Honeybourne cyclists succeed in their mountain challenges

Two Honeybourne cyclists set themselves mountain challenges in July and succeeded in reaching their summits.

Phil Cashman (below) decided to attempt to cycle up the tough Lagos De Covadonga in Spain, the most important climb in the modern history of the "Vuelta a Espana" Grand Tour. At 1,134 m (3,720 ft) this is the climb won by Nairo Quintana (Colombia) in 2016. Phil was delighted to complete the climb successfully ahead of this year's "Vuelta".





Steve Bullen (left) challenged himself to cycle up Mont Ventoux (the Giant of Provence), one of most iconic climbs of the "Tour de France", to celebrate 50 years since the great British cyclist Tom Simpson died on the mountain. There are three routes to the summit at 1909m (6,263ft).

He succeeded at his first attempt wearing his H-BUG (Honeybourne Bicycle Users Group) jersey. Then he rode to the top again with Tom Simpson's family and friends – including Bradley Wiggins – with a celebration at the Tom Simpson memorial which had been renovated for the occasion. He then rode the third route wearing his Evesham Wheelers jersey, meeting Tom Simpson's room-mate and super domestique Colin Lewis along the way.

HONEYBOURNE PARISH COUNCIL

New Pavilion Building Contract Started

The construction contractor has started work on the new Recreation Field pavilion and are on course to complete by December. Any questions or issues with the construction works must only be reported to the Parish Council.

High Street Telephone Kiosk:

In considering the extent of the works required to fully refurbish the kiosk the council agreed the kiosk refurbishment requires a professional to carry out the works to ensure safety and compliance with the terms of the adoption from BT. A specialist company will be engaged to refurbish the kiosk which will be exchanged for a fully refurbished identical kiosk.

The current option for its use is a village information centre.

Neighbourhood Development Plan Meeting

It was agreed to invite Brodie Manning project leaders to the next Parish Council meeting to give a progress report and update on the NDP as progress appears to be slow and community involvement is not forthcoming. The next NDP meeting is scheduled for Tuesday 5th September at 7:15 at the Gate Inn when any parishioners can attend and contribute to the plans development.

Publication Amendment

It was reported in the July newsletter that the School Sports day date was not known to the council. This statement is now withdrawn as the school's correspondent confirmed the date was given to the Clerk.

Black Smoke Misrepresentation

The report in last month's newsletter of a large black smoke fire on the development site at 12 Stratford Road was a misrepresentation of facts and the comment is withdrawn.

Perrie Drive Greens

The community asset registration for the Perrie Drive greens has been withdrawn. The decision was made at a formal hearing held by WDC. The Parish Council took no part in the hearing and was only informed of the event and decision after the hearing.

Community Centre and Village Hall:

The Parish Council has agreed the wording of the land transfer agreement between the Council and Taylor Wimpey also the lease agreement for the Village Hall trustees to have a 99 year lease on the land for the Community Centre. These two agreements will allow the Village Hall's lottery bid to progress.

Loose Dogs on Field Footpaths

Dogs roaming freely on Farmland where livestock is held was reported to the Council and it was agreed to ensure adequate notices are in place on the footpath to warn the public of the need to keep dogs on a lead and under control at all times.

Vandalism Continues

The New bench on the Recreation Field has been vandalised as three slats in its back have been broken out and lost. The local PCSO will be requested to carry out extra patrols in the area

Speeding:

Parishioners have raised concerns regarding speeding on Stratford Road and the matter will be reported to Cllr Alastair Adams with a further request to move the 30mph zone to the Pebworth side of the two bridges as the County Council officers confirmed it was not possible as the area does not fulfil the criteria to extend the speed limit.

The Parish Council meets on the 2nd Tuesday of each month. Members of the public are welcome to attend meetings, which are held in the Village Hall and commence at 7.15 pm. Residents are welcome to speak on any issue of local concern during the Open Forum before the start of the meeting.





Letter from the Vicar

Dear Friends

"Take heart, it is I. Do not be afraid."

The world, beautiful though it is, especially the area where we live, can sometimes seem a bewildering, even frightening, place. As I write, the situation on the Korean Peninsular is a particular concern. An already tense situation, that has been worsening for some months, is now being exacerbated by unhelpful rhetoric and sabre-rattling – on both sides.

So, what are we to make of this and other similar situations? As Lance Corporal Jones in Dad's Army would undoubtedly say, "Don't panic, Captain Mainwaring!" The Bible tells us that, in the present age, frightening things will sometimes go on around us — in the world and in our own lives. The writer of Psalm 46 said, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble; therefore we will not fear, though the earth be moved and though the mountains tremble in the heart of the sea." With God, no situation is ever hopeless. And so, however falteringly, we trust God, who is our refuge and strength in and through the storms of life.

The words that I began my article with were spoken by Jesus to his disciples when they were "terrified" by a storm going on around them when they were in a boat. They are as true today as they were then and speak through the ages. When we are terrified, either by the world around us or by things happening in our own lives, Jesus promises to walk through it with us and speaks to us the same words of reassurance: "Take heart, it is I. Do not be afraid."

I would like to thank those who responded to my request for information about Honeybourne. It is surprising how such a small village hides many historical facts and figures and the people who contributed to make it such an interesting place.

The idea is to obtain as much information as possible from past fetes, carnivals, shows etc; people who served on the council, village hall committee and school governors. All this information will be written into a large album and some others will be put into a time capsule that will be part of the new village hall foundation.

All the material I have so far (and there is plenty) is being sorted at the start of September. If you have any further information, whatever the form, please let me include it. Any bits and pieces will be copied and returned within 24 hours if required.

So, dig deep for any old photographs, school information and sporting achievements, as they will all be included in the final album. Many thanks in advance.

Sturdy shoes or boots are recommended.
This route is clearly signed (signposts and waymarkers)
Pets should be kept on leads at all times. Drinks and snacks are recommended.

Start at the The Gate Inn and cross the Weston Road (TAKE GREAT CARE) and walk up High Street to the Thatched Tavern; then take the road alongside the Thatched Tavern into China Corner, walking straight-on until you pass through the narrow gap between the houses. This leads up to the Fair Acres estate. Turn right and follow the headland until you come to a waymarker post deep in the brambles, and adjacent to the pool (site of the Honeybourne murder in 1809). You can choose the path to the old chicken sheds in the distance at Weston Road, or continue on to the bridge and then turn left along the headland to the Weston Road.

TAKE GREAT CARE when crossing this road. This is a very fast road, and visibility is not very good. Follow the grass verge to your right where, after 100 metres, you will join a footpath towards Weston Fields Farm. After 20 metres fork right to the stile opposite the farmhouse. Follow the path with the brook on your right, crossing two more stiles before coming to a gate that leads into the garden of Long Stretch Farm. Through this beautiful woodland garden before crossing over the brook bridge to follow the path with the brook now on your left side. Over another stile, continuing to follow the brook until you meet a stile leading onto the dismantled railway (to the right of the brick culvert). Cross over the railway and through the gate into Gloucestershire.

Continue straight-ahead to the next gate where you will turn right and climb over the fence next to the field gate; then immediately left to walk alongside the electric fence surrounding the new woodland planting. Over a stile just past the dilapidated wartime airfield buildings; follow the field edge with the stream on your left. Over another stile and ahead again until you reach the bridge on your left. The industrial estate you see to your right was part of RAF Honeybourne. It has been said that these buildings were used in the filming of some scenes from the BBC TV series "Tenko". Cross over the stream and then straight-across the young tree plantation until you reach the next stile. With your back to the stile take a 2.30 o'clock direction to the next stile. Over the stile and follow the track to your right until you meet the main road in Weston-sub-edge. TAKE GREAT CARE to cross this road and continue ahead along Church Street until you reach Parsons Lane on your right, taking time as you pass under the large cedar tree to turn back to look at the barn with two white doors, noticing the fire-plate at the apex of the roof (erected by an insurance company - "Which Mark is to be number'd with the Number of the Subscribers Policy, and there to remain so long as the Subscribers continue to pay their Quarteridges") above a stone dated 1857.

Walk down Parsons Lane past the old almshouses (Meon Cottage) until you reach the green footpath sign on your left. Along this footpath passing the 19th century water point. Turn left to follow the footpath between the gardens and out into the field. Continue to follow this path until you reach the bridge over the stream. Pass through the kissing gate onto the site of the moated manor. This manor was already owned by the Giffard family in 1279, when Walter Gifford (Archbishop of York) died, and it passed to his brother, Godfrey, Bishop of Worcester. Follow the path straight-ahead with the first telegraph pole and the moat on your left.

Walk towards the far right-hand corner of this field until you reach the last telegraph pole. Turn left along the edge of the header pond. The medieval ponds are now clearly visible. Continue walking around the pond edge in the direction of the church. If you take a short detour on your left to the high ground you will have an excellent over-view of the site. It is interesting to note that

when we experience flood conditions, this moat and the ponds are completely full of water.

When you reach the cemetery, pass through the kissing gate and on to the church door. Follow the path to the right until you reach the main gated entrance. Turn left into Church Street and walk down to Parsons Lane. Now you can retrace your steps back to Honeybourne, perhaps stopping at the Seagrave Arms for refreshment.



News from your District Councillor & County Councillor Alastair Adams, September 2017

Dear Residents, I hope you had a great summer although the weather in August seems to have been a bit wet! If you have school children, they are either back at school already, or will be very soon. And there is some good news about schools to start this month's report.

School funding in Worcestershire going up!

The Education Secretary announced £2.6 billion in extra school funding over the next two years, including a commitment to raise the per pupil funding of all secondary schools in the UK to £4,800 per year. Schools in Worcestershire have average per pupil funding of £4,319 so this announcement will have a huge and welcome impact in the county.

Improvement funding announced for Worcestershire Hospitals

An extra £29million has been announced for Worcestershire NHS Acute Hospital trust. At the Alexandra in Redditch, the funding is set to improve the operating theatres so that the hospital can be developed into a centre of excellence for planned surgery, as well as provide a new children's outpatient department, women's centre and improved endoscopy facilities. At the Worcestershire Royal, the funding will provide 81 new general and acute beds and increase car parking capacity by 140 spaces.

Riverside Shopping Centre

Contracts have been exchanged for a local property company to purchase the struggling Riverside Shopping Centre ahead of exploring what can be done to bring the town centre asset back to life.

Highways

- 1. Stratford Road patching, re-surfacing and new kerbs are completed. Including new tarmac under the Honeybourne railway bridges. A great improvement.
- 2. Mickleton Rd, Honeybourne should also be patched and repaired by the time you read this.
- 3. The broken concrete posts renewed on the raised pavement at the entrance to the High Street, and some metal bars replaced.
- 4. SLOW signs to be painted on the road in both directions as you enter the railway bridges on Stratford Rd
- 5. £6m pavement fund the WCC is finalising which pavements in the area will be resurfaced. Stratford Road has been flagged as one that needs doing. A reminder has been sent to all Parishes to use their lengthsman to keep weeds and grass off pavements.

As always, if you have any issues on any Highways matters, please report it on the WCC website http://www.worcestershire.gov.uk/homepage/98/report_it Also remember a photo of the Highways problem is as good as "a thousand words" so always take a photo where possible.

Mobile Speed cameras in Station Rd/Buckle Street

Safer Road Partnerships have agreed to put a mobile speed camera on Station Rd – so watch out and drive at the speed limit or you may get a speeding ticket!




