# **DAMASCUS** Parish article

A few weeks ago, my daughter was teaching a group of students map reading skills as part of their Duke of Edinburgh award. Much to her surprise, one of the students suggested taking a short cut across some private land, saying it would be alright as long as they didn't get caught. It was the first time she had encountered this attitude, and wondered if the young people were unconsciously picking up the current confusion in our political leadership.

Why does it matter that people in power tell the truth and keep the rules they've made for everyone else? Why do some of us find it difficult to forget the scandals and move on? Is it because we recognise that something much deeper is being questioned? As a country, we have taken for granted many values that hold our society together: truth, integrity, fair play, justice, and compassion towards those in need. Could we find ourselves unable to move on because alarm bells are going off? If the people in power exempt themselves from the values that hold together the common good, they are eroding the bonds of trust placed in them and their office.

In his sermon at the Service of Thanksgiving for the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, Archbishop Stephen Cottrell said, 'The best leaders ... are those ... who lead for others not themselves. People whose hearts desire is to serve the common good.' He was, of course, praising the Queen for her dedication in serving the country and commonwealth. She has often told us that she is sustained by her Christian faith and has said, 'For me, the life of Jesus Christ ... is an inspiration and an anchor in my life.' Jesus had some challenging words about leadership for his disciples: Whoever wishes to be great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be the servant of all (Mark 10:43-44).

Let's pray for those in leadership, whether in our workplace, different levels of government and businesses as well as in our recreational activities so that we all may live quiet and peaceful lives.

# Drayton Wildlife Group

We hope everyone has enjoyed the changing flowers in our wildflower patch on Hilliat Fields as much as we have.

Thanks to everyone helped us in the winter with the hard work, removing the turf and planting seeds, and to Oh so Lucy for donating the beautiful sign 'Excuse the weeds we are feeding the bees'.

It has been a joy to watch from early spring when our first single snowdrop appeared. Since then we have seen corncockle, corn marigold, common poppy, corn chamomile, white campion, cornflower and scentless chamomile (the white, daisy like flowers).

This beautiful display was created using the Cornfield Jewels\* seed mix recommended by the conservation charity Plantlife. These are the flowers that were once commonly seen in our cornfields, as they are mainly annuals, growing on freshly disturbed soil, such as a newly ploughed field.



The bees have quickly found the new supply of nectar and have been busy buzzing from poppy to cornflower.

Don't forget, though, that truly wild flowers are incredibly valuable to insects and other wildlife, and are beautiful, too. The grass alongside the wildflower patch, which was not seeded but has, thankfully, been allowed to grow long, is full of magnificent tall rough hawksbeards, as well as daisies, buttercups, goatsbeard and cow parsnip, all valuable sources of nectar to pollinators as well as food plants to the larvae of numerous insects. Long grass, too, is essential for insects such as grasshoppers, and a food plant for butterfly larvae such as Meadow Brown, Gatekeeper, Ringlet and Speckled



Along with the annuals, a mix of perennials, including common Bird's-foot trefoil, meadow buttercup, red campion, oxeye daisy, knapweed, black medick, ribwort plantain, selfheal, yellow rattle, yarrow, common sorrel, common vetch, and red clover was sown. These should appear next year, when most of the annuals from the patch will disappear, with the more subtle but still beautiful perennials taking centre-stage. Not all will come up, only those which thrive on our soil type, which in Hilliat Fields tends to be a heavy clay. I have planted the same mixture in my own garden in Hilliat Fields, and the main successes have been red and white campions, bird's foot trefoils, red clovers, common vetch and oxeye daisy, with corncockles continuing from the annuals mix – shown here, now in their third year.



This follows the natural progression that would occur in a wildflower meadow. If we want to see the poppies and cornflowers return next year, we will need to seed a new patch with the annuals mix.

We hope this winter to expand the patch further, the more helpers we have the bigger we can make it, so do look out in the autumn for dates when we will need diggers, tea makers and seed planters.

\*The annual mix was Cornfield Jewels, the perennial mix was Meadow Maker Plus, both available from Plantlife Shop, but please be aware that these are not for planting in the wild. As the patch we planted was on a housing estate, we decide that it was OK to plant there, as it is not near any truly wild land.

# Scams—Beware

Scamming has become increasingly common in recent years. **COVID** has given Scammers many new opportunities and it seems that our ability to tackle the problem is permanently lagging behind the ingenuity/criminality of the

scammers. Most financial institutions have improved their security often seemingly at the expense of the customer's convenience and ease of use. Security phone calls and messages and an extra layer of complication to even the simplest of financial transactions. Until our systems have worked out how to trace Scammers, we are stuck with the system as it is. It is now more important than ever that we protect the vulnerable and our family and friends from Scamming and other types of sharp practice.

My recent experience has taught me that it is not only the elderly and vulnerable who can be very easily scammed. I have discovered the hard way that obtaining an "ESTA" form for foreign travel is open to such sharp practice.

The first contact details that appear on a Google search for ESTAs all appear to be bona fide government websites with all the official logos. When contacted, the applicant is invited to fill in a form (name, DOB, passport number etc) and an official ESTA will be returned in a couple of days. All for a charge of somewhere between £120-150 per ESTA. What you are not told is that they are transferring the information to an official government ESTA service form – a form that is no more complex than the one you have just completed and sent it in to the official government ESTA-issuing authority. It costs them (in my case) \$14 for this nonservice. In other words they have pocketed well done over £100 for doing something you can do for yourself.

I am still to explain to my wife why our visit to the US to greet our new grandchild has cost £280 more than intended.

# 20mph initiative

There has never been an Oxfordshire County Council initiative more popular than the installation of 20mph zones in any village or town that wants it. True, there some hoops that have to be gone through to qualify, but the process is straightforward. I am not aware of anyone who has failed. It would be a brave politician who tried to unravel or challenge the initiative now.

I have received a couple of enquiries asking exactly what is the justification for this initiative. It's a fair question, so here is my attempt to answer it. Obviously safety is the overriding justification. All Councils are trying to get people out of cars and make walking and cycling a more attractive and less risky option.

The chances of death or serious injury are drastically reduced as speeds reduce from 30-20mph. With increasing numbers of electric cars, any concerns that 20mph produces more pollution are becoming less persuasive. Enforcement is an issue, but the safety benefits increase every 1mph reduction in traffic speeds. If some drivers are determined to drive at 30mph in a 20mph zone, other people are safer than if the same driver drives at 35mph in a 30mph zone. In other words, enforcement, in my view, should never stop us introducing speed limits. Every life saved, every injury less severe is progress.

Much will be happening in the autumn with decisions on the Reservoir and major local road building. So, wishing everyone a good holiday, free of Covid and, if possible free of travel disruption.

**The Water summit** to be hosted by Oxfordshire County Council that was scheduled for June has been postponed until September. We will provide an update once the new date is confirmed.

GARD have been reviewing the **WRSE** consultation response and points to highlight at this stage include:

The Reservoir is the strategic project which had the most opposition - over 500 out of 1150 responses opposed the scheme.

Whilst WRSE appear to acknowledge our response and criticisms (GARD is mentioned 25 times compared to Ofwat's 18), they have made little attempt to address our concerns now. Many of these concerns were shared in Ofwat's view of the plan, especially on lack of detailed cost, or environmental justification, or consideration of alternatives.

WRSE state that they do not propose to provide a detailed response to the issues raised at this stage in the process but that more detailed information on the assessment of costs, benefits and potential environmental effects of the options will be made available in Autumn 2022, for the options selected in the draft regional plan, and for the alternatives. This will include a reasoned justification for the overall strategy in the draft regional plan, and for the selection of options within that strategy.

The Severn Thames Transfer was the option with the biggest support (more than one in four of responses), including much support for the transfer to be done via the Cotswold canal.

It's clear GARD and all local residents who responded to the consultation have made an impact. Thanks once again to everyone who took part.

More encouragement came from our MP, David Johnston, who spoke against the reservoir

plans (and Thames Water's appalling record on sewage) in a debate in Parliament.

Work to develop a rematching process where sponsorship arrangements break down is taking shape. Our county-wide partnership is working towards establishing a rematching team across Oxfordshire (this will not be a homelessness service) together with Asylum Welcome and this will be funded by the county council.

#### Reservoir

The official response by Water Resources South East (WRSE) to the consultation has been released. It is notable that over 500 responses they received explicitly oppose SESRO – a chunk of these were written by you, and the weight of responses appears to be telling, with their now more circumspect stance. They haven't appreciably addressed any of our points or those raised by GARD, merely claiming that they'll provide better detail in Autumn. Possibly because addressing those points is prohibitively difficult...

The alternative of pursuing the Severn-Thames Transfer, especially by using the Cotswolds Canals, is widely supported, and not just by us and by GARD. As this can be done far quicker, provides more water, is cheaper, far less disruptive, and brings in new water to a water-stressed area, we intend to press hard on this being the best and most flexible way going forwards. Indeed, rather than environmentally devastating an area and destroying natural amenity, it improves both significantly.

Probably linked to this, Thames Water have contacted me and other Councillors directly, asking for a "water workshop" to go ahead. I've agreed and am discussing the content and other members. I'll update you when it has happened.

(I don't expect much from it, but the fact that they now feel it necessary to at least make gestures in this direction is possibly significant. Again, I am certain that this is due to the overwhelming weight of public responses).

# David Johnston MP for Wantage and South Oxfordshire

I've just launched a campaign to help young people at local state schools get work experience at the great employers we have in the constituency. This was part of what I used to do when I ran charities because most work experience goes to the relatives of existing employees or clients, meaning

young people without connections struggle to get it. It's vital to get, because it gives you first understanding of the world of work, teaching you what to wear, how to interact with people, how an organisation fits together and giving you something you can put on your CV — as well as your first connections. It has almost disappeared as a result of the pandemic, so I'm leaning on the employers at Harwell and Milton Park, in particular. If your organisation can help, wherever it is, do please get in touch.

On 2 consecutive days we had debates that allowed me to raise some of the constituent issues I am most often contacted about. First, we had the Levelling Up and Regeneration Bill, which contains the Government's planning reforms. I am very pleased the Government has listened to those of who raised objections to the zonal system that was being suggested. It is also going to put more weight on local plans and not require a 5-year land supply if your local plan is up to date – welcome news for us.

The planning process will be fully digitalised, and I asked again for hybrid meetings to be permitted (as well as measures to ensure the digitally excluded can still participate). I banged the drum again for my campaign for new houses to be built to the latest environmental standard, not the one when they got planning permission, which is often several years earlier. I also stressed there is still an issue with housing targets. South and Vale have typically exceeded their targets, but we continue to have an issue with the city of Oxford demanding the highest number of houses then hardly building any of them, meaning the burden falls on the rest of the county.

And, of course, I raised lack of infrastructure, which I did again the following day in a debate about Ofwat. The Government has just set new priorities for Ofwat, and I used a debate on these to talk about the sewage releases in Oxfordshire waters, the poor water infrastructure that often accompanies new homes and the objections to the reservoir proposal. You can find both speeches on my website/Facebook pages.

I had a great 4 days of Platinum Jubilee celebrations including in Didcot, Faringdon, Wantage, Grove, West Hanney, Harwell and Wallingford. Along the way there was lots of food, plenty of games, Vikings, morris dancers, animals and an impressive array of classic cars – well done to everyone involved. God save our wonderful Queen.




