### Drayton Wives (Lisa Lammiman)

This month's meeting was called <u>Axtell to Zacharias</u> - by local historian <u>Liz Woolley</u>.

They were famous **builders and entrepreneurs**, who in the 1880s started to shape Oxford's layout along with about seventy other builders. Fortunes were made, regulations ignored, political careers made and grand designs built!!

They developed the suburbs in 1850 within the medieval walls of Oxford and the landowners were mostly churches, colleges and the aristocracy. Thomas Axtell was a craftsman builder along with Thomas Henry Kingerlee and John Money, names of which can still be found in Oxford, for example Kingerlee builders.

Other names of middle class builders were John Salter the boatbuilder, and clothing manufacturer Joel Zacharias.

Many of you will be familiar with the Randolph Hotel from the series Morse but it was built by architect William Wilkinson in 1866 who actually lived at the top of the hotel and who has a blue plaque on the hotel.

Another current name in Oxford is Benfield and Loxley who met and became great friends. They built their own brickworks at Sandford in 1900. As the war came the engines from the brickworks were taken into service and the site closed.

In 1881 Thomas Kingerlee - a master builder - moved to Oxford and became the biggest landlord and housebuilder but as a forward thinker he owned a slate works and his supply shops. But he was concerned for his staff and built a YMCA in George Street in 1889. The company is now run by David Kingerlee.

This is just a short precis of how the historic names of Oxford builders are still with us today. Oxford is always interesting to walk around, especially when you go down the side streets and look for the blue plaques or even delve into the street names!!



### Drayton W.I.

This month, although we were few in numbers for various reasons, we had a <u>wonderful speaker</u>. He admitted to be a metal detectorist and has been for a very long time.

His name is <u>James Mather</u>, and he was responsible for finding the <u>Watlington hoard</u>. It is most detectorist's dream to find a hoard!!

After the discovery of the first amount of coins he consulted with the land owner and they contacted the relevant body for this type of find. The problem was they couldn't come for several days. What to do now?

The hoard was re-buried and marked with stones, thereby was a problem, animals and birds had been looking in disturbed ground for snacks. He returned just before the official diggers arrived only to find his marker scattered. Luckily it was found and retrieved. Taken away to be dissected from the soil compacted around it.

The most wonderful hoard of mostly silver was purchased, and is now in the **Ashmolean museum** next to the Alfred jewel. He did explain the code of detectorists, who can't just go anywhere, without permission.

There are sadly a group of people who invade land under cover of darkness, without permission, to scavenge for whatever they can find.

### Latest Meeting

This isn't a full, official report of proceedings, but a précis from someone who attended. There are still it seems TWO vacancies for Parish Councillors, so a chance to 'step-up' for a public-spirited volunteer to put themselves forward? Apply to the Clerk for more info.

A couple of significant items were mentioned by Vale Councillor Andy Cooke, his column on page 11 has more info, but they detailed both more prevarication by Thames Water, and the interesting new development that their Board could soon be threatened with jail time for further transgressions on their existing loooooong list of pollution crimes.

The other news related to the ongoing, and also very longrunning saga, of the Walnut Meadow development, and the intended Sports Facilities, the latter being thwarted by protracted delays and inactivity by Miller Homes. However, the discovery of a **Barrow** there (prehistoric, not wheel) has apparently afforded a chance to get some long-overdue enforcement against them, with proper corrections to the mass of rubble that their then contractor had buried where the pitch drainage should have been. We can but hope . . .



#### TRADING STANDARDS MESSAGE

Residents are being warned to be cautious of cold callers **impersonating Local Authority** / **Council officers** in the Oxfordshire area. All council officers should have an ID badge available and be more than happy to show it when asked. If concerned, you can contact the council to verify the name of the council officer.

Residents should also be aware of **cold callers picking up scrap metal from properties**. All scrap metal collectors must have a scrap metal licence for the local district they are collecting in. Scrap metal collectors must also have a Waste Carrier's Licence (issued by the Environment Agency). Both of these licences can easily be produced when requested, so if there's any queries, do not engage with the collector.

#### LITTER BUG TRAIL

From Saturday 6th August to Sunday 4th September South Oxfordshire and VoWH district councils are running FREE Litter Bug Detectives Trails for children in 14 sites across the districts.

The children who take part have a chance to win £20 vouchers for themselves and a rainbow-coloured bench (made from recycled plastic) for their school.

### Census 2021 – First Results

The first results of the 2021 Census have just been released. The England and Wales population increased from 56.1M in 2011 to 59.6M in 2021, a rise of 6.3%. In our area the Vale population has increased from 120,988 (2011) to 138,900, a rise of 14.8%. South Oxfordshire grew by 11.1%, Oxfordshire as a whole by 10.9%.

Household density, which has been falling consistently from the very first Census, declined slightly in the Vale from 2.45 persons per household in 2011 to 2.42 in 2021.

#### Help for Cost of Living Crisis

The District Council has opened a **voucher scheme to support households who can't afford to pay for life's essentials.** It's part of the Govt's Household Support Fund (HSF) and a portion of the funds allocated to Oxon County Council have been passed on to the District Council as part of the county-wide support package, which

includes help for children eligible for free school meals through the holidays. Funding is limited and the scheme is open initially to people who have not had support from it before. However, the councils will open it to second applications if funds remain.

The funds are not restricted to people in receipt of benefits and there is no requirement that residents must be employed, or must be unemployed. In contrast to previous schemes, a portion of the funds will be allocated specifically to support pensioner households.

#### → Walnut Meadows (yet again!)

The saga of the fallout from the developers burying tonnes of rubble in the sports field areas and raising the land levels has continued.

The **County Archaeologist** has completed an investigation and has concluded that the 'Barrow' site there was damaged by their recklessness. His initial reaction was to ban any further construction in the northern third of the site of the sports fields – which would have prohibited construction of the MUGA and hugely limited sports field development. This would have made the sports pavilion fairly pointless.

After we got back to him and discussed options, he's going to allow the MUGA to be built in its intended location, and the sports field drainage may go ahead - IF they follow careful processes and do not further damage the site.

An **Agronomist report** has also come in, stating that until much of the rubble is removed, **drainage cannot be put in**. This is <u>completely damning to the developer</u>. They now have to put this right, in my opinion. I know that the Enforcement Team are working flat out to bring a resolution (I've got a lot of time for them after having worked with them on this and found out where are the limits of their authority and powers), and this should give them considerable ammunition to get this sorted, even with the limited powers at Councils' disposal on enforcement. 

# Vale News Round-up

### Reservoir

Unfortunately, Thames Water haven't agreed a date for the promised meeting with me and others. I have spoken to others who have had a meeting with them, and I'm not that optimistic - it was described as a "woe is Thames Water, so misunderstood," meeting, and no answers were forthcoming to questions such as "Why is the Severn Thames Transfer project last on the timeline?"

I'll ensure that I've messaged them first about that so there's no excuse for not having a decent answer. I have noticed the recent Environmental Agency report on sewage and water quality, which is damning for a number of water companies, Thames Water amongst them.

"Four companies (Anglian, Thames, Wessex, Yorkshire Water) were rated only 2 stars, which means they require significant improvement. Two (Southern and South West Water) fell to 1 star, the bottom of our star ratings, meaning their performance was terrible across the board."

"The sector's performance on pollution was shocking, much worse than previous years."

"Repeat offenders can now expect criminal prosecutions for less serious environmental incidents where once the Environment Agency would have used civil powers. We would like to see prison sentences for Chief Executives and Board members whose companies are responsible for the most serious incidents. We would also like to see company directors being struck off so they cannot simply delete illegal environmental damage from their CV and move on to their next role."

It is highly unusual for the foreword to a government report to call for people to be jailed. So, Thames Water MUST understand that this sort of thing does not exactly improve our confidence in their getting this done environmentally, safely, and efficiently.

# WESTMINSTER VIEW

Our MP (Wantage/Didcot) is David Johnston (OBE, awarded for services to Social Mobility and Education).

As some of you will know, I <u>resigned</u> from my role as PPS to the Dept for Education earlier this month. Education is a great passion of mine and I did not

take the decision lightly, but <u>I could not defend</u> what was taking place at No 10 this month or indeed these past few months.

When I decided to move from being a charity chief executive to becoming an MP in 2019, most of my family and friends thought I was mad. They are interested in politics and know how much it matters, but they wouldn't touch it with a bargepole due to the hours, the abuse and the low regard in which many in the public – wrongly in my view – hold politicians.

**Politicians should uphold the highest standards** and act in a way that is best for the country. We should also consider the politicians who will come after us. It is very important to me that we do all we can to encourage good people into politics so that the country is well served, but events in recent months have made the view of politics and politicians worse and will only put more people off entering it, which I deeply regret. I know some disagree with my decision, but I didn't believe the Prime Minister could provide the leadership the country currently needs and <u>I think it was the right decision for him to resign</u>.

Such is the funny way things pan out, just before I handed in my resignation, I had a PMQ to deliver. I had arranged to host some of the Ukrainian refugees being hosted in North Moreton at Parliament the previous week and secured them PMQ tickets to sit in the gallery. I had written to the Speaker asking if I could be called on to ask a PMQ that week. I then got word the PM would be abroad for the week I had arranged, so we moved it to the following week. It had been weeks in the planning and now, suddenly, it was one of the most dramatic days for PMQs. I decided to go ahead after I checked with the North Moreton hosts that they were happy with me doing so, which they were and the refugees they're hosting were delighted to be referred to. I got a small handful of furious emails from regular correspondents wanting to know why I hadn't used my PMQ to call on the PM to resign, little realising I had already decided I was going to straight after I had delivered it.

This year's climate summit was another successful one and I was very pleased to receive input from a range of local and national experts, alongside Alok Sharma and - a particular highlight – children and young people from local primary and secondary schools. The Tornados would soon be #1, (their iconic instrumental 'Telstar'), with just behind them Shirley Bassey (What Now My Love - another big voice!) and another iconic hit, Little Eva (one of the all-time great sing-alongs, The Loco-Motion). Also making the top-5 then were Carole King (It Might as well Rain until September - yes, she's THAT old!), Marty Robbins (Devil Woman), and another of the all-time great voices, Nat King Cole (Ramblin' Rose). Carole King (with songwriter hubby Gerry Goffin) had written The Locomotion, intended for someone else, but Little Eva (their babysitter) had that gigantic hit with it!

I don't usually look back further, but I discovered that around this time in **1952**, a chap at the NME was having the bright idea of actually compiling a Chart, so, the birth of the top-10 (as it was). And originally based on a phone poll of around 20 shops – just 20!!

### **Other Local News**


<u>Drayton Art Group</u> continues to meet on Tuesday afternoons at the Caudwell Day Centre.

### Climate change: 'Sand battery' could solve green energy's big problem

Because of climate change and now thanks to the rapidly rising price of fossil fuels, there's a surge of investment in new renewable energy production.

But while new solar panels and wind turbines can be quickly added to national grids, these extra sources also present huge challenges, the present lithium batteries are large, and very expensive. How do you keep the lights on when the sun doesn't shine and the wind doesn't blow?

Finnish researchers have installed the world's first fully working "sand battery" which can store green power for months at a time. The developers say this could solve the problem of year-round supply, a major issue for green energy. Using low-grade sand, the device is charged up with heat made from cheap electricity from solar or wind.

The sand stores the heat at around 500C, which can then warm homes in winter when energy is more expensive.

Will this apparently simple idea translate to the UK? With our politicians, answers on a postcard!
