STRATHMARTINE COMMUNITY REGENERATION FORUM



The Strathmartine Regeneration Forum is made up of 15 local residents who are elected on a 3 year term to represent the Strathmartine Community

The main purpose of the Forum is to allocate the Dundee Partnership Fund. The 2017/18 allocation for Strathmartine was £140,250 split among Youth Diversionary, Small Grants and Physical and Environmental Improvements.

The group meets on the first Thursday of every month in the Ardler Complex at 6.30pm There is currently a vacancy on the Forum for a rep from the Ardler area. UNIVERSAL CREDIT

Despite political lobbying, the Westminster Government is determined to roll out Universal Credit, which is now underway across Dundee.

I am sure that as people change from Legacy Benefit to the new Universal Credit they could find themselves experiencing some financial hardship given the 6 weeks of waiting days and assessment period before benefits are adjusted.

I am very pleased that the Council's Library Staff here in Ardler will be able to support such as giving guidance on making the initial claim electronically.

Staff will also be able to signpost people to other Agencies working with the Council in particular those who administer crisis loans.
