

The program advances both professional skills and Jewish knowledge through core courses and individualized learning, including a year-long professional mentorship and a final project geared to a student's own area of interest.

Learning Outcomes | Students in the MAJPS program learn to:

- Understand the key themes in Jewish communal life today
- Possess a grounding in classical Jewish thinking and texts
- Understand the best practices in nonprofit management that most affect Jewish communal work
- Develop skills for critical self-reflection and career planning, aided by work with an individual mentor
- Integrate theory and practice in the professional environment
- Learn to work constructively with diverse groups of constituents and colleagues

Course Requirements | 45 quarter-hour credits

Course credit is granted in quarter hours (as opposed to semester hours).

- Core Curriculum (8 courses, 3 credits each)
- Concentration Area (4 courses one of two tracks, 3 credits each)
- Individualized Mentoring and Capstone Project (9 credits)
