers when it comes to receiving care.

Mission Medical: They will be in our lobby the 3rd Tuesday of every month starting May 21st (at the shared partner table). Mission Medical provides FREE medical, dental and vision care to clients who meet a particular income

threshold who do NOT have insurance. They will screen clients here and provide the necessary paperwork and directions to get them to their main building for care. They will also bring hygiene items with them to distribute to our clients for free.

The WAY: They occupy the office next to Lisa and provide value based, non-urgent transportation to clients. Though they are not exclusive to Veterans, they are a Service Disabled Veteran business and they want to help our clients who are facing challenges with transportation and provide referrals to us through the many nursing and care homes in the area where there are a significant number of Veterans who need services like ours.



Veterans Optometry Partners of America (VOPA): Now performing annual eye exams and providing eyeglasses for military, veterans, families - and all other members of the community - at Mt. Carmel! Led by Keegan Meyer and his team, formerly of Abba Eyecare, the effort helps veterans access their covered, annual free VA eye exam and a free pair of glasses. They provide comprehensive annual eye examinations to veterans through their insurance (i.e. VA patients receive a voucher annually for an eye exam and can be referred to VOPA through Tri-West to be seen here). Their first clinic day will be May 27. VA patients just need to call their PCM at the VA and ask for a referral to see VOPA at Mt. Carmel for their

annual exam (then they have to wait for the Tri-West process to get their appointment, as they do with other referrals). Visit veteranscenter.org/springsdryeyeinstructions/ to start the process.

Forbush Legal: They will have office hours every Friday from Noon to 1 pm and will provide legal services (advice, not representation). Their mission is to help individuals, families and entrepreneurs protect their loved ones, preserve their wealth, save taxes, and perpetuate philanthropy.

**The following partners are on board with the Mt. Carmel team and though they don't have office hours here, they will be hosting a variety of classes:

AAFMAA: Provide financial planning, investment management and trust services.

Care and Share: They will be hosting healthy cooking classes on a budget. Their mission is to bridge the gap between hunger and abundance and to provide food, partnering opportunities, and education to fight hunger and food insecurity in Southern Colorado communities.

VA Clinical Education Services: Hosting classes on Chronic Disease Self-Management.

MLREinvestments LLC: Hosting seminars for Military and Veterans using their VA Home Loan who are in jeopardy of defaulting on their loan.




