

Helen Beer is BenZion Margulies Lecturer in Yiddish in the Department of Hebrew and Jewish Studies at UCL. She has taught/lectured in Oxford, Brussels, Paris, Amsterdam, Stockholm, Cracow and Melbourne. She is Director of the 1 week intensive Yiddish summer course 'Ot Azoy' held in London each summer. Her research focuses mainly on Yiddish literature in Eastern Europe, particularly Poland.

She stages an annual Yiddish Purim Shpil at UCL and produced a full-length Yiddish play at the Bloomsbury Theatre. With Israeli jazz musicians, the Livnat Brothers, she released a CD of Itzik Manger's ballads.


