We are 5 miles from the city centre, 1 mile from Jcn5 of the M6.

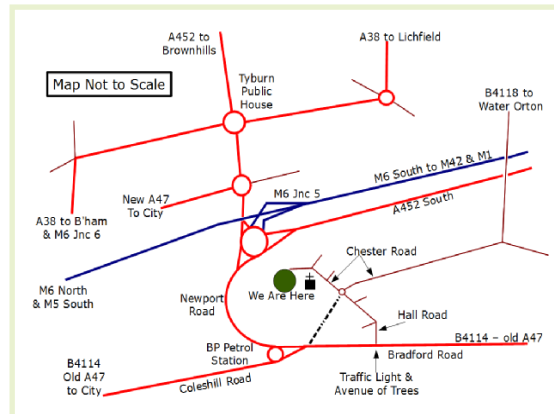
We are less than half an hour from Tamworth, Lichfield, Coventry, and most parts of Birmingham.

The Gardens are..

over 10 acres of formal walled gardens, wild areas, orchards and working buildings. The style dates from 17th century; King William and Mary and was developed further in Victorian times.

As well as a variety of visually stunning working garden areas and buildings, there is a holly maze to explore, a bird hide, mud kitchen, ponds and wildflower meadows.

Our enclosed site makes it an ideal place for school groups of all ages, allowing access to outdoor activities in a safe environment.

Our modular schools programme

- Single day sessions
- Multi –visit programmes
- Mix and match themes

All modules are curriculum linked to history and science as well as wider themes such as Wild and Wonderful or Explorers.

Workshops are held mainly out of doors, which allows us to show seasonal change.

Teachers are advised that pupils should come with suitable outdoor clothing and footwear .

Day workshops

History - mix and match

- ◆ **Who lived in a House (and Garden) like this?**
- ◆ **The Romans:** What they did for us, Gods and Latin in the Garden.
- ◆ **Tudors:** life, clothing and medicine – make a real herb poultice bag
- ◆ **The Stuarts:** masked balls, dancing and mask making
- ◆ **Victorians:** children at school, work and play at Castle Bromwich Hall in 1881
- ◆ **Dig for Victory:** growing your food
- ◆ **Plant Hunters:** be an explorer in the 17th & 18th Century.

Science - mix and match

- **Nature hunt**
- **Pond dipping**
- **Life cycles:** naming parts of flowers and plants, seed dispersal
- **Growing plants;** including sowing a pot to take away
- **Sensory exploration –taste garden produce (as available).**
- **Apple studies (late autumn)**
- **Making a leaf crown (or similar according to season)**



4 Seasons

A series of 4 visits to study the garden investigating how plants and animals adapt to changing seasons.

Some schools find pupils benefit from multiple visits where they can gradually

- Build a better understanding of the natural world .
- Become 'at home' with being outdoors

Schools wanting to create a programme of visits across the whole year can book a 7 visit programme See over for sample.

Drawing, painting and creative writing.

The gardens make an ideal setting and stimulus for creative writing, drawing and painting for any age group.

Schools and other groups can book self – directed visits.
